Anti-Communism Contest Announced for County

"What can I do about Communism?" That's a question that a lot of people ask themselves nowadays.

Believing that many people in this area have some good logical answers to the question, the Eastland Telegram and the Majestic Theater in Eastland have joined in a project to uncover heretofore unrevealed thoughts and ideas on the subject.

It will be in the form of an essay contest and everyone in the county is eligible to participate.

To help define the menace, the theater is inviting city officials, public school and college officials and members of the press from towns in the county, to view an important documentary film Tuesday, Dec. 11th at 10 a.m.

The film is the current, controversial "shot from life" film called "We'll Bury You!" These officials will be asked to encourage participation in the project for "personal ideas", especially among school persons.

Dick Dixon, theater manager, said in announcing the special showing, that he hoped the worthwhile project would offer a valuable stimulating exercise for school students during the holiday vacation. Prizes will be given, based on impartial judging by out-of-county judges.

First-prize winner will receive a new Webster's New School and Office Dictionary, given by the Eastland Telegram, and a 60-day free pass to the Majestic Theater.

Second prize will be a 30-day pass, and honorable mention winners will receive single theater passes. All entries must be post-marked by no later than Dec. 31st, and will be judged on sincerity, originality, neatness and aptness.

They should be brought to the newspaper or theater box office. Based on their knowledge of the Communist threat, and personal convictions of possible remedies, each entrant must complete the following statement in 200 words or less: "To combat Communism in America, I will..."

Winners will be announced in this newspaper and their entries published.

Tentative plans also call for forwarding the winning entries to top government officials and publications.

1.13 Inches Of Rain in November

November is ordinarily a dry month in Eastland—but this past month was below average.

Only 1.13 of an inch fell last month, Official Weather Observer James Smith, reported, compared to the average for the month of 1.67.

The first 16 days were rainless, and only .03 fell on the 17th.

Other rains: .14 on the 20th; .34 on the 21st; .27 on the 24th; .03 on the 26th; and .32 on the 27th. The temperature dropped down to a cool 29 degrees on the 14th—but didn't tarry long because it was back up to a high of 74 the following day. Most temperature lows for the month were in the 40s and 50s with a few in the 30s. Hottest day was the 10th when it got up to 75 degrees.

Brucellosis Testing To Start In County

Testing of cattle for brucellosis will begin in the county soon after January 1 according to Ross Wilson, Gorman, President of the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association. Preliminary plans for the testing will be made at a county-wide mass meeting of producers at the Eastland High School Auditorium on Monday night, December 17, Wilson said. The meeting will begin promptly at 7:30 on that date.

Dr. J. B. Henderson, Coleman, Area Supervisor of the Texas Animal Health Commission, and other officials are expected to attend and appear on the program. Testing of cattle has been completed in Stephens, Callahan and Brown counties and is expected to be finished in Comanche county the latter part of the month. Testing crews are expected to move directly from Comanche to Eastland county.

Local School Bond Election Probably Due in February Preliminary Plans Expected in February

EASTLAND — Voters in Eastland will probably get an opportunity in early February to vote on the proposed bond issue for the construction of a new elementary building and other facilities.

Most plans are tentative as yet, as the school board cautiously picks its way through the maze of details that go with such projects.

The board formally signed a contract with a Dallas investment banking firm Monday night, and heard Morris Dudley, company representative, map proposed financing plans.

Terms of the contract call for the firm to handle details of the bond election, and ensure placement.

The firm will not collect a fee from the school, but will derive their profit from the handling of the bonds. Rate of interest on the bonds will be mutually decided upon at the time of the sale.

Amount and specific types of construction is as yet very indefinite, but Board President M. H. Perry said, "We hope to get the most facilities for the least amount of money. We're hoping to be able to include not only a new 16 teacher unit air conditioned elementary school, but also an agricultural shop building and 'some kind' of new gymnasium facilities to help us with the current state physical education requirements."

"We may have to do some re-vamping as we go along," he added.

Dudley suggested that some \$500,000 may be needed for new construction, as well as some \$50,000 for retirement of old debts.

Actual figures will of course depend on architectural planning and board approval.

Preliminary plans are expected from the Abilene firm of Boone and Pope, sometime in mid or late January.

The Eastland district owes \$94,000 in old bonds and has \$60,000 on deposit for debt retirement, which leaves a debt total of \$34,000.

Dudley suggested that the board use only about \$45,000 of the amount now, and leave \$15,000 on deposit for use as a safeguard for the first year's principal and interest payments on the new bonds.

The firm will also put up \$50,000 (at three per cent) with the district's \$45,000 to call in the old bonds.

Liquidation of the old bonds will permit the district to get out from under the Federal court order, under which they are now operating.

If decided-upon construction costs do go to the \$500,000 figure (and members of the board are still hoping that they don't), the \$50,000 needed for old bonds, could bring the total bond issue for something like \$550,000.

The contract, approved by the board's attorney specifies that the firm will help call the election, study the current financial structure of the district and make plans according; transmit data to the bond company; furnish election supplies; print the bonds; get approval from the state attorney general's office; and other details. The board agreed to sell the bonds to the company at a rate to be decided upon at the time of the sale, to take advantage of the best bond market.

District will pay for advertising for old bonds, and signed an order at the Monday night meeting, to advertise in the national bond-buyer's publication. Speculating on the cost to the district of the \$550,000 issue, Dudley said that about 51 per cent of the current evaluation based on 90 per cent collection would probably be needed.

