Sheriff Joel Finsterwald met with the court to request permission to advertise for two pickups to be used by his department. The ads will appear for the next two weeks. One pickup is to be an extended cab and the other a 4-door.

Dorman requested permission to close the clerk's office to the public on election day. The office was too shorthanded to conduct the election and conduct regular business of the office. Permission was granted.

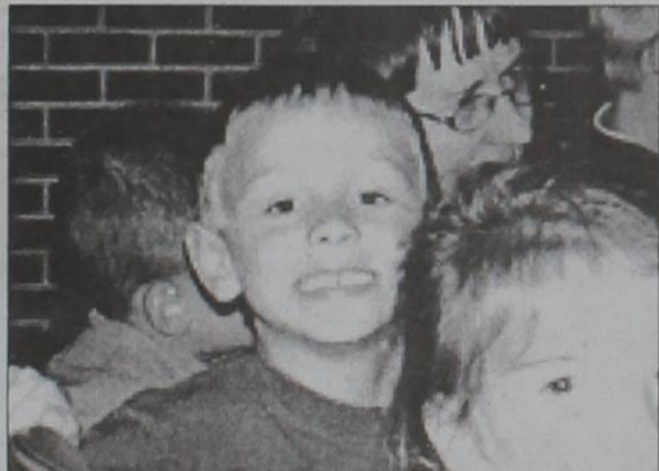

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for NITRATE at 10 mg/L. And has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of the drinking water in your community for NITRATE indicates a level of 12 mg/L.

Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is not an effective treatment for nitrate removal.

Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. At this time, the health effects to fetuses of pregnant women is unclear. If you are pregnant, you may choose to use an alternative source of water for drinking and cooking purposes.

We are working to correct the problem.

WE NO LONGER USE THE WELL WITH THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF NITRATES, WHICH HAS LOWERED THE NITRATE LEVEL FROM 18.6 mg/L to 12 mg/L. Bottled water is available at no cost for the affected populations at City Hall. We are working with the City Engineer and getting technical support from TCEQ for an alternative water supply. The City Engineer is checking on a RO unit to be located at City Hall for use by the affected population.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have seen this notice. You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
