Disking Improves Food For Wildlife

The quail population in Wheeler County has declined considerably in the past year. The decline was caused primarily by the drought and unseasonably cold weather of the past year. A pair of quail averages 14 young per year. With adequate food, protection from predators, and weather conditions, quail can reach huntable populations in a relatively short period of time—often in one year.

One method to increase the food supply for quail is by disking strips in pastures. February is the ideal time to disk. Proper disking removes winter annuals that would compete with more ideal quail food such as crotons, sunflowers, ragweeds, and other large seeded forbs. Disking also provides a better seedbed for these forbs to germinate as the weather warms up.

The land should be disked in 25 foot to 50 foot strips to kill or bury existing annual vegetation. Locate strips near woody cover or areas of tall and medium height grasses. This enables birds to move safely between cover and food supply. At least 5% of a pasture should be disked in order to have a noticeable effect on the food supply for quail.

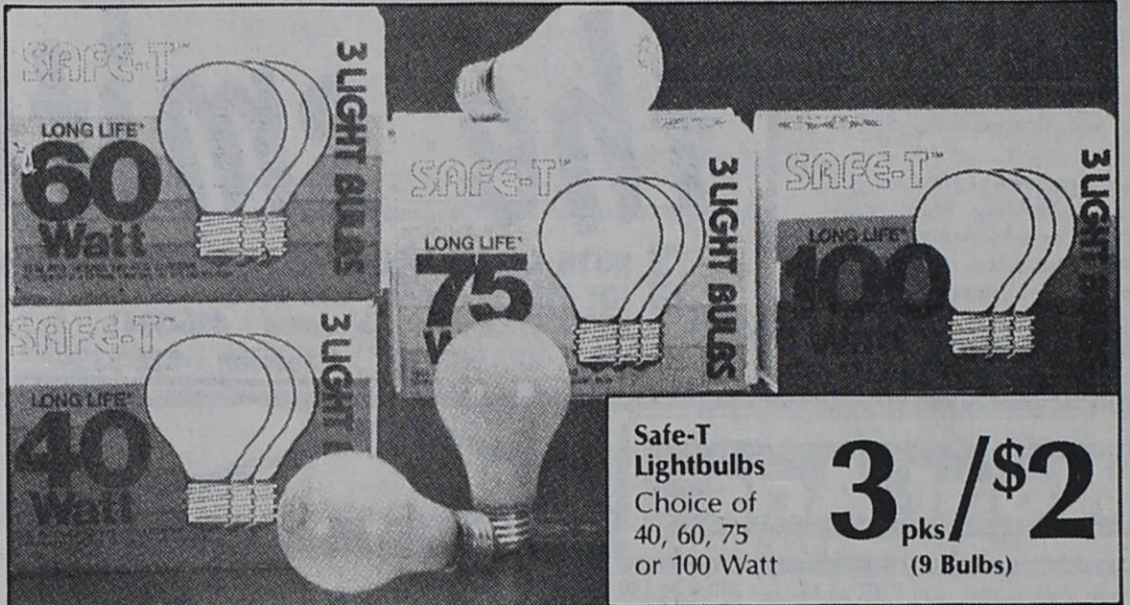
