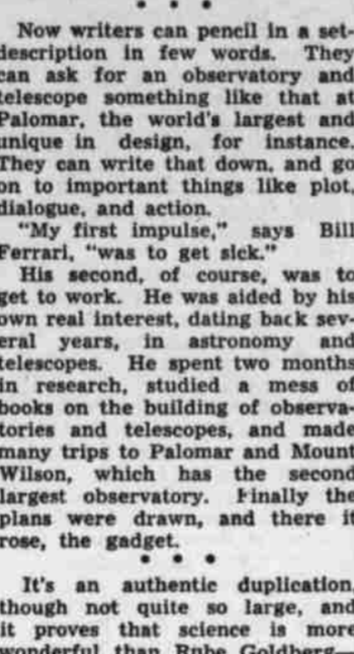
Hollywood Sights And Sounds— 'Heavenly Body' Presents Technical Difficulties

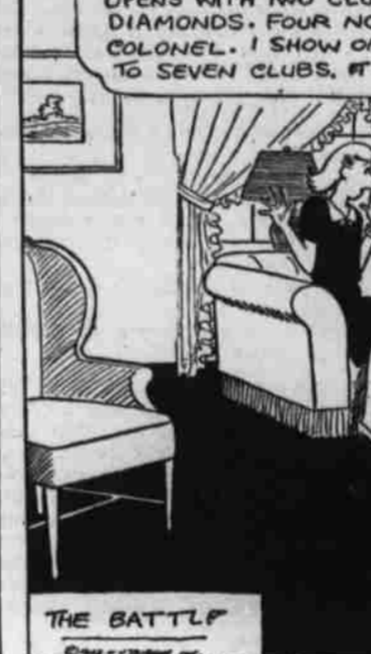

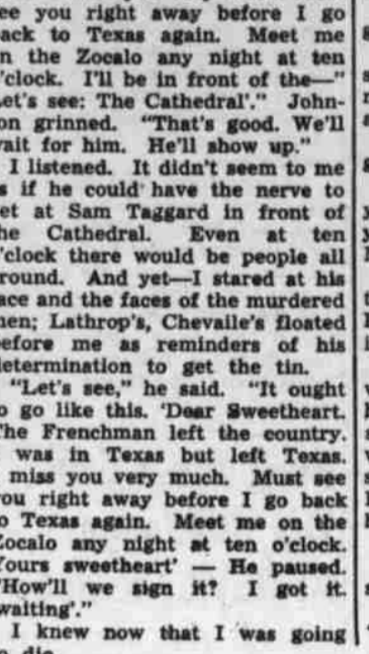

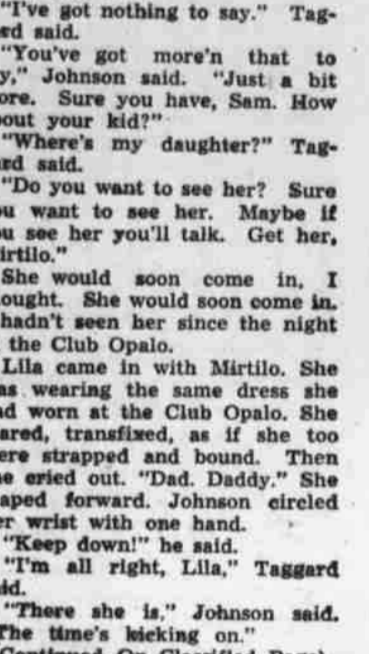
