

MEXICAN NATIONALS GOING HOME.

As for unemployment, 5,000 Mexican nationals have reentered Mexico through Laredo in December. Immigration officials of Mexico declare this to be the record repatriation movement. An average of 173 Mexicans a day re-entered Mexico through Laredo this month and an aggregate of 12,000 Mexicans re-entered Mexico since September, making the return movement the heaviest in history. According to the Laredo Times, those crossing the boundary line at Laredo come from all portions of the United States, representing entire families in most instances. With them they carried household goods and farm implements and all their personal belongings. Many younger members of these families were born in the United States but their parents being nationals of Mexico never became naturalized.

Incidentally, the Times says each year there have been thousands of Mexican nationals returning to Mexico to spend the holidays with relatives or friends, "but this is the first time they are leaving the United States permanently and taking all their belongings with them. Very few are from Laredo or southwest Texas and therefore will not create any labor shortage in this section."

Laredo is one port of entry and departure. There are many ports on the Mexican border line from Brownsville to the Pacific ocean. It did not need the enactment of the Box amendment to the immigration act to compel the return of Mexican nationals to Mexico. They saw the handwriting on the wall. They recognized that economic conditions called for their return to the land of their nativity. Independent oil producers of the southwest are renewing their demand for a tariff of \$1\$ a barrel on foreign crude. During the first eleven months of 1930 the crude production in Venezuela totaled 124,488,093 barrels, a total average of 372,502 compared with 124,397,231 barrels, a daily average of 372,407, in the corresponding period of 1929. It is said the combined output of the Royal Dutch Shell companies in Venezuela during November was 5,133,223 barrels, a daily average of 171,107. Foreign crude is on the free list. Woodrow Wilson placed it there. Harding and Coolidge and Hoover refused to join the movement to take it from the free list. Hence the revolt of the independent oil operators in the oil producing states of the southwest.

READY FOR "RELIEF DISTRIBUTION."

Federal government executives started work Monday toward putting into operation the \$116,000,000 appropriation for public improvements passed by the congress and approved by the president. It is announced the department of agriculture is "moulding its machinery" for dispensing the \$45,000,000 authorized for loans to drouth-stricken farmers in putting out the crops of 1931. Secretary Hyde informed the congress that he did not need the money until after the holiday recess. As for the federal farm relief board, Chairman Legge and his associate members obtained an additional \$150,000,000 after the senate had voiced its criticism of the farm relief program. Chairman Legge's board now has \$400,000,000 of the \$500,000,000 authorized. If there is a large surplus of American wheat in 1931, cheap wheat will again be the order of the hour and Chairman Legge and his co-laborers will have their own worries.




