Beef Cattle Workshop To Be Held Nov. 16

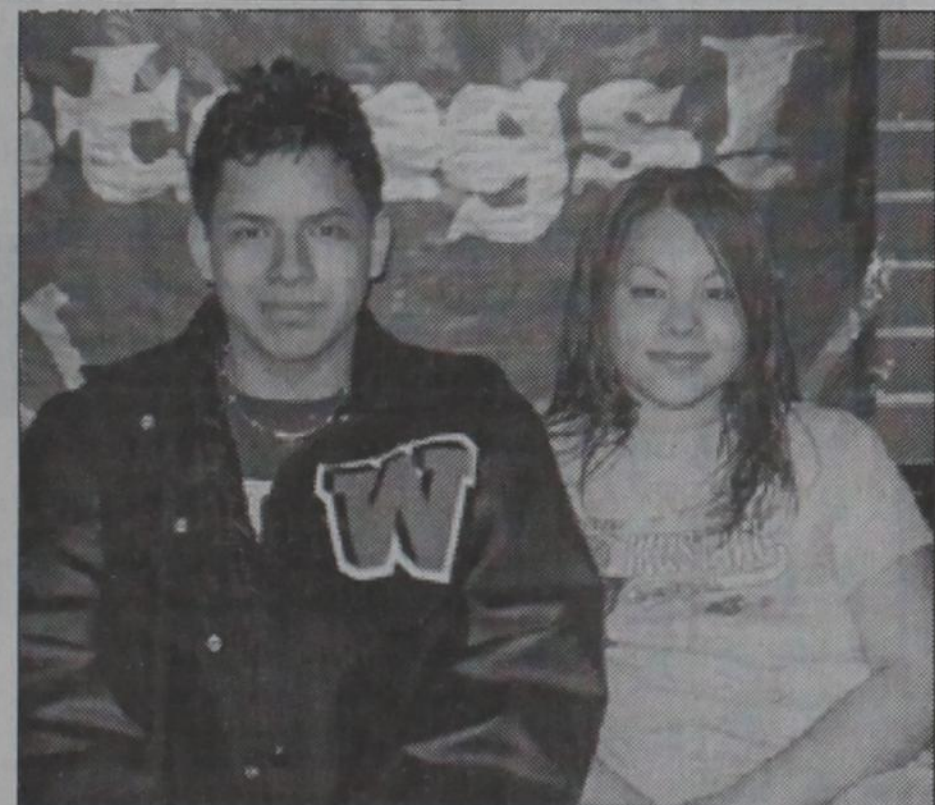
There will be a Beef Cattle Workshop on November 16, 2006 at 6:00 pm at the Wheeler Church of Christ Activity Building.

The Wheeler ISD Board of Trustees met for a special meeting October 23, 2006. Dr. Mike Smith called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

