Raymond Moore, 90, died Friday, April 7, 2006, in Amarillo, Texas.

Services were Sunday, April 9, 2006, at the First United Methodist Church, Shamrock, Texas, with Rev. Terry Lowe, pastor and Rev. Ken Cole of Amarillo, officiating.

Burial was in the Wheeler Cemetery in Wheeler, Texas, by Wright Funeral Home, Wheeler, Texas.

Mr. Moore was born January 30, 1916, in Hood Co., Texas to J.C. and Addie Thomas Moore. He moved to Wheeler County in 1918. He married Isabell Hunter on December 30, 1936, in Wheeler, Texas. They moved to the Kelton community in 1937, where he farmed and ranched. He served as a board member on the Kelton I.S.D. Mr. Moore was a member of the Kelton Lions Club, served on the Wheeler Co. Farm Bureau Board, and on the Wheeler Co. Appraisal District Board.

Mr. Moore moved to the Craig Methodist Retirement Center in Amarillo, Texas, in 1998. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Kelton until it closed in 1991. He then became a member of the First United Methodist Church in Shamrock, Texas.

Mr. Moore was preceded in death by his wife, Isabell in 2002, one granddaughter in 1980, 5 brothers, and two sisters.

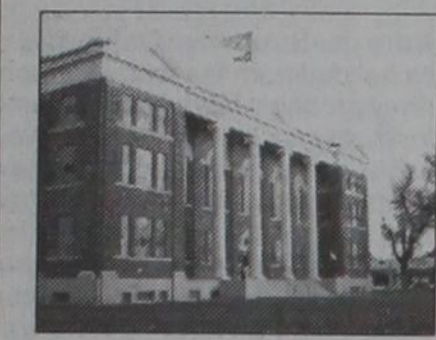

Wheeler Commissioner's Court Meets

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on April 10, 2006, in the Commissioners' Courtroom. Thirteen items were on the agenda.

The court approved the minutes of the March meetings as presented.

The monthly reports of the Justices of the Peace, County Treasurer, County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk were presented and approved.

The court voted to approve the hourly payroll time sheets for payment as presented.

The bills were paid.

No action was taken on the budget.

The burn ban remains in effect.

B. J. Waters, Protege Energy met with the court for the leasing of three tracts of land owned by the county. The court approved the leasing of the parcels at \$400 per acre with a 1/5 interest. Waters will meet with the court at a meeting on April 17 for the completion of the lease.

Elk City Oklahoma Pipeline, LP was given permission to lay an oil and gas pipeline across county road N.

The court received one bid for the lease/purchase of a road maintainer with a trade. The bid received was accepted in the amount of \$96,300. difference. Using the depreciation of the

Any child five years old on or before Sept. 1, 2006, will be eligible to attend kindergarten this fall. If your child will be attending kindergarten at Wheeler ISD, you and your child are invited to attend the visitation in the Wheeler ISD West kindergarten room, located at the end of the Jr. High Hall, last door on the west.

The following schedule has been set:

Last names beginning: A B C D E F, Tues., April 25, 2:15 to 3:15 PM

Last names beginning: G H I J K L, Wed., April 26, 2:15 to 3:15 PM

Last names beginning: M N O P Q R, Thurs., April 27, 2:15 to 3:15 PM

Last names beginning: S T U V W X Y Z, Fri. April 28, 2:15 to 3:15 PM

Feel free to come on another day of the week of visitation if you cannot come on your child's day.

The state of Texas requires the following before your child can be

enrolled this fall:

1. Birth Certificate—Certified Copy, not hospital copy.

2. Immunization Records verified by a valid clinic or physician

The Wheeler School requires your child's Social Security Number for accounting purposes.

You must have these documents in order to enroll your child in the fall. Some of them take time to be processed, so it is a good idea to apply for them immediately. On the day you visit, please bring a copy of your child's immunization records to leave with the school nurse. If you don't have an extra copy, stop in the superintendent's office on your way in, and they will make a copy for you to leave. The nurse needs these records to review before school starts. Leave your child's other records at home. You will need to bring ALL your child's other records when you come to enroll your child in the fall.

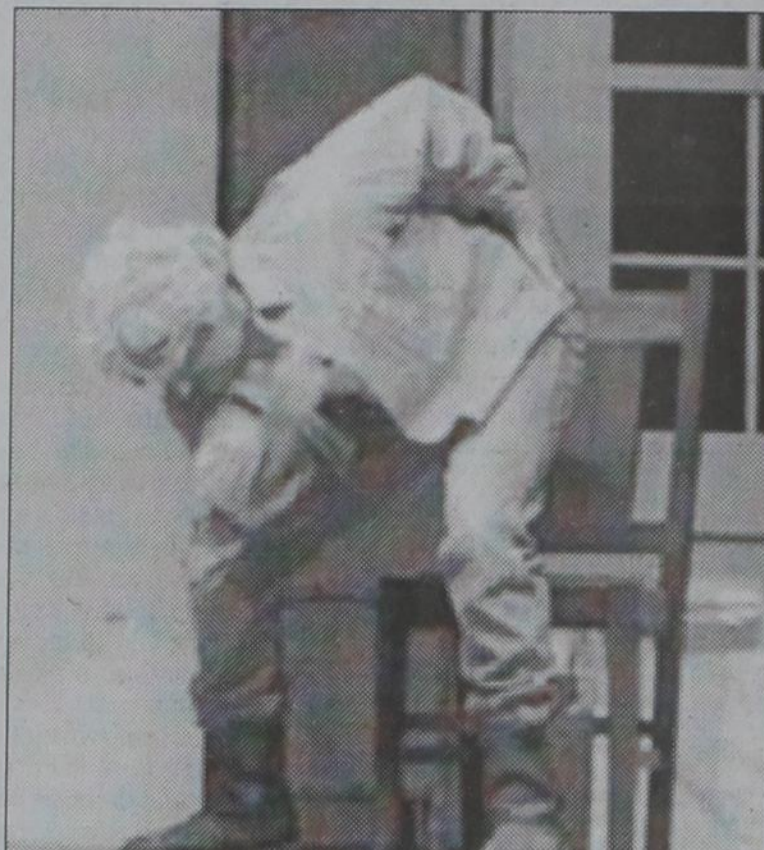

Philemon is a good Christian of some financial means who has a household of servants. One of those servants has run away, though and gone to Paul. Paul studied with him and converted him to Christ. But there is now an awkward dilemma to deal with. Should this servant, named Onesimus, be sent back to Philemon or should he remain with Paul. There are issues of forgiveness, personal responsibility, and graciousness that must all be handled in this short book. Admittedly it seems as though Paul comes across a little strong-handed in trying to persuade Philemon to come to the same conclusion as himself, but Paul's motivation in this book as well as in all of his other writ-

ings is to do things so that the news of Christ is spread to more people. Yes, Philemon will have to suffer a monetary loss, but the end result is that more people are being won to Christ. Paul has confidence that Philemon will agree that his personal loss is actually a victory.

Although there are several lessons that can be learned from this book, the one I will point out here is to look at the big picture. Sometimes we won't get our way. Sometimes we will suffer losses. Sometimes things will not go the way we would have thought they should. But in the big picture, are things overall better for the cause of Christ? If we look at it this way then we will let others have their way. We will be kinder and we won't have our feelings hurt. Take five minutes today and read through the book of Philemon.
