Last week the One Act Play also began working on the production of “The Nerd.” The first festival that the students will compete at is in Shallowater, TX on February 6.

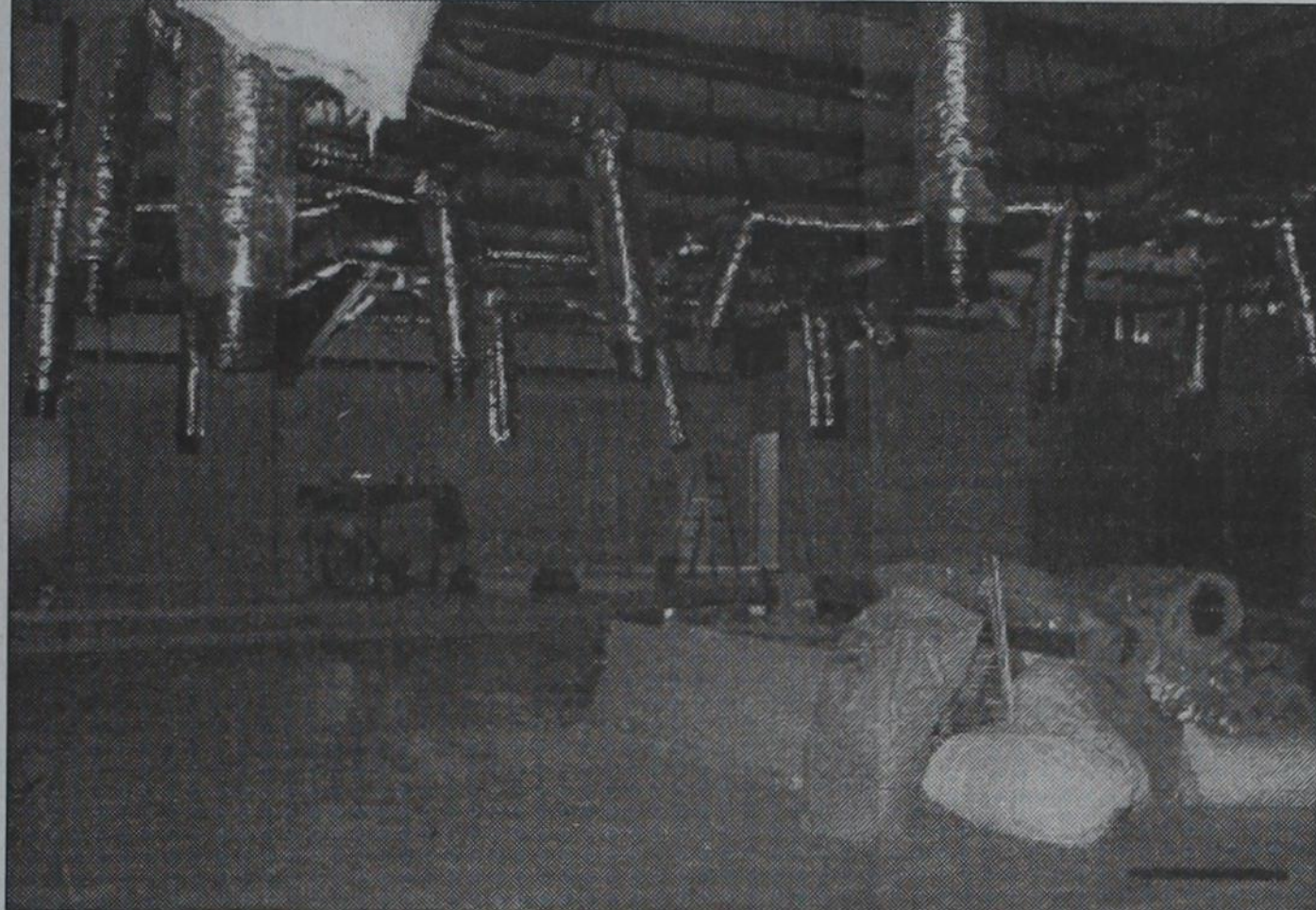

Grass Fire East Of Mobeetie Monday

A grass fire east of Mobeetie Monday afternoon burned a number of acres of grass. No building were lost in the fire.

