A RISKY STEP FOR COMMUNISM.

One of the most interesting news items of the day is the one that tells of two emissaries of soviet Russia sailing for the United States to arrange with Ford and General Motors for the establishment of American automobile factories in Russia.

Russia, it is said, presents an extremely attractive field for the auto men because, with its population of 150,000,000, it has but 22,000 automobiles and 40,000 tractors.

Both Ford and General Motors are said to have satisfied themselves that Russia is worth taking a chance with. The soviet emissaries now en route to this country are believed to propose a definite plan, whereby American capital and Russian labor could cooperate to establish the automobile industry in the land of the communists.

This, we repeat, is interesting—interesting because of the effect such a step might have on the whole fabric of Russian life.

Nothing that could be done would be much better for the average Russian. And, by the same token, nothing would be more fraught with danger for the leaders of the communist experiment.

In all the world, there are probably not two greater foes of communism than Ford and Sloan, leaders of the two automobile giants. They do not oppose it with words, but with deeds.

TENNESSEE HAS MUSTY LAWS ON STATUTE BOOKS

It's Illegal, For Instance, to Allow Minor to Play Ten Pins.

NASHVILLE, Tenn.—Almost every state has laws on its statute books which time has made obsolete—and ridiculous to the present day way of thinking.

Tennessee, which only recently enacted a law prohibiting the teaching of theory of evolution in public schools, is no exception. It is a debatable subject as to whether time will make this law as obsolete as some still on the books but never enforced.

Anyone with a flair for the old and for the most part forgotten laws may find that a sling shot is illegal and a "dangerous weapon." That fighting a duel is punishable by five years imprisonment, and killing a man a coward for refusing to settle an "affair of honor" is punishable by two years imprisonment.

British War Planes Fail to Aid Americans; One Dead

Native Tribesmen Attack Tourists, Including Ex. U. S. Ambassador and as They Flee, Noted Missionary Is Mortally Wounded.

BASRAH, Iraq, Jan. 22.—Airplanes of the Royal Air force were dispatched to search for Wahabi tribesmen who attacked a party of Americans yesterday, killing the Rev. Henry A. Bilkert.

The planes will make a reconnoitering tour of the desert in the territory about Zubair where tribesmen, believed to number 100, are believed to be in the same territory. Other tribesmen.

LONDON, Jan. 22.—A patrol detachment of the Royal Air force failed to come to the aid of Chas. R. Crane, former United States minister to China, when his party was attacked by Wahabi tribesmen near Zubair, Iraq, the Basrah correspondent of the Daily Mail quoted Crane as saying.

Cran said, according to the Mail's correspondent, that the detachment was seen in the distance, but made no effort to approach when the Rev. Henry Bilkert, missionary of the Dutch Reformed church, was mortally wounded.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Jan. 22 — All seven former holders of the Texas open championship will be on hand next Thursday to tee off on the eighth annual 72-hole tournament to be played on the Brackenridge park course. This is the first time all the former winners have been contestants for the \$6,500 offered in purses.

The list of champions who will make the battle over the tricky Brackenridge layout follows: 1922, Bob McDonald; 1923, Walter Hagen; 1924, Joe Kirkwood; 1925, Joe Turnera; 1926, McDonald Smith; 1927, Bobby Cruickshank, and 1928, Bill Mehlhorn.

With the exception of Turnera, these stars have been participating this winter in Pacific coast tournaments. Turnera is coming from Florida for the event.  
At the beginning of play McDonald Smith has a good chance to be the Texas open favorite. Smith recently bagged the Los Angeles open title and is now in top form. Bill Mehlhorn, present holder of the Texas title, fresh from a new seventy-two hole record score made over the El Paso course, also has been playing consistently good and much be considered seriously.

An eighteen hole amateur-protest ball event will open the activity on Thursday. The pros will take over the course Friday for an eighteen hole qualifying round, with the same dish on Saturday. The low sixty-four and all tying for sixty-fourth place will qualify for the final thirty-six hole round Sunday. Low ball for the seventy-two holes will take first money.  
The champions are beginning to arrive and every train is bringing professionals representing practically every large club in the State, to make their bids for a slice of the prize money.

