

And if her progress continues, men have much to fear, for unless there is a marked change on the part of the male an ominous future is in store for him. As a matter of fact the stature of man has not changed much in the last 25 years, his vitality has shown no marked gain and his mentality has not greatly improved.

"I stand for a radical reform in men's attire—even as radical as that made for women."

"MILLIONS OF ANARCHISTS.

There ought to be a better understanding of the situation in China. Too much is made of "Communism" in recent news and comment. That is simply an easy and convenient word used by propagandists there and interpreters elsewhere. No doubt Moscow would like to communize China, and is meddling. But there is no such organized effort as there was a few years ago. Communism is now little more than a rallying cry used by any mob leader or brigand who wants to raise an armed force for slaughter and pillage.

What is called communism, according to Nathaniel Peffer, a well informed journalist writing in the New York Times, is really the opposite of that—anarchy. It is not social law and system but lawlessness and destruction. Men enlist under any banner that promises them food. Fighting, no matter for what, brings them a living.

The melancholy fact is that China is going to pieces. Chinese civilization, as the result of extended civil wars and confusion of ideals, is decaying.

"More than government has broken down," says Peffer. "The whole traditional social system has dissolved. The impetus of disintegration has gathered for 20 years. All the forces which have been preying on China for nearly 50 years have been sapping its foundations, and now the foundations have given way. Any slogan, any appeal, can command a following, if only because hardly anything could be worse than what is. Every traditional discipline in China has disappeared—the discipline of custom, education, family authority, governmental authority. All the controls of a civilization have slipped."

The enlightened and powerful western nations look on and do nothing, or even add to the confusion by making impossible demands of a helpless government and neglecting to give moral support to movements offering a little hope.