The fire started at the edge of the Mobeetie/Briscoe Highway and burned almost to Highway 152 to the south.

Local fire departments as well as those from Gray, Hemphill and Lipscomb counties helped fight the fire in strong winds and cold temperatures.

The fire was reported around 1:30 and was under control by 3:30. An estimated 600 acres were burned.

Commissioners' Court Meeting

Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, January 12, 2009, in the commissioners' courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 10:00 a.m.

Sixteen items were on the agenda.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.

The monthly reports from the Justices of the Peace, County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and County Treasurer were approved.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment.

The court voted to approve the payment of the bills as presented.

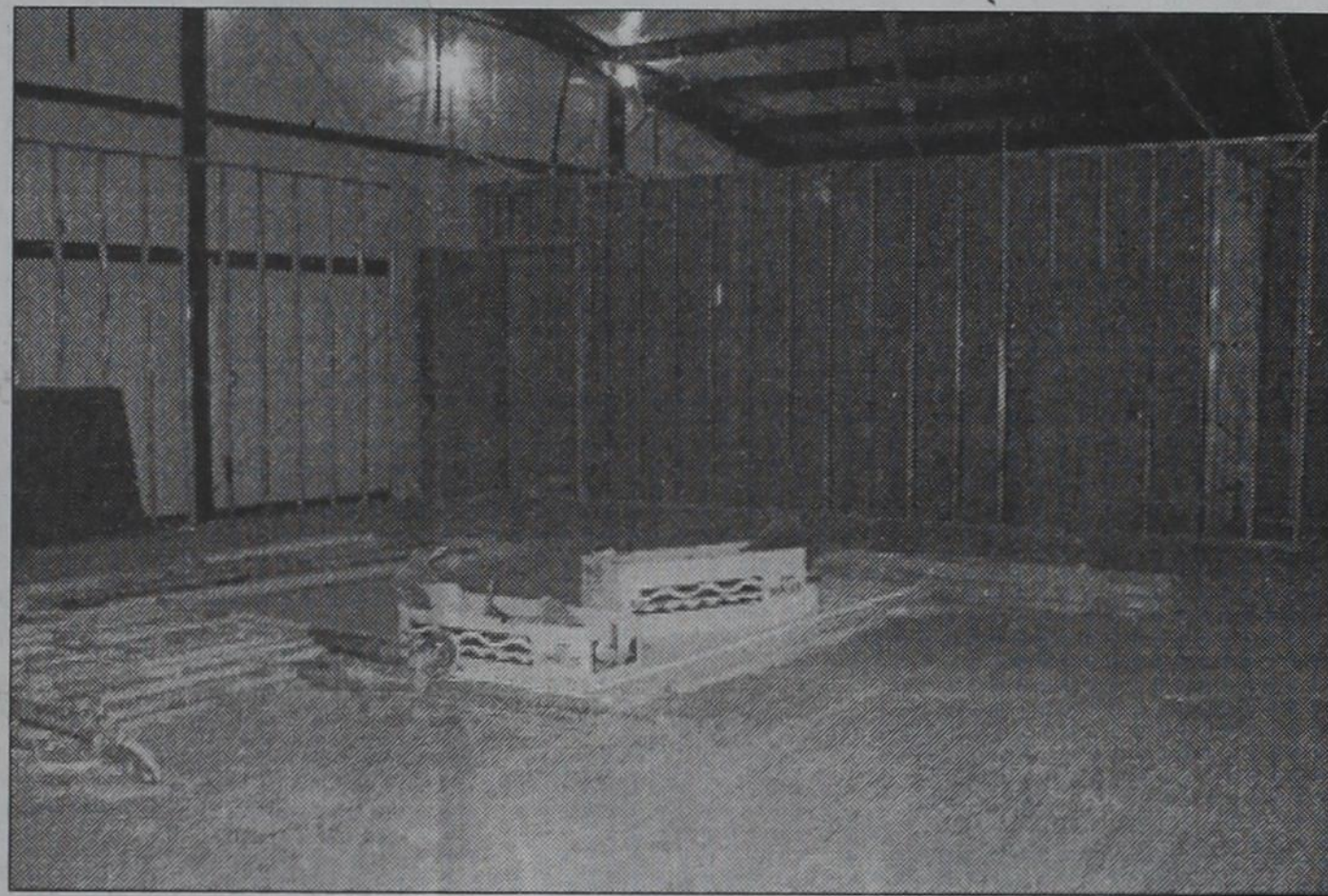
The court appointed Johnny Carter as traffic controller. Johnny Carter was sworn as Constable Precinct 2 in January. He will also serve as traffic controller; his monthly salary will be \$357 per month.

