The ruling of the New York Boxing Commission that sparring partners of the principals in an important championship fight cannot appear in the preliminaries on the big card may be an injustice to the men who sacrifice themselves in a thankless job, but it is no hardship on the customers.

Because it had become the custom to clutter up the preliminary card with catchers from each of the two camps the spectacle that the customers had to sit through, waiting for the main go were things horrible and terrible to behold.

The chance offered to get on the championship card and earn a purse larger than they could get at a smaller club for a harder fight no doubt helped the champions and the challengers get sparring partners, and some of the employers took advantage of it by paying the men very little and asking them to consider their purse money as a part of their salary.

The new ruling of the commission brought about a situation that is not hard to meet. And Mr. Tunney met it without a moment's consideration when he told his men that he would give them as bonus the amount they were to receive for appearing on the card. And when Mr. Tunney pays them they will not have to cut up any of their purse money with the fixers, who demanded a fee for getting boxers into important shows.

The sudden display of industry shown by the Chicago White Sox after Ray Schalk had stepped out of the management and Lem Blackburne had taken his place can be explained easily—Blackburne says.

"When they told me I was the manager I got the bunch together in the club house and told them what they had to do or else," Blackburne said. And apparently they haven't been eluding.

Ask the Democrats.

### WOMEN BIDDING FOR PLACE ON FRENCH BOURSE

Suffrage in Finance Center Likely to Be Granted Within Two Months.

PARIS.—Within the next few months French women probably will be brought into a position of equality in suffrage and office-holding matters that will open to them the doors of the Bourse.

The feminine sex for more than two centuries has been told to stay in her kitchens and her salons and leave the financial affairs of the nation to men. French "Pankhursts" have at times attempted to crash the gates, only to find a triple barrier of municipal guards and police lined up to inform them that it couldn't be done. The law was strengthened in Napoleonic days to the extent of authorizing the use of armed force in ejecting all undesirable from the sacred precincts of Moneydom.

But the chamber of deputies already has voted the feminine suffrage bill, and although there is still some hesitancy among the more conservative and staid Senators, there is every reason to believe that France will follow the example of other nations during the winter parliamentary session.

This will open a new field of activity for women, just as the admission of women to the bar, which dates back less than 20 years, brought a new element into French life. Several of the national universities and colleges are studying the problem, with a view to instituting courses in banking and other branches of economic. And the Bourse itself is transferring some of its departments to adjoining buildings in order to permit the increase in the size of the great hall where the daily operations are carried out.

### BORROWS MONEY FROM OFFICER FOR BUSINESS

But His Business Proves To Be Counterfeiting—Is Caught By Lender

PHILADELPHIA.—Capt. William H. Houghton, chief of Secret Service here, loaned a dollar to Joseph Smith, negro, little realizing that he was providing capital for a daring counterfeiting operation.

Houghton's loan started him on a search of five months, finally resulting in the capture of Smith after he had made on an average of \$500 a month by raising the amount of \$5 bills. Complaints poured in and Houghton recognized Smith's handwriting but the counterfeiter eluded him until recently.

Smith has served two terms at the Federal penitentiary at Atlanta. As Houghton was responsible for the incarceration he made the loan on Smith's release from his second sentence.

### Family Menu

By SISTER MARY.  
Breakfast—Fresh pink plums, cereal cooked with figs, cream, broiled fresh fish, watercress, whole wheat rolls (reheated), milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Iced tomato bouillon, crisp crackers, molded egg salad, graham bread, cream puffs, milk, tea.

Dinner—Baked and stuffed bluefish, steamed potatoes, new beans in orange sauce, peach pie, milk, coffee.

When potatoes are steamed tender dip each one in melted butter and roll in minced parsley. Scrub thoroughly and steam in their "jackets."

Molded Egg Salad could be used successfully for a one-plate luncheon.

Molded Egg Salad.  
Four eggs, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-8 teaspoon pepper, 1-8 teaspoon mustard, 2 tablespoons melted butter, 1 tablespoon lemon juice or vinegar, 2 large tomatoes, mayonnaise, lettuce.

Put eggs into 4 cups cold water and bring to the boiling point. Reduce heat and cook for 30 minutes just below the boiling point. Plunge at once into cold water and when slightly cool remove shells.

Force whites and yolks through a potato ricer. Season with salt, pepper, and mustard thoroughly mixed and sifted, melted butter and lemon juice. Pack firmly into a straight tumbler or jelly glass. Chill for several hours. When ready to serve run a thin bladed knife or spatula around inside of the glass and remove the egg mixture whole. Cut in four slices. Peel and chill tomatoes and cut in halves. Place each half on a nest of lettuce, cover with a slice of egg and drop a spoonful of mayonnaise on top.

SUPERSTITION WORKS

### Seeking To Learn Roman Method of Heating Water In Swimming Pool

LONDON.—Hidden close to the Old Watch House, of St. Clement Danes Parish, within 50 yards of the Strand, one of the busiest thoroughfares in the world, is the ancient Roman bath, a pool fed by perennial springs, where Charles Dickens as a boy took an occasional plunge after finishing his summer day's work in the nearby boot and shoe polish shop. He has mentioned it in "David Copperfield," George Borrow, author of "The Bible in Spain," and also used to enjoy its cooling depths.

And now the archaeologists are planning to explore the sand and gravel surrounding the old relic, built about the time of the Emperor Hadrian in 117-138 A. D., in the hope of ascertaining a trade secret of two, perhaps, of the primitive Roman artisan, 18 centuries ago, who today would be called a "plumber." First they will seek further light on how the Romans constructed water conduits and pipes, and secondly how they heated cold water for the London swimming pool.

The Rev. W. Pennington-Pickford, rector of St. Clement Danes the original church of which was built by the Danes in 900 A. D. and which was rebuilt by Wren in 1682, who acquired the bath to preserve it for posterity, is raising a 2,000 pound excavation fund.

It is expected that underground in the rear of the bath, will be found the heating device employed to raise the temperature of the water, which still bubbles into the pool with crystal clearness, as it did so long ago. London once was as famous as "spa" at Harrogate, Vichy and Baden-Baden are today. It was abundantly supplied with springs, wells and brooks which ran into the Thames, along whose banks were beautiful gardens, trees and

shrubs. For years, as Pepys tells us, "many do go travelling up and down ye river," which was then almost as popular a highway as the modern Great West Road.