**Trucks Adapted to All Needs Is Aim**

**PONTIAC, Mich., Jan. 21** — A sensational forward-reaching development, affecting the customary method of rating truck capacities, will soon be announced by the General Motors Truck Company, it was learned here today.  
Paul W. Seiler, president of the company, indicated that an entirely new basis would be established providing exact knowledge, in advance, as to the most efficient payload capacity of any given truck, equipped with any given type of body. "It will clarify the whole situation of a truck buyer's faces when he comes to invest in new equipment — and will make possible much higher efficiency in the operation of trucks," he said.

**Light Duty Trucks**  
Exhibitions of the 1929 light duty series of General Motors Trucks have already opened, or will open shortly, throughout the country, President Seiler stated. These trucks, providing marked increases in power and performance, are powered by the 1929 Pontiac engine.

"This Pontiac-powered light duty series will be offered to the public, described, sold, and fully guaranteed on this clean-cut new basis," he said. "There will be models of seven different basic ratings, as established by the modern method to which I refer. With each, information will be accurate in a new degree. Where bodies of comparatively lighter type are used, such as a stake-job, payload capacity, will be relatively greater

than for the same model equipped with a heavier body, such as a van job.

"A man will be able to invest in equipment exactly suited to the requirements of his work. He will neither have to buy and operate more capacity than he needs — nor will he have to risk the hidden costs and penalties of overloading. His tires equipment will be of precisely determined capacity, known in advance, to give the utmost mileage-economy."

**Third More Horse-Power**  
Outstanding advancements in this light duty series will be increased horse-power without increased tax liability, it was stated performance being from 10 per cent to 30 per cent greater; with actual horse-power increased more than one-third, in the 1929 Pontiac engine.

**New Air Line to Be Established**  
**MEMPHIS, Tenn., Jan. 22** — Aviation officials here have been notified Memphis is to be made a stop on an air line which is to connect Cincinnati and Dallas by way of Louisville, Memphis, Jackson, Miss., and New Orleans.  
The line probably will begin operations within the next three months, the officials were notified.  
The announcement followed consummation of a deal in Chicago whereby the universal aviation company purchased control of the Continental air mail line at a reported price of \$500,000.