As Constable for Precinct 1, Mack Marshall draws a salary of \$50.

Monies were transferred with in the budget. \$13,000 was transferred from traffic controller to constables. \$1,000 was transferred from traffic controller to constable supply. And, \$5,000 was transferred to constable fuel. An additional \$600 was transferred to the constable social security line and \$1,500 to constable travel and meal line.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

The court approved the lease by the tax assessor for a postage meter. The present meter is sev-

Parkview Hospital Board

December 8, 2008

Chairman Thomas Helton called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room at Parkview Hospital. Present were Thomas Helton, Chairman; Sue Chandler, Vice Chairman; James Batton, Secretary and Dale Garner. Ray Hudson was absent.

Dale Garner made a motion to accept the consent agenda. James Batton seconded the motion. There was discussion regarding items on the financial statements. After Ms. Fagan Cook answered the questions the question was called and the motion carried unanimously.

Current investments were discussed. We have three CDs maturing in 2009. No action was taken.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the bad debt report for the month. Dale Garner made a motion to accept the report was presented. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously. There were no charity write-offs.

QAPI minutes and scorecards were presented. James Batton made the motion to approve, seconded by Dale Garner. After discussion the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the contract with Prognosis Health Information Systems. She stated that an attorney at Davis & Wilkerson in Austin had reviewed the contract. The contract specifies that one half of the total is to be paid initially and the other half is to be paid after the installation of the system.

No further action is required. There has been discussion in the past regarding updating our enabling legislation that has not been updated since 1963. Ms. Fagan Cook presented a revised version that was prepared by an attorney with Davis & Wilkerson. This is necessary to bring the legislation into line with current laws as well as to correctly identify the areas where board members are chosen. This is necessary since the school districts have changed. Also missing from the original legislation was the ability of the Dis-

trict to issue bonds and a plan for dissolution of the District if this ever becomes necessary. Dale Garner made a motion to accept the changes and to get this to Representative Warren Chisum for presentation to the Legislature this year. James Batton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented a revision of the bid for the Helipad from West Texas Landscaping. Instead of a chain link fence on the south and east sides hedges will be planted to outline those areas. Ray Hudson will communicate with West Texas regarding this. No other action was necessary.

It is time to renew our workman's compensation insurance policy. Bid was presented and is for the same amount as last year. Dale Garner made a motion to accept the bid from THIE. Motion was seconded by James Batton and carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook reported that Parrish, Moody & Fikes, p.c. were preparing a six-month mini-cost report which should be available by the next meeting.

Chairman Helton asked if there was any new business. There was none and James Batton made a motion to adjourn at 7:10 p.m. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Phyllis Carol Hefley, 64, died Wednesday, January 7, 2009, in Wheeler, Texas.

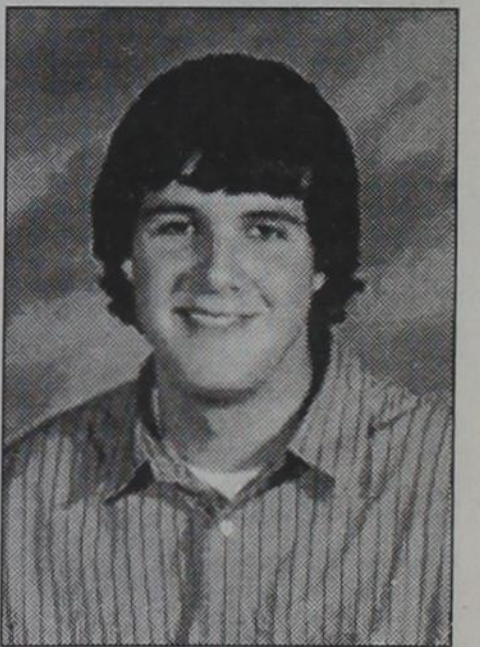
