Earl Nebraska Tabor - Born January 4, 1922, Died July 26, 2006

Earl Nebraska Tabor was born to Samuel and Nellie Tabor on January 4, 1922 in Laverne Oklahoma. He was the 4th of their 7 children. Harper County was his home the first 46 years of his life.

During World War II he served in the U.S. Army Air Force and received the American Theatre Ribbon and the World War II Victory Medal.

In 1959 Earl married Mabel Adilin Shiflett and they made their home at the Tabor farm in Buffalo, Oklahoma. Earl and Mabel had four children, Johnie, Cindy, Janita and Samuel. Earl's passions were horse racing, his children and his grandchildren and their sporting events.

As a young man he traveled across the US and into Mexico with his horses, appearing many times in the winners circle from Omaha, Nebraska to Juarez Mexico.

In more recent years he traveled to Oklahoma, Texas and California to attend a variety of his grandchildren's sporting events.

Many have heard his wife Mabel say, "Earl is always late, except for a horse race or a ball game." He dearly loved his grandkids and they all knew it.

Over the years Earl and his family lived in Oklahoma, New Mexico and Texas; moving to Mobeetie TX in the early 1980s. He was a horse trainer/owner, farmer, husband, father and grandfather. He was a member of the American Legion and attended the Church of Christ.

Reba was a member of the First Baptist Church in Wheeler. She was preceded in death by her parents, and 4 brothers.

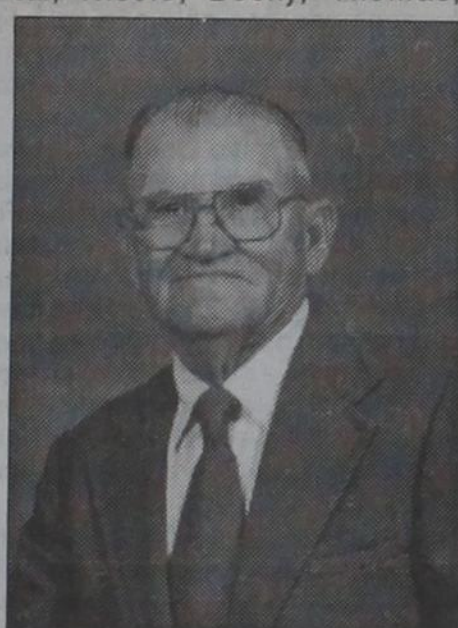
Survivors are 2 nephews: Dale Wofford, Frisco, TX; Nathan Wofford, Waco, TX.

Pre-K, Kindergarten Registration Packets

Wheeler ISD Pre-K & Kindergarten Registration Packets

Any child who will be 5 years old on or before Sept 1, of this year is eligible to attend Kindergarten. Any child who will be 4 years old on or before Sept. 1 of this year may attend Pre-kindergarten at Wheeler ISD

The State of Texas requires these things for a child to be registered in Public School: 1. Copy of child's official state birth certificate; 2. Copy of child's immunization record. Wheeler ISD requires a copy of the child's Social Security card for record keeping purposes.

Registration packets for children who will be attending the Wheeler ISD Pre-K or Kindergarten during this school year are available and may be picked up in the hall outside the superintendent's office on business days.

This packet contains information necessary for enrollment and all the required forms The esti-

mated length of time needed to finish the forms is from 15 to 30 minutes. Some of the information required (For Example . . . The date of the last dental exam or the phone number of your preferred hospital) is generally kept with other personal records at home or may even require a call to your family doctor.

Because of these factors, coupled with the usual, unavoidable registration "traffic jam" of waiting in line to complete the enrollment process, school personnel believe some parents might prefer the option of completing these documents in the quiet and privacy of their own homes. Parents who prefer to wait until registration day are welcome to get the packet then and fill it out in the cafeteria.

Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten registration will be in the Wheeler School Cafeteria on Wednesday, August 9, from 9:00 A.M. until 11:00 A.M.

