





GEC TO BUILD NEW SUB-STATION: Greenbelt Electric Cooperative along with Golden Spread Electric Cooperative is building a new substation that will be located north and east of Wheeler near Kelton. Due to the increased load capacity and to better serve our members in the Wheeler and Kelton area, this was a must. GEC purchased one acre from the Huff Ranch Partnership owned by Clint Huff. The location of the new substation called Kelton will be 9 miles East of Wheeler and 4 miles North on FM 592. GEC's construction crews will be building 18 miles of new 69,000 volt transmission line from the Wheeler substation. "We are awaiting approval from the utility commission and estimate completion January or February of 2007," stated Rick Bond, GEC Operations Manager.
