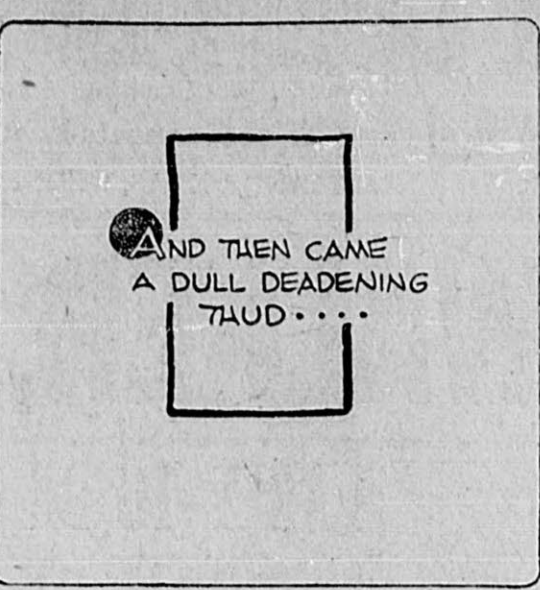

PEACE PACT PASSED; NAVY BILL NOW UP

Kellogg Anti-War Measure Ratified by Senate Vote of 85 to 1.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—Having ratified the Kellogg world wide anti-war treaty, the Senate advanced today to the second step in the administration's legislative program and took up the long delayed House bill proposing 15 new 10,000 ton naval cruisers and an aircraft carrier for national defense.
