transmission transfers engine power to the wheels. IF it is out of order, your car may lack pep or chatter and jerk when you shift. Cost of labor alone to disassemble the transmission and repair or adjust damaged parts may range from 10 to 20 for a standard shift. 30 to \$50 for an automatic one. New parts will be extra.

New Shock Absorbers. Hydraulic shock absorbers at each wheel control the rebound of the cars springs. When they are worn or leaking, the car may ride stiffly or bounce a lot. Cost of new shocks—about \$10 per wheel.

Wheel Alignment. When the front wheels don't sit at the right angle to the axle or steering bar, tires may wear irregularly and throw the steering off. Cost of alignment—\$6 to \$8.

Tire Balancing. A tire is out of balance when it is denser at one place along the bottom or sides than other places. As a result, it may wobble or bounce and the steering wheel shimmy at the higher speeds. Small weights distributed around the wheel even out the balance. Cost—\$2 a tire.

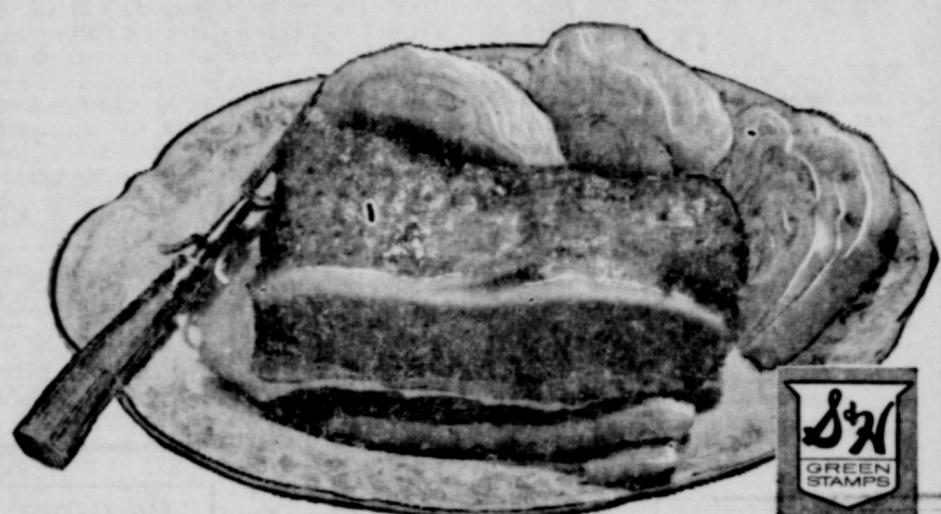



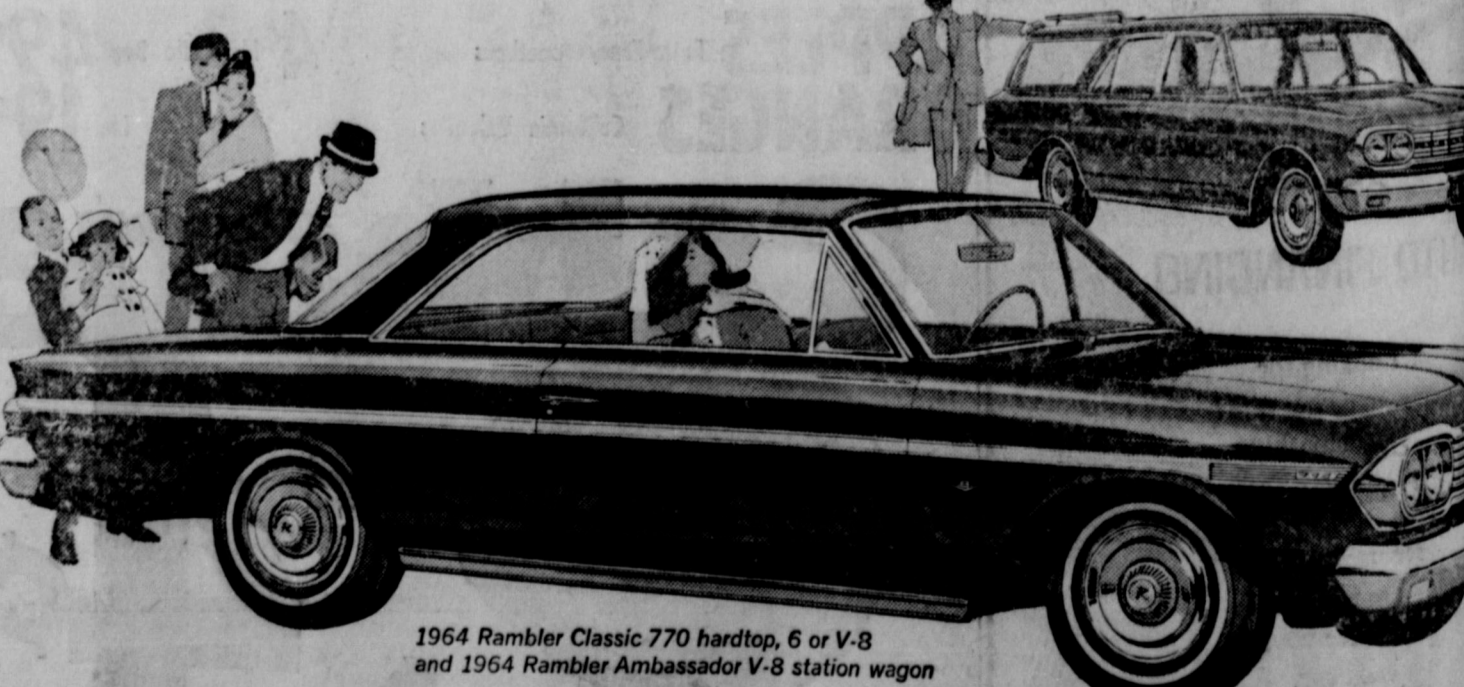

"THE RAPTURE"

The Rapture of the church and the second advent are often confused. The Rapture is when the Lord comes for His saints; all the righteous dead from Adam to our present day are raised, and we are caught up to meet the Lord in the air, while the latter is when he comes with his saints to appear personally on the earth.

Between the two there is an interval of at least seven years, during which time the Old Testament saints and the Church are judged in Heaven and the Marriage Supper of the Lamb takes place.