The current tax rate, as specified by the current court order, is \$1.50 per 100, with \$1. going to maintenance and 50 cents for debt retirement. The tax rate isn't expected to be increased very much, it was pointed out. The district now enjoys a collection record of about 95 per cent, Perry said, and this would help the overall cost picture.

The district could raise the maintenance portion (up to a maximum of \$1.50) under the new financial pattern, but wouldn't necessarily have to, Perry said.

Voters will probably have two propositions on the ballot, Dudley said, and it will be necessary for both to carry in order for the school work to begin.

There will be a "for and against" proposition, to give the district the right to set the maintenance rate, up to \$1.50; and a "for and against" proposal for the sale of bonds, and the agreement to pay the necessary principal and interest, rates to be set yearly.

Eligible voters will be general election-qualified voters who also pay school taxes, Dudley said.

The board also: Agreed that the First Methodist Church be allowed to pay taxes on the Perry property that only for the seven months of the year, it will be occupied in the year.

Heard an audit report from E. C. Johnston, auditor, who reported that budget had been complied with, all money is in place, and nothing out of order.

Agreed to pay Johnston \$50 more for auditing the cafeteria monies yearly. He has received \$400 for the school audit previously.

Agreed to pay Attorney Bill Frost for his legal counsel in the future.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Gladys Bond of Eastland and Mrs. Lela Raspberry of Cisco; seven grandchildren; 21 great-grandchildren and a number of nieces and nephews. Grandsons served as pallbearers for the services.

It's now officially "Eastland Independent School District." Prior to school board action Monday night, the official name was "Eastland Free School Incorporated."

Name was updated to facilitate proposed construction for the school facilities.

It is No. 1 C. E. Phippen, located on a 200-acre lease. Drillsite is 1,320 feet from the south and east lines of TE&L Survey 3171.

The other wildcat is W. C. Cummin of Graham No. 1 B. F. Fonville. It is a proposed 3,300-foot Marble Falls test six miles northeast of Desdemona.

Drillsite is 330 feet from the north and 1,320 feet from the west lines of E. Brown Survey, A-556. It is on a 40-acre lease.

Rules, Regulations For 10th Annual Pecan Show

The 10th annual Eastland County Pecan Show will be held December 14 and 15 at the Joseph Building in Ranger. Sponsoring the show will be the Ranger Chamber of Commerce and the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association.

Rules and regulations include the following: (1) Entries accepted from pecan growers in Eastland and adjoining counties, (2) All pecans entered in the show must have been grown in 1962. (3) All entries of nuts must be entered by 12 noon on Friday morning, Dec. 14th. However they may be sent or left at either the County Agent's office in Eastland, Cisco Chamber of Commerce or Ranger Chamber prior to this time. The building will be open all day December 14th and can be accepted then. Entries should be marked with owners name, variety and the grower's address.

(4) Growers are limited to one entry of each improved or papershell variety. (5) There is no limit on the number of entries of seedling or natives. (6) Nuts must have been

grown by the person showing them. (7) First three place entries of nuts will be sent to Texas A&M College to be entered in the State Pecan show and they will not be returned. (8) Nuts must be left on display until 4 p.m. December 15th. (9) Each entry must consist of enough nuts to fill a quart fruit jar. (10) Best centerpiece using pecans in various forms and other materials such as leaves, etc., prizes of \$5, \$3, \$2 and ribbons.

Classes of nuts to be featured in the show are the following: Burkett, Mahan, Western Schley, Eastern Schley, Texas Prolific, Kincaid, Stuart, Comanche, Success, Barton, Delmas, Curtis, Onliwon, San Saba Improved, Halbert, John Garner, Squirrels Delight, Choctaw, Wichita, Apache, Ranger, Humble, Capers No. 64, Money Maker, McCully, Moore, Named seedling (native), Unnamed seedling (native), Hybrid Pecans (all kinds) Grand Champion entry (any variety) and Reserve Champion entry (any variety).

Eastland Policeman Howard Bradford sold six cows.

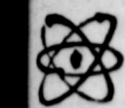

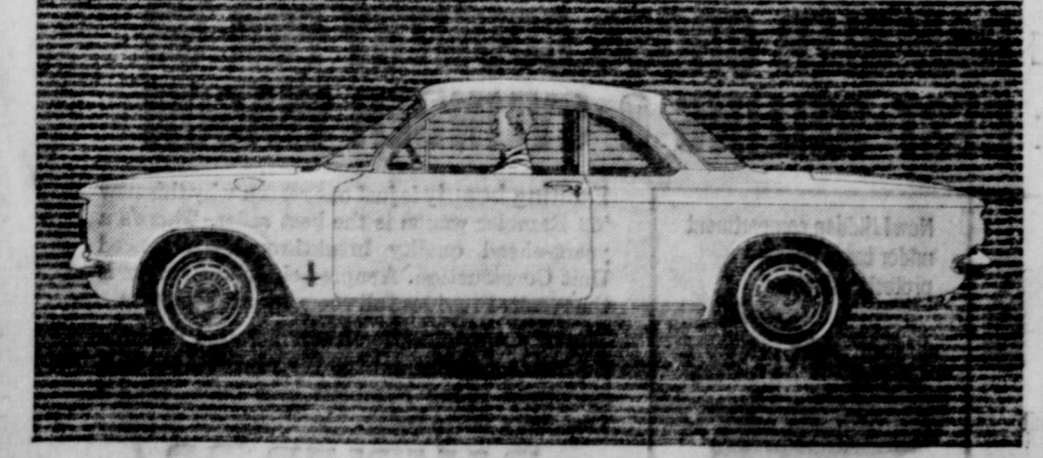