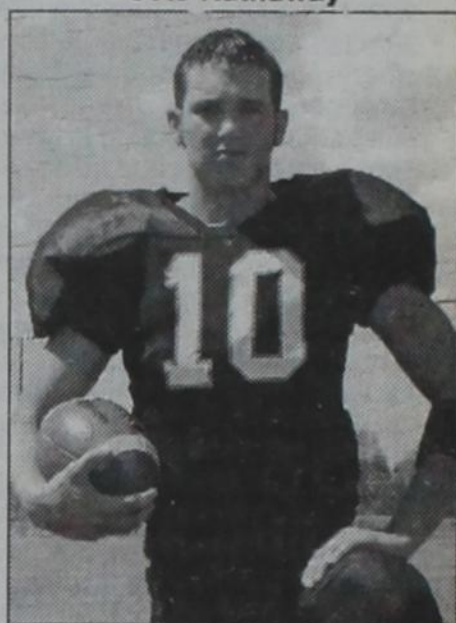

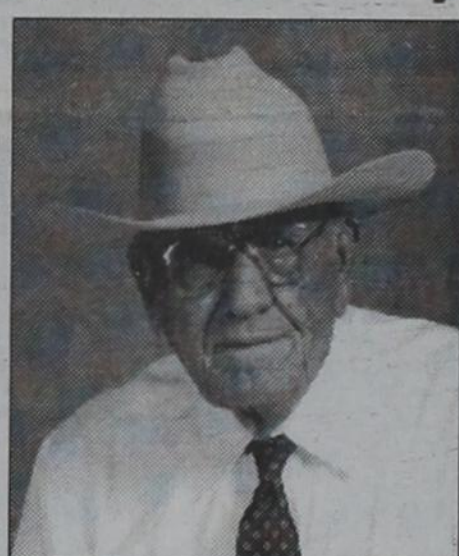

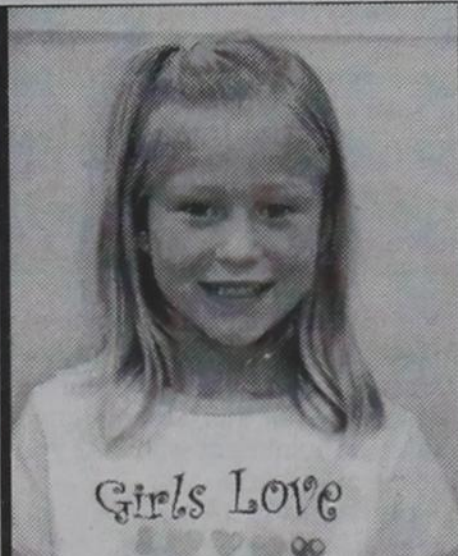

We went to an auction today and it was quite interesting. It was a farm auction and they sold only farm stuff and other things that we are trying to get removed from our farm. How on earth can anyone bid on old rusty sucker rods? Not just one but 164 sucker rods. Now that is beyond my imagination. Glenn Frosty Forrest tried his best to explain to me what they are used for but since I could not even pick one up, it would be of no use to me anyway. A man bought dozens of old used tires. We are still trying to get rid of ours - especially the huge one that Glenn's late brother Clifton left on the farm many years ago. It must have been on an earth mover, but it has become a landmark for me. I know when I see it that I can turn there and get back on the main road to go home. Glenn wanted to bid on a tire changer although I thought it had seen better days - like 70 years ago. I must say the auctioneers were very good and quite funny. Always at each other about something, but it was all in fun and kept us laughing. One of the buyers got a cell phone call and I overheard him say that he did not know where he was. No, it was not loss of memory, but just a true statement. To get to this sale we went down so many dirt roads in every direction, out in the middle of nowhere, that I do not think I could have gotten out by myself. Good thing Glenn was driving his truck. Looked like only pickup trucks with large trailers were allowed. Bob Garrett was there but he did not bring a trailer, nor did Glenn so we had no rusty items to haul home. Glenn took me to the Cowboy Oasis afterward for dinner or lunch as we say in California. All that action and walking at the auction makes a person hungry.

We let our chickens out in the yard for a few hours each day so they can enjoy catching bugs and some freedom. When it is time to put them into their pens, it is game time for every chicken. The 6 bantams, 3 Aroucanas and 1 large white hen with black lace feathers around her neck, try to avoid the march to their pens. Those 10 chickens make you think there are ten times that many as they avoid our instructions to get into their houses. I have resorted to threats and that works for now. I get the butterfly net and get after the bantams with the threat of, "Who ever I catch might be dinner." They all take off for home, but poor little Goldie is always last with that slow waddle and she is the only one I get close enough to catch. Sometimes Glenn gets the hose after

them and since they have a deep dislike for water, they run to the hen house. He can no longer do that as they might get shot with ice since we have had our first freeze. This week I caught Goldie and one Araconda, but I never go through with my threat. Besides they are probably tougher than an old boot and they do lay a lot of fresh eggs. The County Treasurers Association of Texas (CTAT) has elected the Wheeler County Treasurer, Jauna Benefield as their organization's Regional Director. Jauna was elected by majority vote of CTAT members at the CTAT Annual Conference in Beaumont on September 21st. The membership of CTAT consists of elected county treasurers from each county across Texas.

As Region Director for CTAT, Jauna will be responsible for educating and communicating with the other elected County Treasurers in Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman and Swisher counties on legislative matters that affect local county government. Region Directors are an important tool for county government to use in communicating the needs of counties to legislators in Austin. The primary focus of CTAT is on education. The association membership is frequently called upon to serve as Board members for investment firms and to serve on committees formed to solve some of the most difficult administrative issues facing Texas counties.

Texas' county treasurers date back to 1846, when the Legislature first created the office by statute and was later placed in the Texas Constitution—Article 44—and has remained there since. The county treasurer acts as the chief custodian of county finance and plays an integral part of the checks and balance system of local county government. In essence, treasurers are the counties' bankers who provide local taxpayers assurances that an official chosen by voters will be their financial watchdog.

