
Students named to the President's List must have a grade point average (GPA) of 4.00 and carry a minimum class load of 12 undergraduate hours.



The groups presented plans for a community building, which they are proposing to be constructed on the west side of the present Wheeler County Show Barn at the

north edge of Wheeler. The proposed building would house a meeting room with stage, kitchen, small meeting room, which would also double as a storm shelter, two offices for the county agents and secretary with a small conference room, and space for the Wheeler Public Library, 2800 sq. ft. larger than our present library. Both levels of the building will open to the parking lot,

accessability to both floors of the marked spaces for a total of 137