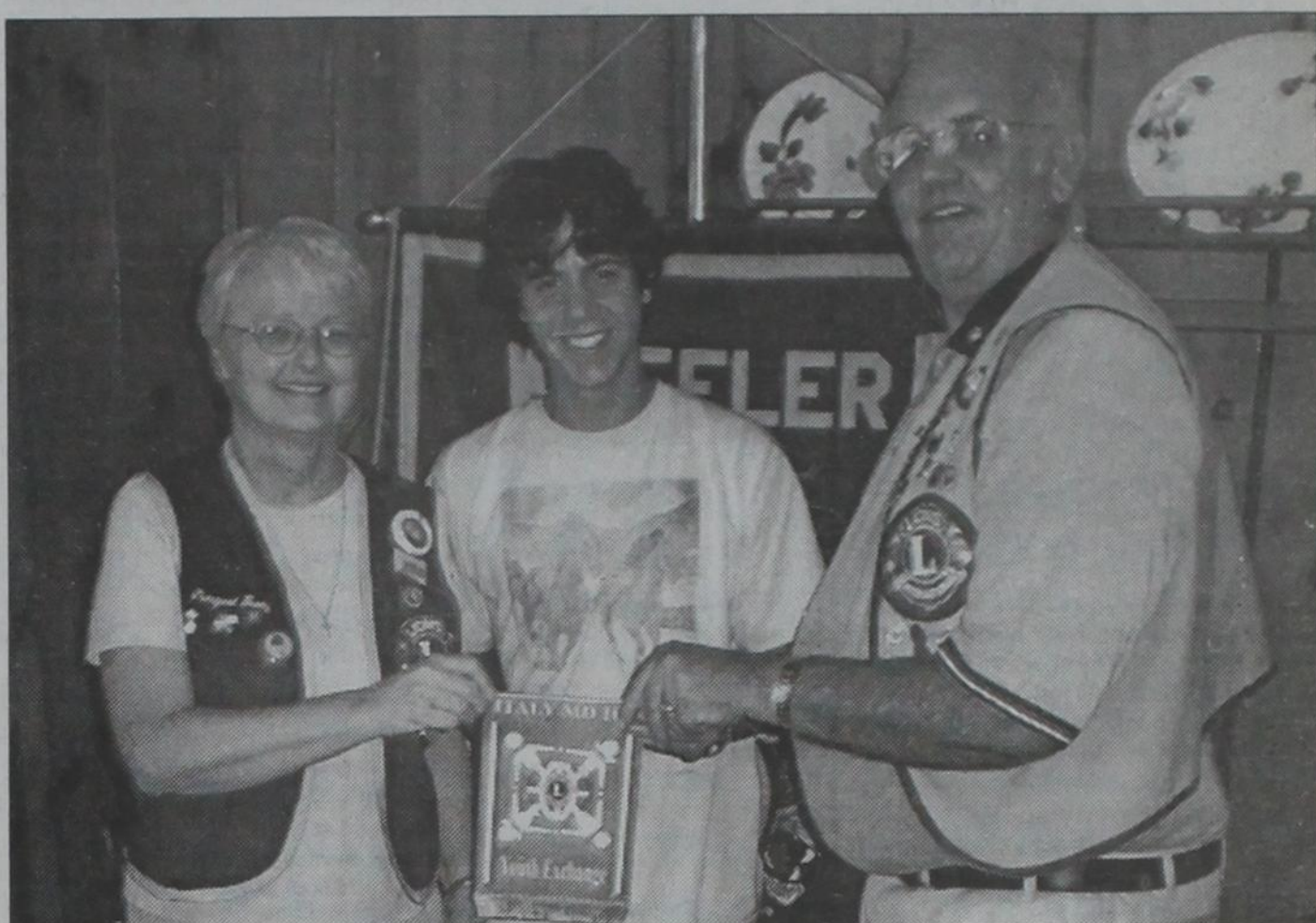

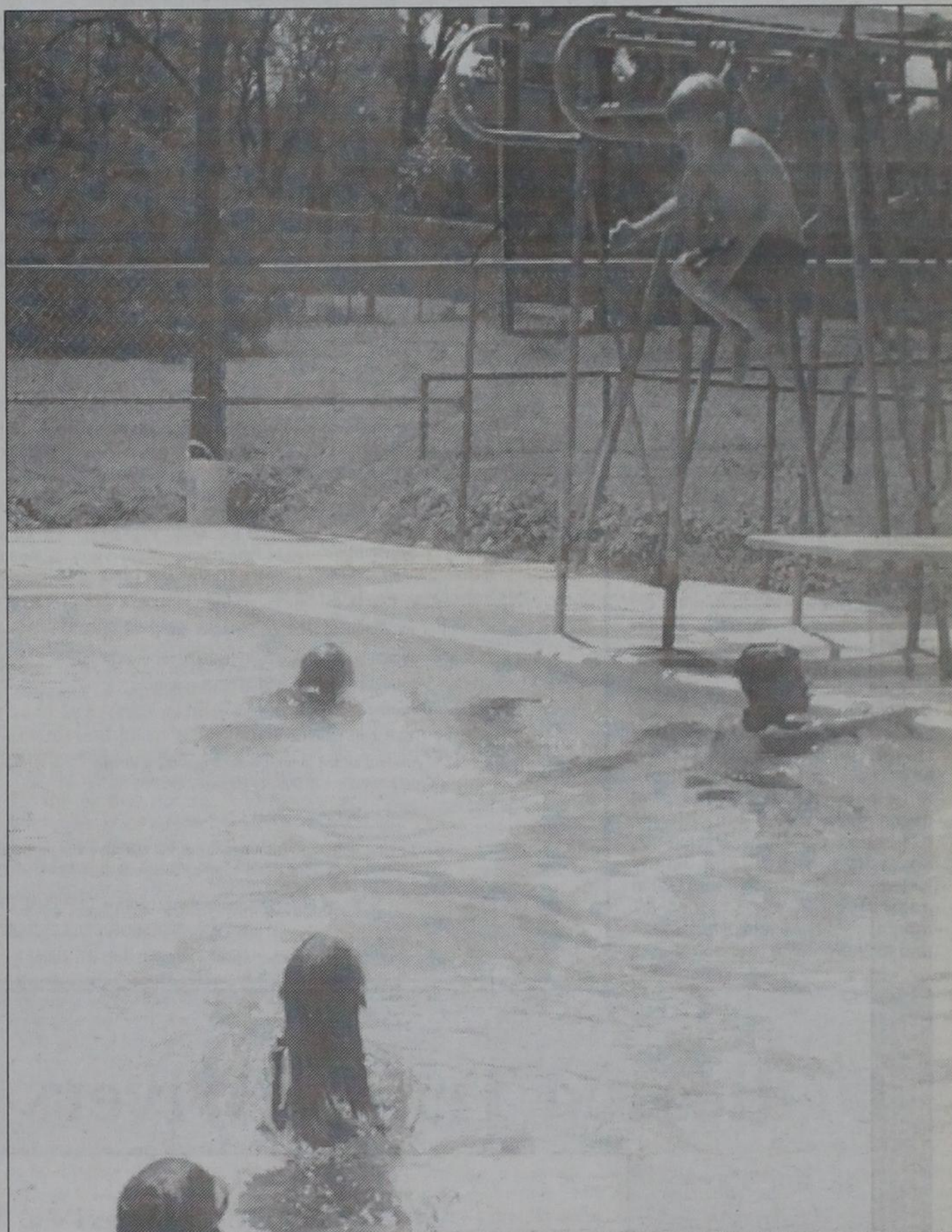

2006 Property Tax Rates in PARKVIEW HOSPITAL DST. # 1

This notice concerns 2006 property tax rates for PARKVIEW HOSPITAL DST. # 1. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Last year's tax rate:	
Last year's operating taxes	\$ 1,055,266
Last year's debt taxes	\$ 0