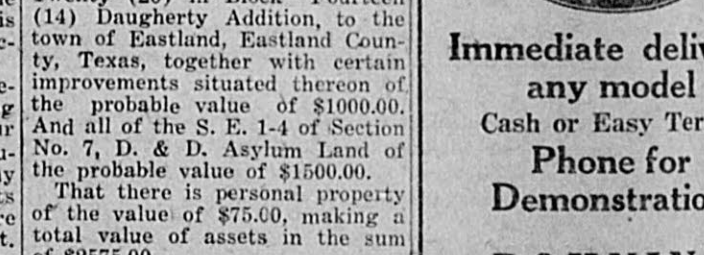

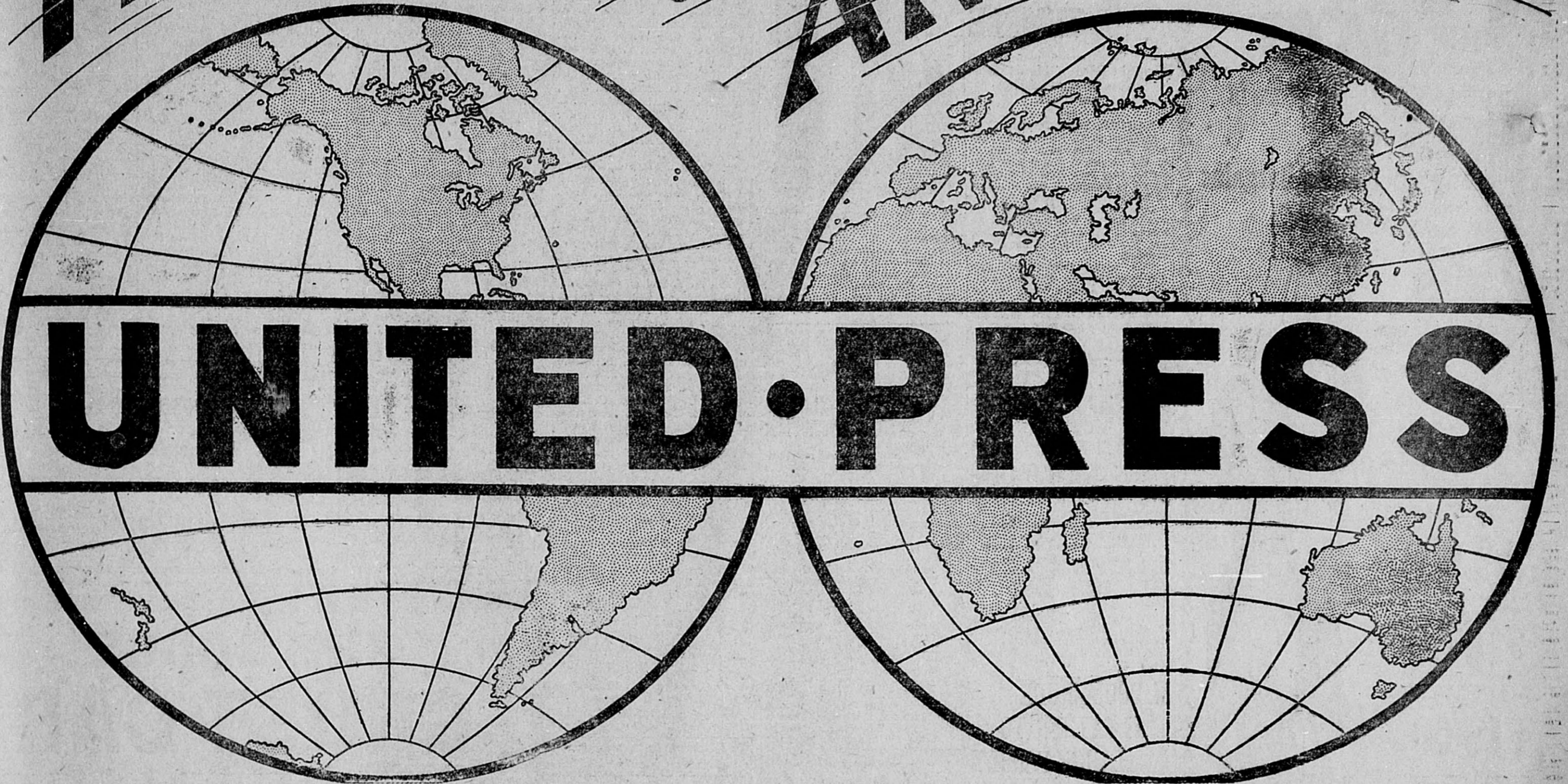

**PARHAM GOES TO TEMPLE**

**Captain Rice of Houston To Take Charge of Ranger Post.**

RANGER, Texas, January 22 — Captain P. C. Parham, and his wife, who have been in charge of the Salvation Army post here for the past year, have been transferred to Temple, it was announced today.

Captain Rice of Austin will arrive in Ranger Wednesday to take charge of the Army work in Ranger. His aide has not been announced.

"We wish," Captain Parham said in making his final public report of the Army's work, "to express our appreciation to the business fraternity and friends of the Army, for their support given to us."

"We have just finished our drive and want to explain just how the money is handled. Some are under the impression all the money goes out of town. There is a campaign expense which goes to Dallas and this is \$150.

**Makes Report**

"We have raised \$750 in cash and \$962.50 in pledges, the total amount being \$1,712.55. "This money is deposited in the Citizens State Bank of Ranger and Walter Harwell, of the Killingsworth-Cox Company, is treasurer. He signs every check that is drawn on the drive money. It is checked out \$80 per month, the balance of the money used in carrying on this work in Ranger is brought in from other towns. This is something like \$125 per month.

**M. DOUMERGUE IS FATHER TO LARGE FAMILY**

By RALPH HEINZEN, United Press Staff Correspondent. PARIS. — France's bachelor president, M. Gaston Doumergue, got his raise.

Although unmarried, M. Doumergue really supports a family of 25, for in France the president must pay out of his own pocket the expenses of maintaining the Elysee, the equivalent of the white house, and must dig still deeper to cover the costs of his personal household.

