Honolulu.

It is here in the Crater the National Memorial Cemetery is located. In this beautiful setting are war heroes from World Wars I and II and the Korean War. I took a picture of the grave of our own Karl Tanager.

A tour through the pineapple fields with an occasional stop for chilled pineapple strips served from a road-side stand high on the banks. Later a tour through the huge Dole Pineapple plant.

The Pearl Harbor Cruise was a review of history, with its beautiful expanse of land-locked water. Here is located the greatest naval station under the American flag.

The monument of the ship "Arizona" has been completed and stands out to remind us that 1,550 men were on the ship and 1,110 are still entombed within. The flag is raised at sun-up and lowered at sun-down daily.

June 11th was King Kamehameha Day and we attended church on June 10th, a Hawaiian Church where we heard a sermon in Hawaiian an one in English.

My sister and I have a picture of us as we were exiting from this Church.

The Ula Mau Village gives a lesson in the fascinating skills and secrets of ancient Hawaii as we watched the natives weaving, lei making, poi pounding, quilt making, and saw the authentic games of old Hawaii.

The Bishop Museum is the headquarters of the world for Polynesian ethnology and natural history and is located less than two miles from town. The Capitol Palace (the only Palace in the United States) stands within three blocks of the business center of Honolulu.

It is surrounded by the Federal Post Office, the Judiciary Buildings and the Archives Buildings and the Public Library.

In the rear are the National Guard Armory and the old barracks of the days of monarchy. The Library of Hawaii is free and is open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.

The tea houses located far up in the mountains provide a picturesque setting for an exotic meal. One in particular, is managed and operated by the Salvation Army. The tea-room hostess retired after serving twenty years and was bidding farewell to everyone as we left.

Robert Lewis Stevenson's straw thatched shack was one of the attractions of this tea house. Then there was always shopping at the unique shops, and the Waikiki Beach with its palatial hotels, import shops, and hula dancers. Don, the Beach Combers which is called "Dukes" now, and the International Market place which is just that.

We stayed at the Biltmore Hotel in the heart of Waikiki Beach for a few days to get the feel of the Blue Pacific and the "Hawaiian sun."

We were fortunate to be included in a formal invitation to an "Aloha" party aboard the Matson's from 2:30 to 4:30 on Friday the 22nd. Some friends of the Brewsters were leaving after being there four years.

After three weeks in Honolulu we resumed our flight via

the World's Fair en route home.

There we rode the Monorail and ate atop the Space Needle Restaurant. The waitresses are exotic in their tapered Capri pants and jackets of gold and crimson and rust.

We made one complete revolution in one hour. During that time you are guided by "The Eye of the Needle" a colorful cardboard disc which shows you each landmark as you pass it: Queen Ann Hill, Mt. Baker, Lake Union, Capitol Hill, Lake Washington, Beacon Hill, Mt. Rainier, Mt. Adams, Mt. St. Helens, Vashion Island, West Seattle, Elliott Bay, Bainbridge Island, Puget Sound Magnolia District, and Whidbey Island.

A ride through the Fair brings all the world of today and of tomorrow into view. Then over into Canada for a day or two we are home again. It might be summed up!

"SEE . . . SUN . . . SHOP! FFED . . . FUN . . . FLOP!"

I kept a diary, but it has not arrived. It was sent along with other excess baggage via freighter.

This is just what I remember now. I am sure there will be more to tell my pupils next fall and some pictures to show them.

Large Gain Shown By First Federal of Ranger

At the close of business on June 30, the First Federal Savings and Loan Association of Ranger showed a gain in total assets of \$262,619.16, for new all-time total of \$2,328,948.38, according to the 55th Semi-Annual Financial Statement released today. (Continued from page one) tional limitations which are deceptively easy to breach by popular amendment. In effect, each new maximum level of spending immediately becomes a minimum as well, generating the limits. As a result of this policy, welfare programs have renewed pressures for raising not been subjected to careful executive or legislative scrutiny.

Because of the political partiality to public assistance programs keyed to "pensions" or welfare "doles" for large groups of people rather than solving individual problems, a hard core of multi-problem families has emerged — and is steadily growing — which must have specialized, intensive case services if the chain of life-time dependency is ever to be broken.

The League report points out that Public Assistance programs should be aimed at "helping the man in deep trouble — trouble from which he cannot extricate himself through his own resources, or with help from his responsible relatives."

The report continues: "The goal of welfare programs should always be to cure the problems of the individual concerned, if possible, and to return him to self-sufficient citizenship. In other cases, welfare benefits may be necessary to tide a recipient over until he can solve his own problems, or take care of his dependents until they can care for themselves. Finally, welfare programs must maintain those whose problems are incurable and who have not the resources — even from responsible relatives — to care for themselves."

The League report also cautions that "most public assistance programs carry built-in pressures for ignoring the needs of the individual in favor of catering to group demands for increased benefits. From the standpoint of the majority of welfare recipients, their relatives, the people with
