FEBRUARY 9, 2009

Chairman Helton called the meeting to order in the Parkview Hospital Board room at 6:00 p.m. Present were: Thomas R. Helton, Chairman; James Chandler, Vice Chairman; James Batton, Secretary, Dale Garner and Ray Hudson. Also present: Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, CEO and John P. Lavelle, M.D.

James Batton made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Sue Chandler seconded the motion. Ms. Fagan Cook stated that she had made an error in the minimum wage figure last month. It is reflected in the minutes as \$7.15/hour when, in fact, the amount is \$7.25/hour. Mr. Batton amended the motion to include this correction; seconder agreed with the amendment. Chairman Helton called the question and the motion with the amendment carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented investment report. She reported that two CDs are maturing on March 2, 2009. Consensus was that Ms. Cook should obtain current rates on March 9 in order that an informed decision can be made about reinvestment.

Bad debt write-off report was presented. Dale Garner made a motion to approve the write-off report. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously. There were no charity write-offs.

QAPI minutes and scorecards were presented. James Batton made a motion to accept the reports and Sue Chandler seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

A proposal for beginning to use direct deposit for those employees who wish to do so was presented. Dale Garner made a motion to proceed with this and Sue Chandler seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented a list of surplus equipment and furniture. Consensus was for Ms. Fagan Cook to accept sealed bids for these items and proceed with the sale.

A transfer agreement with McLean Care Center was presented. Dale Garner made a motion to sign the agreement and this was seconded by James Batton. Motion carried unanimously.

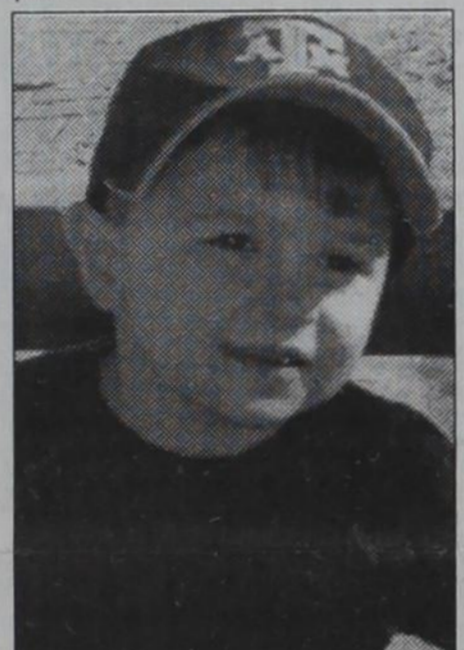

### Memorial Services For Kevin Dawson

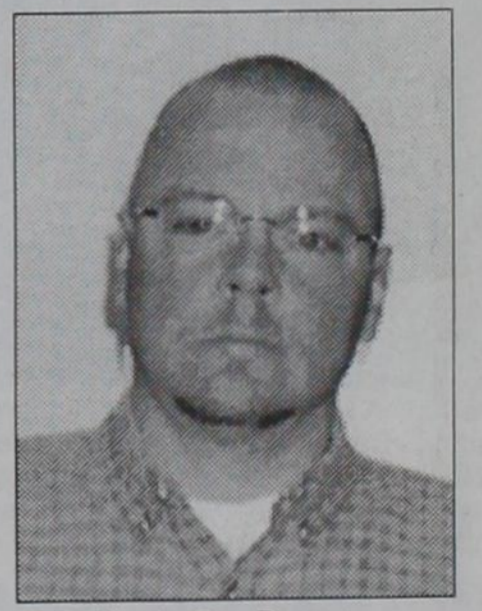

**Don't get hit with a penalty!**  
**"Render" your taxable property by April 15.**

A "rendition" is a report to your county appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you owned or controlled on Jan. 1 of this year.

**Who must file a rendition?**  
You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income—such as the inventory and equipment used by a business. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, a 10 percent to 50 percent penalty may be imposed.

