ASC Office Gives Planting Deadline

Two announcements of importance to Eastland County farmers who grew peanuts in 1960 and those who didn't grow peanuts in 1960 but want an acreage allotment for 1961 were made today by Emmett Powell, manager of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation office in Eastland.

Powell said farmers who want

new farm peanut acreage allotment for 1961 must file their applications at the ASC office by Feb. 15. The applicant must have had experience growing peanuts in at least two of the past five years.

Marvin Perkins Dies Saturday, Burial Monday

Funeral for Marvin H. Perkins, 73, of Ranger, once president of a now-defunct Clyde Bank, was held at 2 p.m. Monday at Hamner Funeral Home in Eastland.

Officiating was the Revs. Henry Littleton, Baptist minister, and James Campbell and Robert Butler, Methodist ministers. Burial was in Eastland Cemetery.

Mr. Perkins died Saturday afternoon in a Terrill hospital. He was married March 9, 1908, in the Pleasant Grove community north of Eastland. He then moved to Fort Worth where he was employed as a railway mail clerk.

He moved to Clyde in 1919 and became president of the First State Bank. In 1935 he was named secretary of the National Farm Loan Assn. at Clyde.

Mr. Perkins later retired and moved to a farm one mile west of Ranger. Surviving are his wife; a son, Si of El Paso; a daughter, Mrs. Thelma Cowden of Grand Prairie, and several grandchildren.

What Gifts Are Deductible On Tax Return? Certain gifts can be deducted on that Federal income tax return for 1960, Arthur E. Fogie Jr., Administrative Officer, Internal Revenue Service, Abilene, said today.

You can deduct gifts to the Salvation Army, Red Cross, Community Chest, churches, (including assessments,) non-profit schools and hospitals, veterans' organizations, Scouts and non-profit groups primarily engaged in research for cure of certain diseases.

On the other hand, the IRS representative said you "cannot deduct gifts to social clubs, propaganda groups, labor unions, chambers of commerce, relatives, friends, other individuals, political organizations or candidates."

"You can deduct gifts to certain organizations but you cannot deduct dues or other payments to them, for which you get personal benefits.

"For example," he said, "you can deduct gifts to a YMCA but not dues."

The IRS representative advised taxpayers to get full particulars on contributions from the instructions that accompany 1960 tax forms, or from the free IR-5055, "Contributions."

The taxpayer whose signature appears on his tax return is responsible - even if the return is prepared with help from an Internal Revenue Service agent, District Director Ellis Campbell Jr. of Dallas, said today.

"And," he said, "final date for filing that 1960 tax return is April 17."


According to Campbell, community property law in most states gives both husband and wife half of the total income and holding credit each one receives.