Cause of much of this confusion is due to the clergy mixing the two coming together. Too often, the minister uses Second Advent Scriptures to preach the Rapture and vice-versa, which ought not to be done unless the speaker makes it clear that he is taking the Scripture out of its setting.

Matthew 24 and 25 should be used only for the second advent of Christ and not the Rapture. These chapters show that Christ is coming immediately after the Tribulation, then shall appear the sign of the Son of Man. The oriental wedding of the ten virgins

was designed to teach watchfulness in view of his second advent. Too many people have used the story in the wrong way and have scared and wounded more people than they have helped. For the benefit of the reader, listed are the following scriptures that deal with the Rapture:

Luke 21:34-36; John 14:1-3; I Corinthians 15:23 and 15:23; I Corinthians 5:1-8; Ephesians 5:27; Philippians 3:11, 20, 21; I Thessalonians 2:19; 3:13; 4:13-17 and 5:9, 23; II Thessalonians 2:1 and 7:8; Colossians 3:4; James 5:7-8; I John 2:28, 3:2 and I Peter 5:4.

When this event transpires, the saints will forever be free from pain, sickness and sorrow, free from a land of poverty. No more suffering, weeping, waiting or threats of atomic war. We shall be in a land of eternal life, peace and joy, far away from the troubles of a sinful world, where all will receive their rewards according to their works.

One good look at Him will a thousand sacrifices repay. His "well done, my child. You are welcome home," will repay us for all our labors; indeed, it is termed correctly by the Apostle Paul as a blessed hope.