**Are there any advantages to you?**  
The advantages of filing a rendition are:

1. You give your opinion of your property's value. The appraisal district must notify you in writing of any value change and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.

2. You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.

3. You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depreciation of the value of your property in 2008. The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 2009.

**What's the deadline?**  
The last day for filing 2009 renditions is April 15. You can get an automatic extension to May 15 if you ask for it in writing on or before the April 15 deadline. The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days after May 15 for an owner who shows good cause in writing.

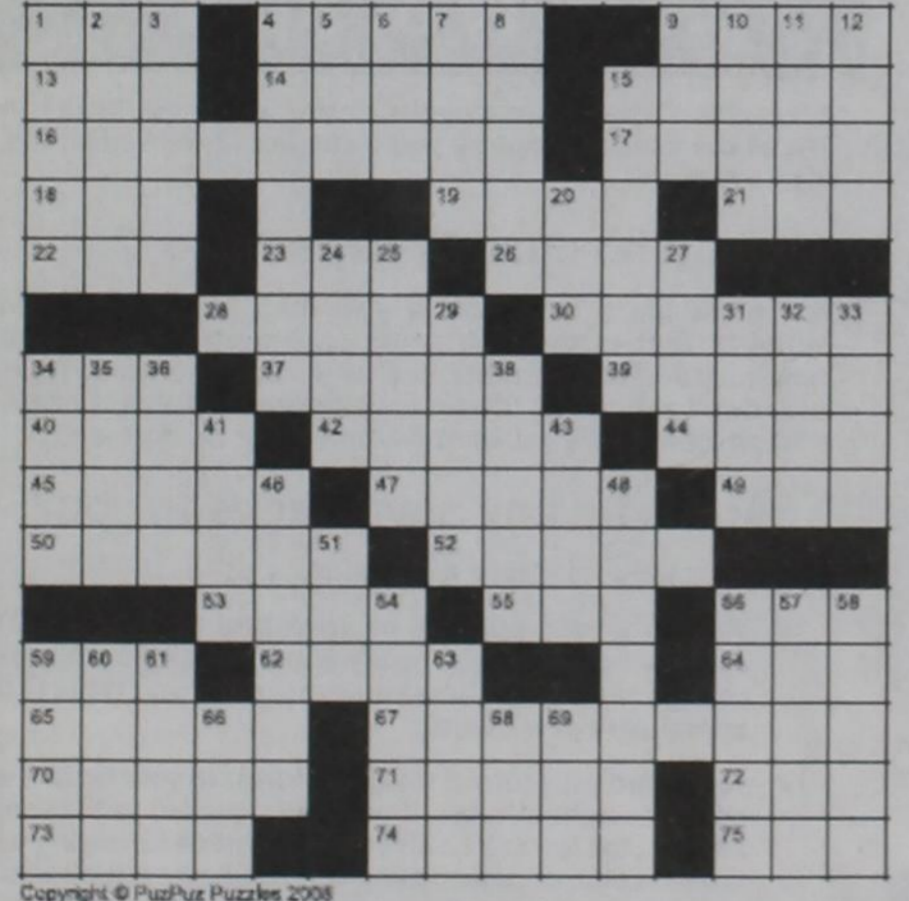

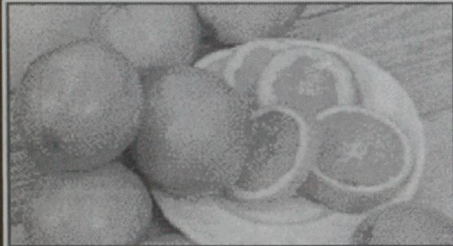

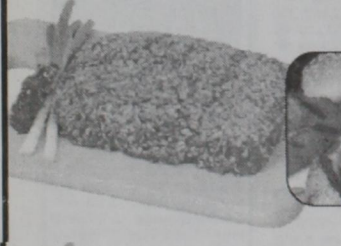
