

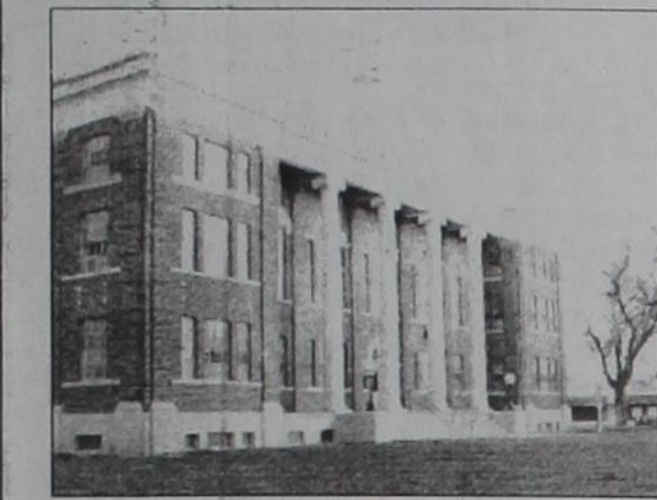

## Commissioners' Court Meets; County Road Map Is Adopted

Wheeler County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, January 26, 2009, at the commissioners' courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse. The session began at 10:00 a.m. Ten items were on the agenda for the court.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment as presented.

The bill were approved for payment as presented.

No action was taken on the budget.

The court voted to publish the rules for outdoor burning. This can be found elsewhere in the *Times*.

There were not minutes of previous meetings for the court to approve.

There were not monthly reports submitted for the court's approval.

The court approved the contract for the annual inspections with Firehawk Safety Systems, Inc.; this is for the inspection of the fire alarm for the courthouse.

Certificates and behavior observation worksheets for Defensive Driving for Precincts 1, 2, 3 & 4 were presented and approved by the court.

The court approved the application for a grant for the purchase

of a computer program and computers for use by the Sheriff's Department, Shamrock Police Department and County Constables. Each officer will have a computer in his or her cars for the purpose of keeping in touch with other officers and writing tickets. If received the grant will have a value of \$106,000 at no cost to the county.

The official county road map was presented to the court. Omissions in the map were corrected and approved.

BOARD MINUTES  
JANUARY 12, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairman Thomas Helton in the Boardroom at Parkview Hospital.

Present were: Thomas Helton, Chairman; Sue Chandler, Vice Chairman, and Dale Garner. Absent were Ray Hudson and James Batton.

Also present: Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, and Dr. J. Pat Lavelle. Dale Garner made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Sue Chandler seconded the motion. There were some questions regarding bills. Following this the question was called and passed unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the investment report. We have two CDs maturing in March. There was discussion regarding our long-term investments. Chairman Helton requested that we obtain rates from Wheeler Banking Center. No action was taken.

Bad debt and charity write-offs were presented. Sue Chandler made a motion to approve the write-offs for bad debt and Dale Garner seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. Sue Chandler made a motion to approve charity write-offs with the exception of one account that will be handled differently. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook reported on the state of Medical Staff Bylaws. New bylaws were drafted by Fletcher Brown of Davis & Wilkerson, p.c., of Austin last year.

These were presented to the medical staff but no action has been taken by the medical staff. Mr. Brown advised that the Board has a duty to deal with the issue and recommended that the Board approve the new bylaws that will include due process for all concerned. Dale Garner made a motion to approve the bylaws to go into effect February 1, 2009. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the following as the administrator's report:

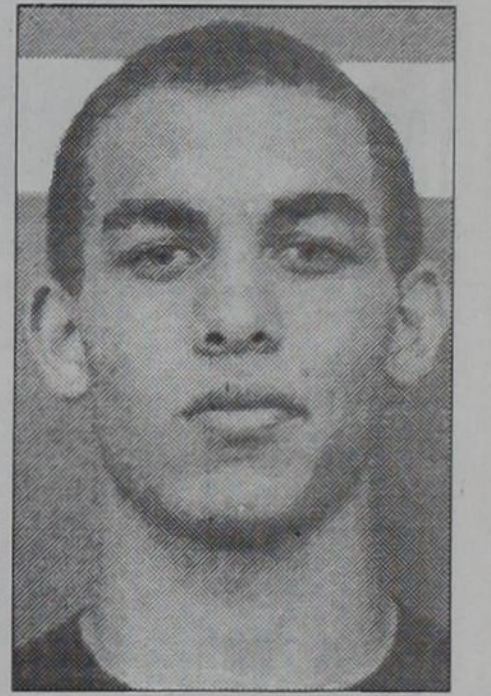
A. Remote pharmacy services will be provided by Pharmacy & Consulting Management Company as before, but the contract will be directly with this provider instead of through MDG Medical. Contract has been reviewed by Trent Krienke of Davis & Wilkerson. Sue Chandler made a motion to approve the contract that was carried by Dale Garner. Motion carried unanimously.