Parliament took pity on the president and increased his pay to 1,800,000 francs, adding on two supplements of 900,000 francs each for traveling expenses and costs of representing France. But parliament, in the same law, refused to exempt the president's salary from taxes, so he has to hand right back to the tax collectors 624,786 francs.

Even with the raise in pay, it is doubtful if M. Doumergue can stretch his salary to meet his expenses. No president has ever

been known to put anything in the bank from his salary. He has to clothe and feed 25 employees, pay for all diplomatic dinners and state occasions and cotton or artificial silk for every day duties. President Doumergue himself wears home-knit woolen socks.

One of his heaviest burdens is his contribution to charity. No charity drive is complete without a contribution from the president and since he has to set the pace, he must make the contribution a worthy one. Whenever he travels, he leaves behind him with the mayors of towns visited substantial sums for the relief of the poor.

When he entertains he has to pay all the costs. His tastes are those of a gourmet and he feeds his guests lavishly. His state dinners must cost him about \$100 a plate. It costs him nearly \$100 a day to feed his 25 servants and his military household.

President Millerand, his predecessor, had to leave the Elysee on short notice when he lost his power over parliament, Mr. Doumergue made a good bargain when he

bought M. Millerand's wine cellar, for it was well stocked and ranked as one of the best in all Paris. That is one reason why everyone is anxious to be a guest at the Elysee.

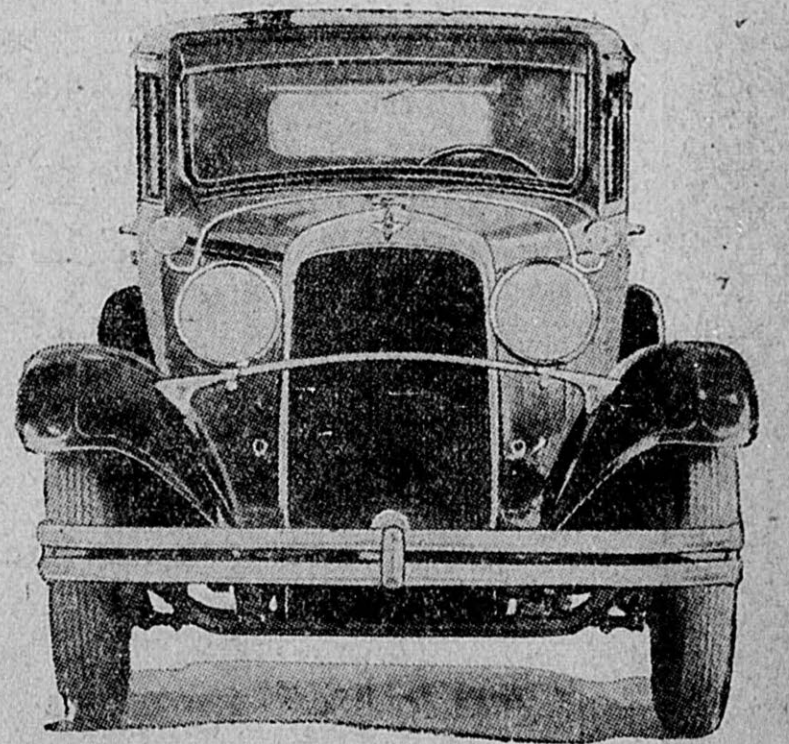

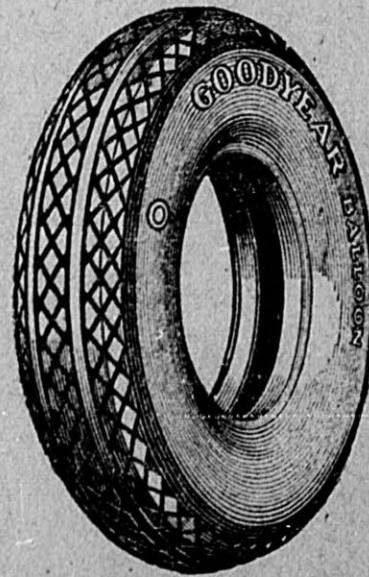