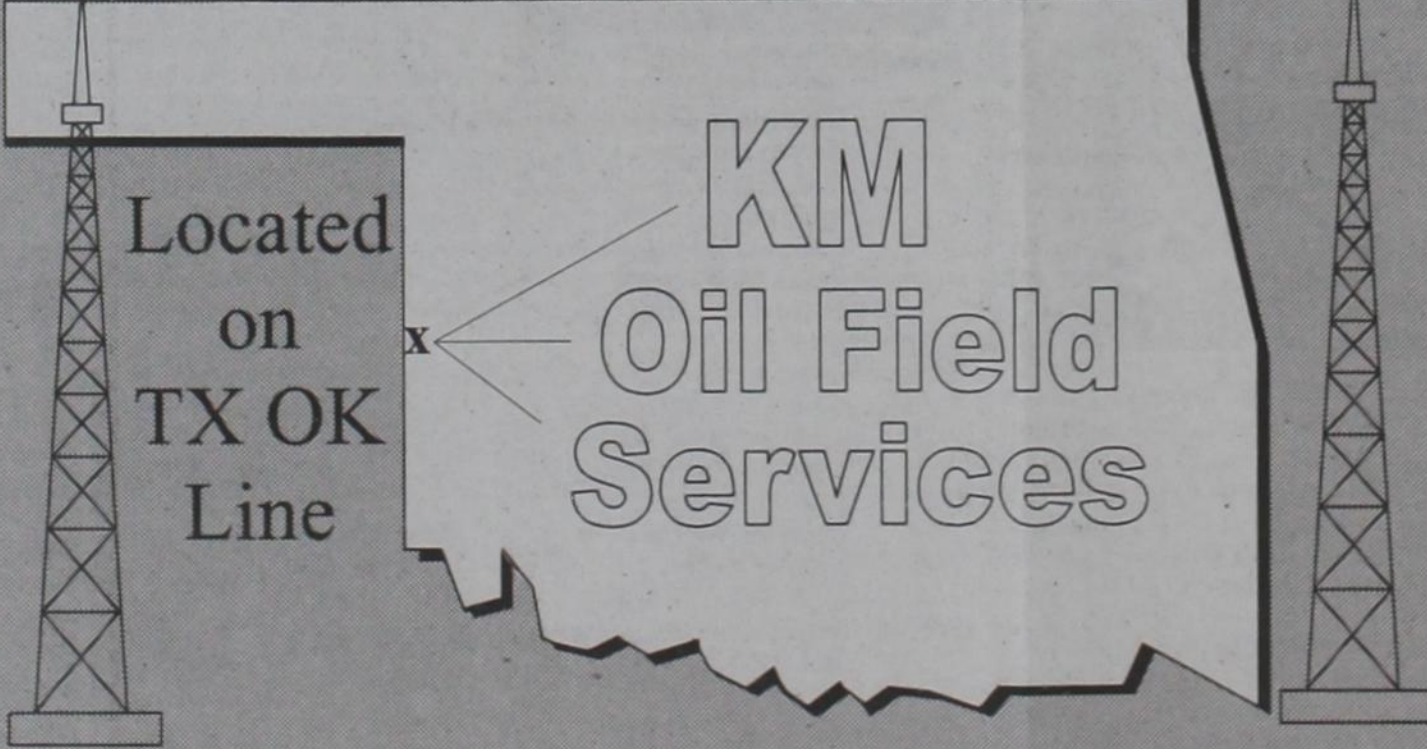

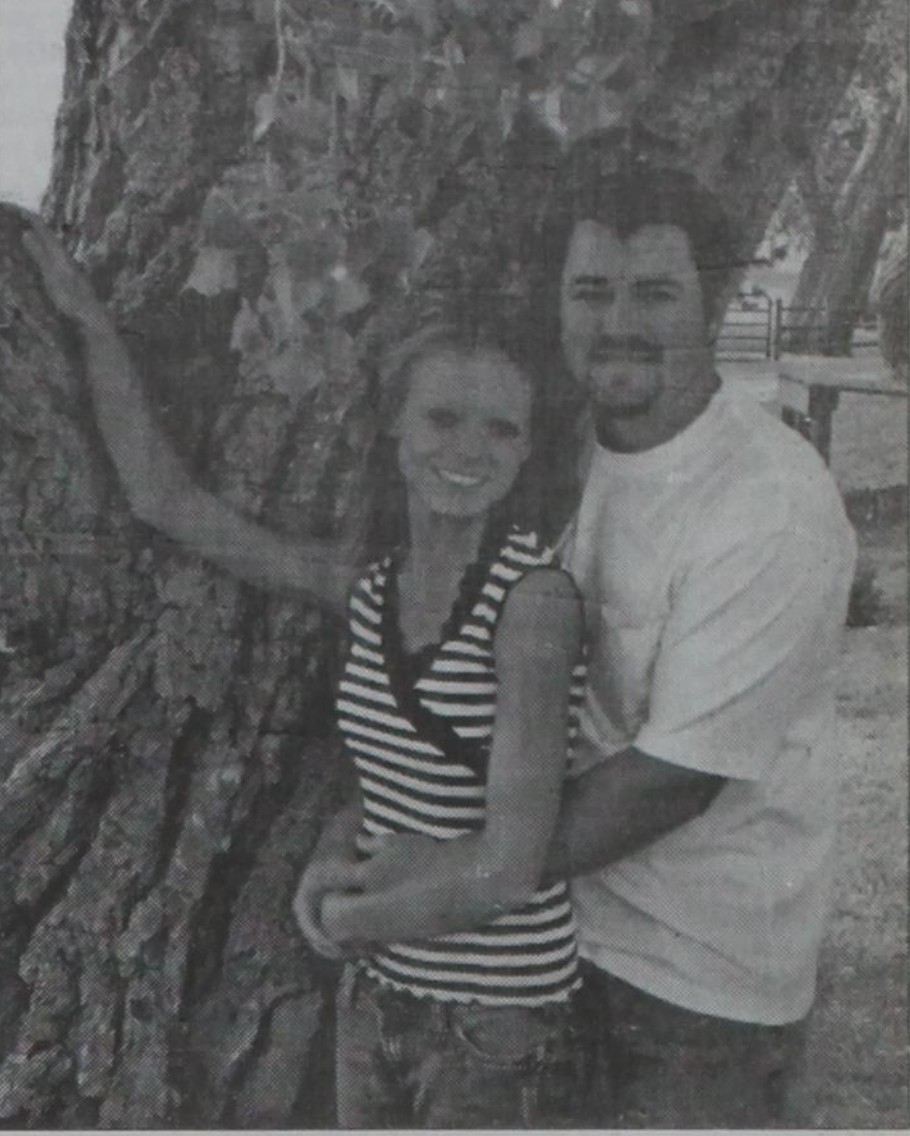

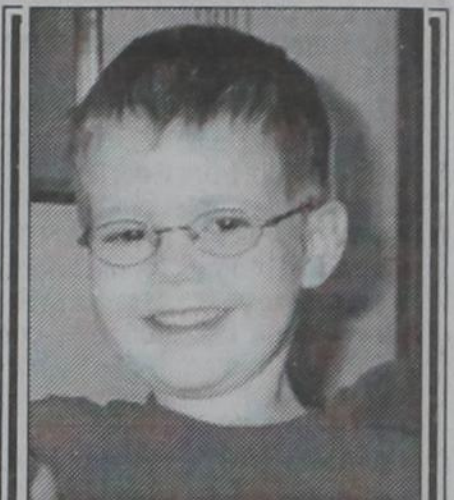

3-Year-Old Girl Is Abducted July 31

The Texas Department of Public Safety has issued an Amber Alert for a 3-year-old girl abducted from Pasadena on July 31 at approximately 9:00 p.m.

Danielle is a Hispanic 3-year-old girl with brown hair and brown eyes. She is 2 feet tall and weighs 40 pounds.

Danielle is believed to have been abducted by her father, Leandro Jimenez. At approximately 8:30 p.m. on Monday, the suspect, Leandro Jimenez, is alleged to have stabbed his estranged wife. The assault occurred in the 16100 Block of Bear Bayou in Channelview. The suspect's estranged wife, Sonia Jimenez, was pronounced dead at Hermann Hospital. Following the stabbing, the suspect went to his estranged wife's home and took their 3-year-old daughter, Danielle Jimenez.

Leandro Jimenez is 38 years-old, 5 feet 8 inches tall and weighs 200 pounds. He is a white male with brown eyes and black hair and was last seen wearing a yellow pullover with blue jeans.

The suspect is believed to be driving a 2004 Chevrolet 1500 Silverado pickup truck, silver in color, bearing Texas license plate 9NG H92. The pickup truck is reported to be an extended cab, step-side, with chrome wheels.