B. Wheeler Livestock Boosters have requested a donation for their activities. Dale Garner made a motion not to donate to any new charities this year. Sue Chandler seconded the motion. There was discussion regarding the issue and the motion passed unanimously.

C. Dr. John Joe and Roy McFaddin from Prognosis Health Information Systems will be here January 15-16 to continue obtaining information for the electronic medical record.

D. A letter was received from CMS regarding an overpayment to our facility. Parrish, Moody & Fikes, p.c. have completed a six-month mini-cost report which in fact shows that we were underpaid for the past six months secondary to a reduction in swing bed

## Richerson Named Player Of The Year

Tae Richerson a quarterback for the Cooper High School in Lubbock, Texas, was named Offensive Player of the Year in the All-South Plains 3A Squad.

The 6'3" 190 lb. sophomore was named Offensive player of the year. "No personnel move had a bigger impact on a season than the insertion of Richerson as the starting quarterback for the Pirates at midseason. Richerson stepped in and led Cooper to the 1-3A title by rushing for 1,171 yards and 10 touchdowns." read the article in the Lubbock *Avalanche-Journal's* Jan 19, 2009 article.

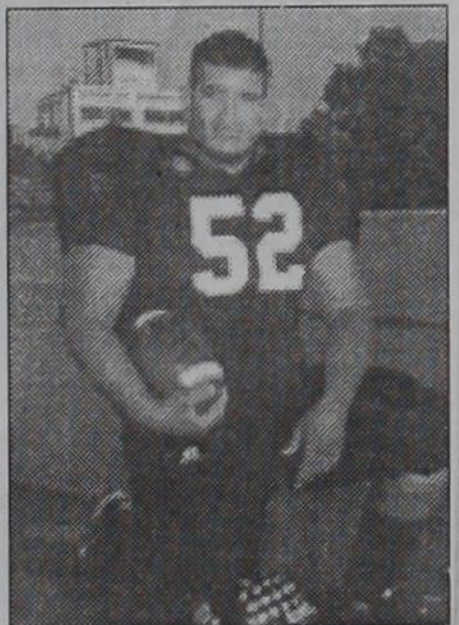
Cooper coach John Windham was just trying to light a spark in his team when he made the decision to switch quarterbacks - well, move a sophomore receiver to quarterback and a senior quarterback to receiver.

The result was more than what was hoped for. Sophomore Tae Richerson sparked the Pirates to a win in his first game, and eventually led Cooper to a surprising District 1-3A crown. Along with a stingy defense led by linebacker Jordan Flowers, the Pirates surged to an unbeaten run in 1-3A.

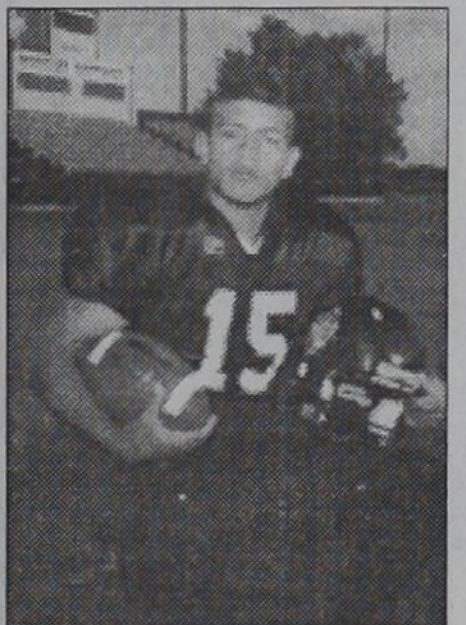
Richerson, the Offensive Player of the Year, led Cooper to a 22-19 win over Brownfield after taking over for Tyler Sutton during the game in Week 5, then paced the Pirates to victories in five of their next six games. He finished the year with 1,171 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns.

