## School Bond Hearing Set For Friday

Hearing of a petition to declare null and void results of the September 8 school bond election in Cisco will be held Friday morning in the 91st District Court, Eastland with Judge Turner Collie presiding.

The hearing, which was postponed from last Tuesday to Wednesday, was delayed Wednesday morning until Friday to give members of the Cisco school board an opportunity to check names on a petition presented them Tuesday night.

Eavis Scarborough of an Abilene law firm will represent Park P. Plambeck, a Cisco stock farmer who filed the suit.

Representing the Cisco school will be W. B. Wright. The school system voted \$7-69,000 in school bonds last September 8 to finance a new high school and improvements for other buildings of the city system. The election carried by a 167-vote margin.