Lesa Crosswhite, Taylor County Treasurer and CTAT President said, Jauna is filling a vital leadership role in The County Treasurers Association of Texas and in Wheeler County by serving the citizens who elect her and the citizens of Texas. 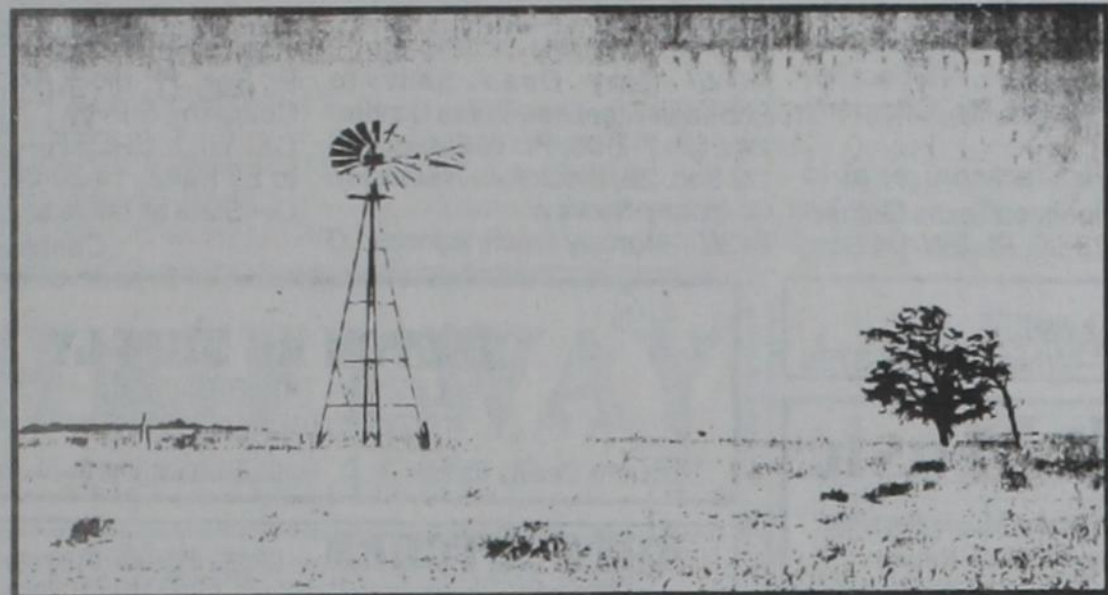

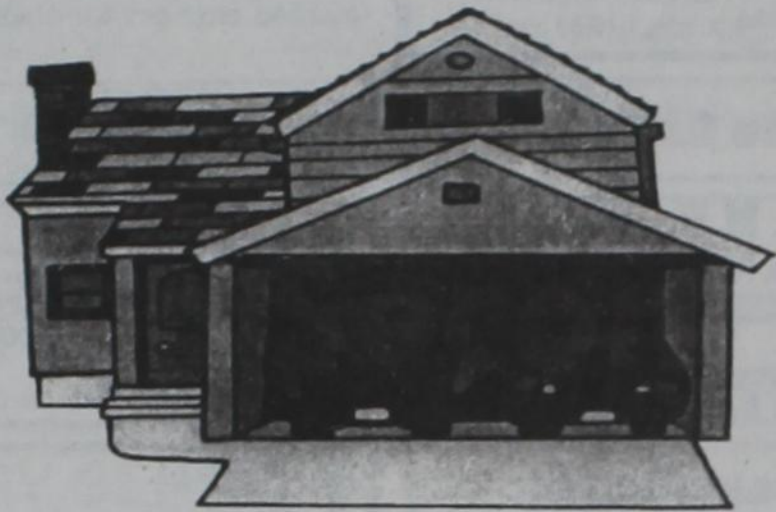

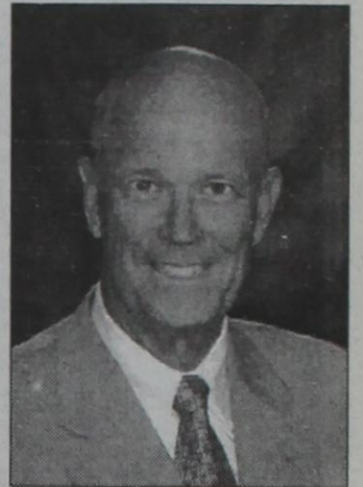

Joe Don King, Joe VanZandt Are Recognized At Ext. Centennial

On November 4th District I Extension Agents celebrated the Centennial in Canyon at a reception. Retired Extension Agents Joe & Janie VanZandt and Joe Don King accompanied by his wife Wanda King were present for the celebration. Joe VanZandt retired from Gray County, Janie VanZandt retired from Comanche County and Joe Don King retired from Wheeler County.

