

The Don and Sybil Harrington Foundation was founded as a trust in Amarillo in 1951 by oilman Donald Harrington and his wife, Sybil Buckingham Harrington. In 1988, the Foundation changed from a private foundation to a 'public supporting organization" of the Amarillo Area Foundation (AAF), supporting the operations of AAF with its value of \$68 million. Both Foundations provide grants and services to strengthen nonprofit organizations in the 26 northernmost counties of the Texas Panhandle and the services they deliver.







Well, it has been about 2 months since I wrote my last column, but as I promised Melba Arnold, the proofwriter in Oklahoma City, I would update every now and then. Since last I wrote, not a lot has changed. We did go to Northern California by way of Colorado to see son, Neal, and Spring Valley, Nevada, to see daughter, Laurah, and then to Clear Lake Oaks, California, to see my sister, Shirley, and meet with my two Southern California brothers, Don and Rick, for a few days. We had a great time but they are a lot older than I thought they would be. Then again, I am the oldest, so maybe, just maybe, they thought I was older than they remembered!

My sister Shirley said to bring some games to play, although I never got them out of the trunk of the Buick. We just never shut up talking or eating or playing the "remember game." That is the game where someone says, "Oh yeh, that was in 1965," but someone else says, "No, that was in 1978." Do not ever play this game for no one remembers the times in our lives the same way. It was perfect weather and I would have liked to have stayed longer than the 2 weeks we were gone, but hunt-- ing season is upon Texas so we had to come home.

Good thing we went to Reno after leaving Laurah's, for it would have been very odd to see us carrying a big jar of Koi and goldfish and a carton of eggs into our 12th-floor room at Circus Circus. Laurah put the eggs in the incubator, but they never hatched. I figured that it was Glenn's driving that mixed up the yolks. I told her I would mail some eggs next spring. 

Parkview Artery Be Prepared for Winter Weather

While winter storms can strike quickly and without warning, there are many things you can do to prepare yourself and your family. Take the time to prepare now by having extra blankets on hand and making sure that you and your loved ones have warm coats, hats, gloves or mittens and water-resistant boots.

Assemble an emergency supply kit for your home in case it is not safe to go out during-a storm. Be sure to include bottled water (at least one gallon per person per day), nonperishable food and a can opener. The kit should also include a battery powered NOAA weather radio, flashlight, extra batteries and extra warm clothing. Assemble an emergency supply kit for your car too and have the vehicle winterized before storm season.

Know What To Do

If experts indicate severe weather could be headed your way, stay tuned to local radio and TV stations for updated information on conditions. Know the difference between a winter storm watch and a winter storm warning. Exposure to cold can cause serious injury such as frostbite and hypothermia. When a winter storm warning is issued, follow these tips to stay safe and warm during the storm.

· Stay indoors during the

· If you must go outside, several layers of lightweight clothing will keep you warmer than a single heavy coat. Gloves (or mittens) and a hat will prevent loss of body heat. Cover your mouth to protect your lungs.

· Understand the hazards of wind chill, which combines the cooling effect of wind and cold temperatures on exposed skin. As the wind an increase, heat is carried away from a person's body at an accelerated rated. driving down the body tempera-

· Walk carefully on snowy, icy, sidewalks.


· After the storm, if you shovel snow, be extremely careful. It is physically strenuous work, so take frequent breaks. Avoid overexertion.