And for making the move to spark the team, Windham gets the nod as Coach of the Year, leading Cooper to its first district title since 2005.

Tae is the grandson of Sibyl Clark and the late John Clark; he is the great-grandson of Yreva Topper, all are from Wheeler.

In addition to football, ISSI athletes will also be competing in track and field, golf, wrestling, swimming, volleyball, basketball and cheer.

The Down Under Bowl will be held mid June through early July on the Gold Coast of Queensland, Australia. The competition is intense but friendly as teams from Australia and New Zealand compete against teams from the United States. Each team will compete in two games played according to high school federation rules. The team's 11-12 day trip (depending on flight schedules) will include 7 days competing and sight-seeing on the Gold Coast of Australia and 3-4 days enjoying the fun and surf of Hawaii.

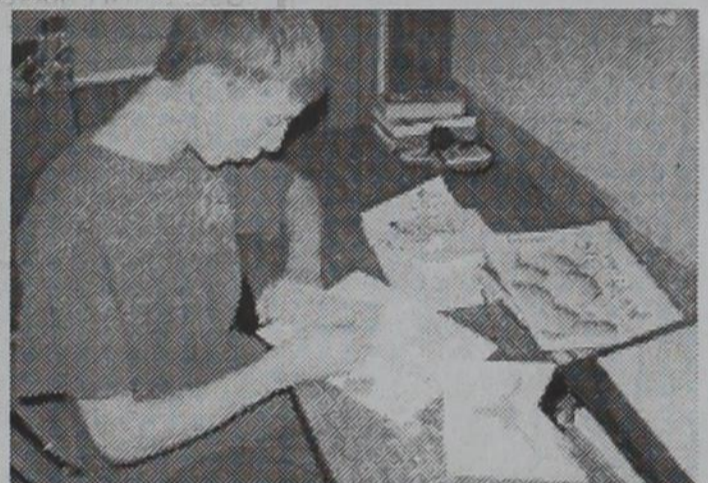

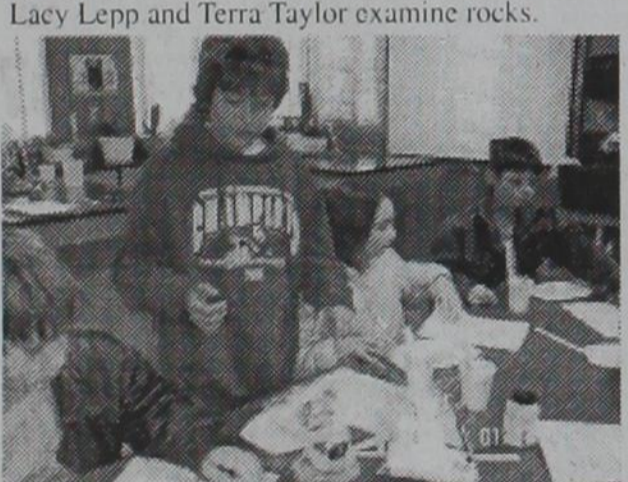