It was a century ago on Nov. 12, 1906, that local leaders in Tyler hired WC. Stallings, a leading farmer, to serve Smith County as the first Extension agent to serve a single county in Texas.

The groundwork leading up to that historic hiring began in 1892, when the boll weevil invaded Texas from Mexico. By 1903, the small beetles had cut Texas cotton yields in half. They were well on their way to toppling the long-held monarchy of "King Cotton" in the Lone Star State and the economic health of Texas.

Fear of losing the entire cotton

industry led to extreme reactions. Dr. Seaman A. Knapp, U.S.

Department of Agriculture Special Agent for Promotion of Agriculture in the South, toured the infested area and wrote: "I saw hundreds of farms lying out; I saw a wretched people facing starvation; I saw whole towns deserted..."

Congress appropriated \$250,000 for use in "stamping out the boll weevil" in 1904. The money was split between U.S. Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Entomology and Bureau of Plant Industry. Both bureaus promptly began "how-to" demonstration work on government-owned experimental farms for farmers to emulate. But the farmers were unimpressed. The farming practices demonstrated were right, but the delivery methods were wrong. The human factor hadn't been considered. Most farmers scoffed at the ideas they were shown, because they knew any possible loss incurred would be completely covered by "Uncle Sam's" dollars.

Knapp, though, knew how to communicate with farmers. His leadership skills and understanding of his audience had led to the first community-based, farmer-administered farm demonstration in the nation. That project occurred on the Walter C. Porter Farm in Terrell in Kaufman County.

Terrell community leaders had asked Knapp in 1902 if he would set up a government-run farm in their community. But Knapp already supervised five demonstration farms in Texas and Louisiana, and regrettably declined, having run out of the time and funds needed to take on another property.

The Terrell group didn't take "no" for an answer. They offered to run and fund the farm themselves if Knapp would give guidance and recommendations applicable to their growing conditions. A formal agreement was ratified on Feb. 25, 1903, thus establishing the result method demonstration work that is so vital to Extension work today.

Porter subsequently planted 70 acres under Knapp's guidance and was rewarded with more return per acre than his family had ever earned.

Ironically, the Porter Farm demonstration had nothing to do with the boll weevil. Porter's work focused instead on soil improvement and crop diversification. However, Knapp's educational method of reaching farmers, called "cooperative demonstration work," was immediately adopted to address the boll weevil problem.

The Knapp-Porter success grew to include 7,000 farmers by 1904 and 32,000 by 1908. There were too many demonstration projects going by 1904 for Knapp to personally supervise, so USDA, aided by a national philanthropists' group known as the General Education Board, hired regional agents to travel from farm to farm.

By 1906, local interest in demonstration work became so strong that taxes levied by commissioners' courts and school boards were appropriated to hire agents to work in single counties.

Stallings was the first one hired. According to Joseph C. Bailey (1945), Knapp's biographer, Knapp wanted men much like himself with: an abundance of sound common sense; a well-earned reputation for successful and superior farming practices; a readiness to serve their fellow farmers and the cause of better agriculture ... ; a position of some authority and leadership in their own communities arising from these attributes; and, finally, a good bit of ... shrewd discernment and adroitness in converting skeptics and recalcitrants.

Today, all of Texas' 254 counties are served by at least one county Extension agent. Their realm of educational knowledge has extended from solely agriculture and natural resources to now include agents with responsibilities in 4-H, Extension's youth component; family and consumer sciences; and community resources and economic development. These agents are backed by subject-matter specialists across the

state who act as resource people in a wide variety of disciplines.

Knapp had the foresight to include the credibility of what is now the Texas A&M University System in the supervising of demonstration work to minimize possible objections to federal intervention in state and local affairs.

It's been 100 years since Stallings was hired, but the same values of credibility and respect that made the agent of that era such a success still hold true today. Extension's credo of "real learning for real life" is as imperative to the success of the organization now as it was then.

And what's become of the boll weevil that galvanized Texans to act and kick-started Cooperative Extension work? He's still here, but his threat to the industry is greatly diminished thanks in no small part to the educational efforts of Extension agents and specialists who convinced farmers

statewide to support and cooperate with the efforts of the Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation. Today, every acre in Texas is in the eradication program and 2/3 of all the cotton acres have only a very low boll weevil infestation.
