The three previous elections, all held during the year 1962, were defeated. The first electon, held on June 9, was defeated with a total of 423 for votes and 506 against.

Voters going to the polls again on September 8, decided against the issue by a margin of 28 votes. Negative votes

amounted to 552 with 480 for legalizing the sale.

The third election was held on December 8, with a defeat by 198 votes, the most decisive defeat of the three elections. The vote was 523 to 325.

Petitions asking for the fourth election was turned in to the county clerk's office on Feb. 20. The petitions contained 335 signatures and only 294 qualified signatures were needed.

Polls will open Saturday at a. m. and close at 7 p. m. Absentee voting ended Wednesday at 5 p. m. Calvin Brown is the election judge.






