

William Wayne Edwards, 80, died March 4, 2007, at Wheeler, TX





TO RECONCILE FUEL COSTS

On March 31, 2006, and as updated on February 26, 2007, Mutual Energy SWEPCO doing business as Mutual Energy SPP ("ME SPP" or "Company") filed its application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") to reconcile its eligible fuel factor expenses incurred from January 2005 through January 2007 ("Reconciliation Period"). This filing was made pursuant to Section 36.203 of the Texas Utilities Code.

Commission Docket No. 25314 established the fuel reconciliation methodology for use in the ME SPP service territory. ME SPP's total under-recovery balance for the Reconciliation Period is \$5,354,088 (including interest). ME SPP seeks authority to collect that balance through a surcharge to be collected over a 30-month period from former ME SPP customers now served by Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO), effective with the April 2007 billing month.

The Company's fuel reconciliation filing does not affect the Company's base rates that are currently in effect. All of ME SPP's former customers (now served by SWEPCO) are affected by the Company's application. The average effect on a Residential Service customer using 1,000 kWh would be an increase of \$17.37 per month, or a 19.3% increase in total billings for the year.
