

This means that today there are actually 1,600,000 men women and children cured cancer, although 600,000 not formally be counted until five years from the time

Twenty years ago, only one out of seven who developed cancer was saved. Ten years ago, it was one out of four. Today one out of three. It is estimated that 165,000 Americans will be saved from cancer this year.