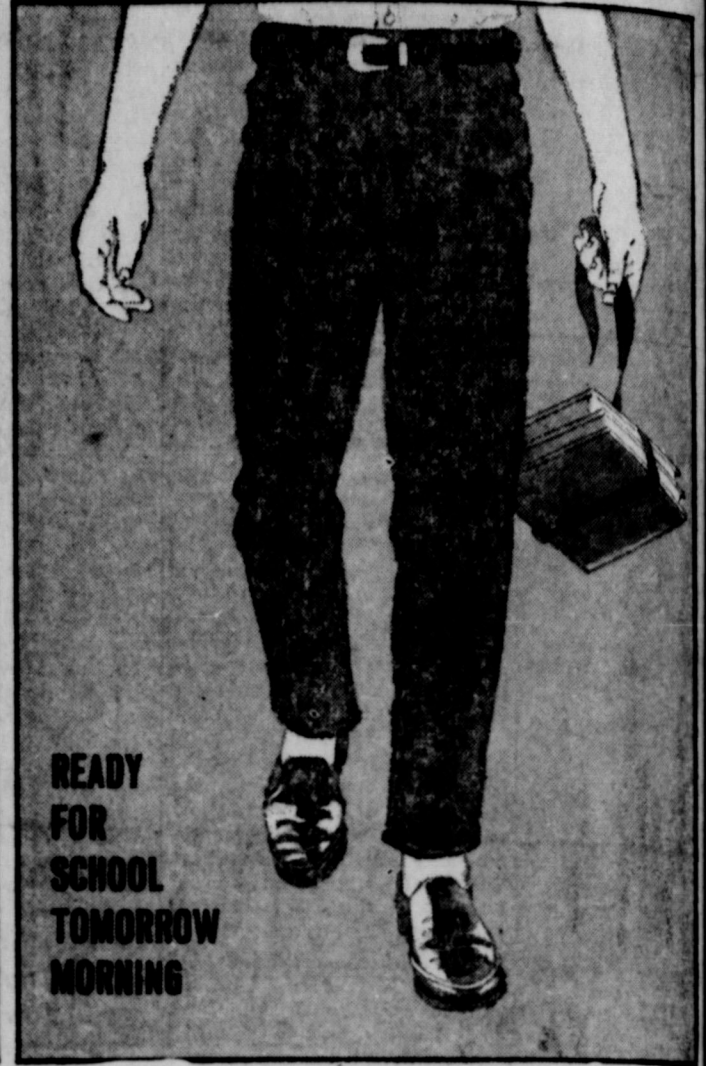
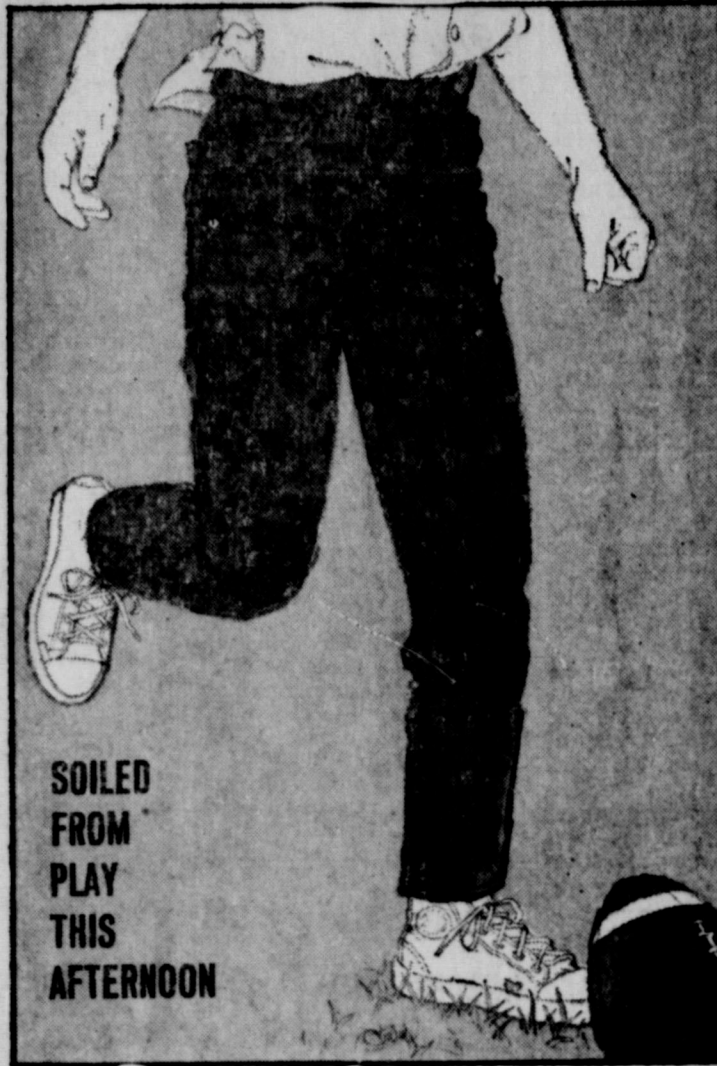

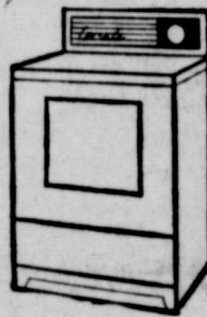