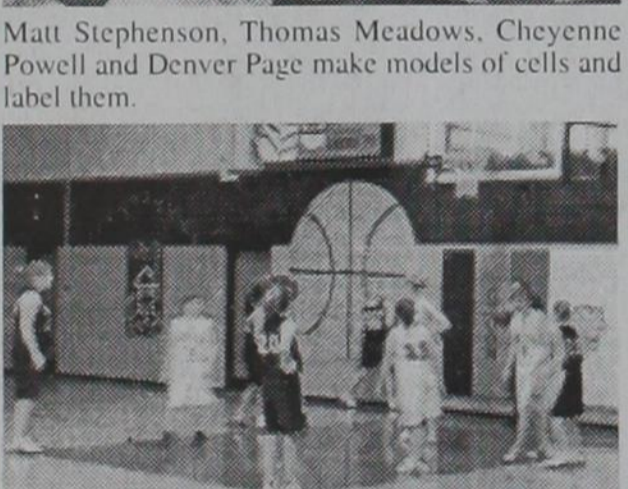

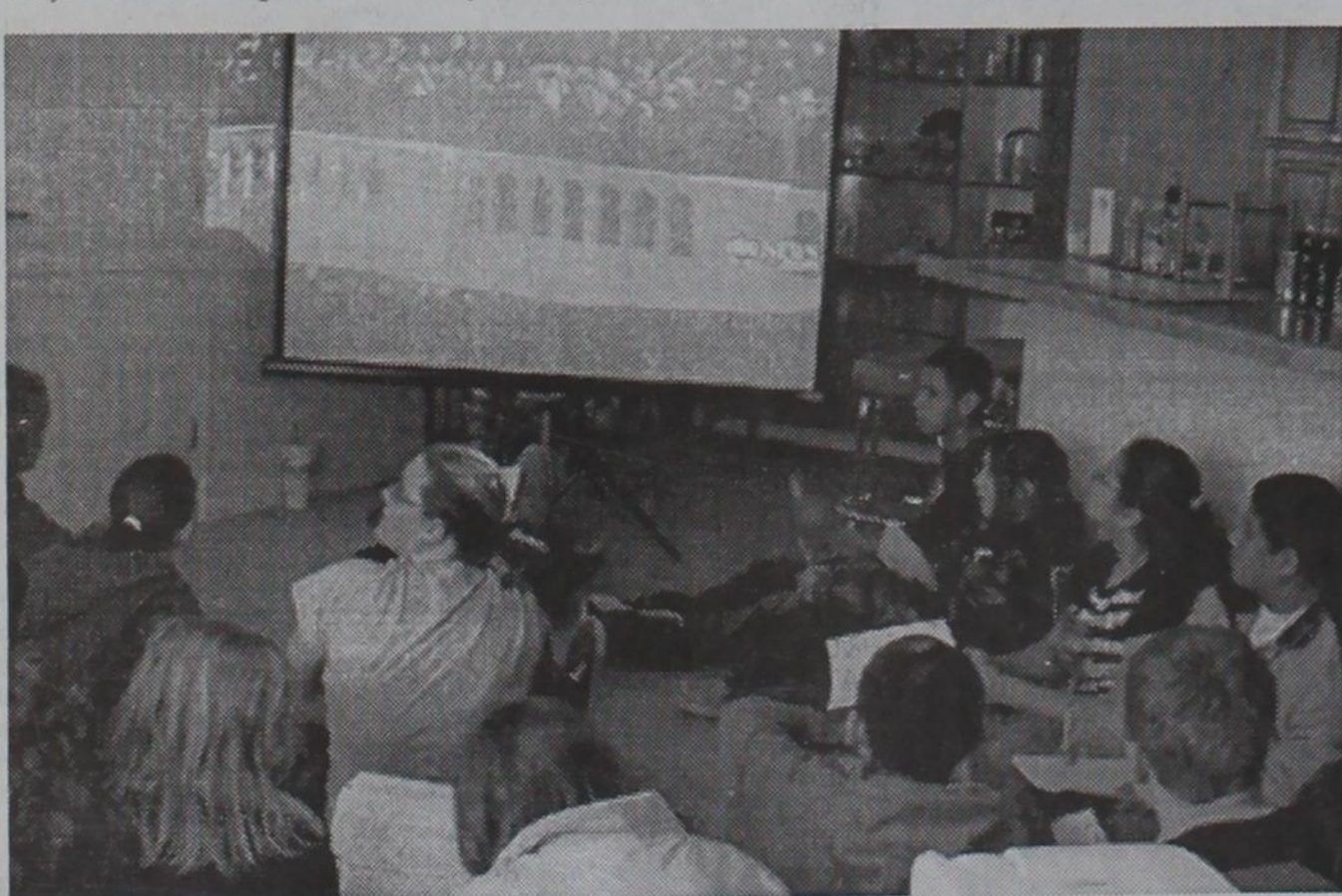

**Burning** (from Page 1)

(A) The initiation of burning shall commence no earlier than one hour after sunrise. Burning shall be completed on the same day not later than one hour before sunset, and shall be attended by a responsible party at all times during the active burn phase when the fire is progressing. In cases where residual fires and/or smoldering objects continue to emit smoke after this time, such areas shall be extinguished if the smoke from the areas has the potential to create a nuisance or traffic hazard condition. In no case shall the extent of the burn area be allowed to increase after this time.

(B) Burning shall not be con-

ducted when surface wind speed is predicted to be less than six miles per hour or greater than 23 miles per hour during the burn period.

(6) Burning shall not be conducted during periods of actual or predicted persistent low-level atmospheric temperature inversions.
