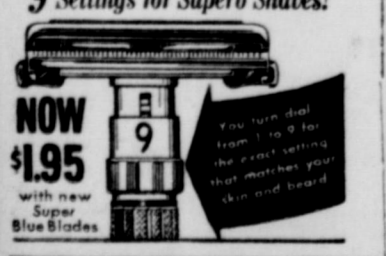

**Twelve Delegates
