





Dear Editor
October is Domestic Violence Awareness month. The intent of this article serves to remind readers that family violence is a very real problem in communities around the world. 1 out of 3 women are physically or sexually abused at some point in their life. Pregnant women are more likely to be victims of homicide than to die of any other cause. Approximately 1 in 5 female high school students reports being physically and/or sexually abused by a dating partner. Domestic violence costs employers \$4.1 billion in health care and related costs with 13.5 million workdays lost by abused employees. The dynamics of family violence also includes the criminal justice system. Everyday, law enforcement officers place their lives on the line when they respond to a domestic violence call; likewise, judges hearing divorce cases and granting Protective Orders are often shot and wounded or even killed by a disgruntled spouse/partner. Shelter Centers are not immune either. In the 15 years I have worked for Tralee Crisis Center we have had bomb threats, break-ins, and threats of violence, causing us to have heightened security measures not only at our shelter but at our main office. Tralee Crisis Center is this community's resource to provide help and healing to the many who suffer from partner abuse. Services provided by Tralee Crisis Center include food, shelter, and crisis intervention and transportation to safety. While continuing to provide this intervention service to victims, Tralee will shift our program effort over the next three years toward the prevention of violence in our communities. The quality of our community life suffers when the health and well being of individuals and families are being destroyed. Shelter programs, churches, schools, businesses, social service agencies must come together with a clear message that domestic abuse will not be tolerated. Everyday many children are being raised and subjected to violence in their homes. Many studies have shown that this type of environment often produces boys who will grow up and be abusers and girls may learn that violence against women is normal. As a member of a community you can help. Find out how elected officials handle family violence cases, volunteer with a local Family Violence Program. Lend an ear and keep the information confidential as someone's life may be at stake. Find out how your church handles domestic abuse cases. We can in our communities make a difference, because behavior and attitudes can change.



Mrs. Galutia read the prepared statement and it was entered into the record of the meeting *in toto*. Several board members asked questions of Dr. Galutia regarding his prepared comments. After some further discussion Ms. Fagan Cook stated that she would meet with Dr. Galutia, Dr. Mendiola, Tommy Weaver, RPh., and Mrs. Stiles in the next few days in an attempt to resolve some of the issues discussed. Dr. and Mrs. Galutia left the meeting at 8:15 p.m.
