



### Texas Pilot Has Many Experiences In Mexican Army

BY UNITED PRESS
HOUSTON, Tex., June 11—Roy Butler, curley-headed 22 year old Texas aviator, who was sentenced to death in Mexico for refusing to shoot down a buddy in an enemy plane, passed through Houston to-day, on his way to China where he's going to try his hand at wartime flying again.

"They're having some trouble there, and I guess I'll try to line up a job," he said. "A good wartime pilot always can get work even if it's plenty tough trying to get paid for it."

Roy Butler, whose home is in Jefferson City, Tex., flew for the Mexican federal troops in the recent revolution.

He was shot down by the rebels led by General Escobar, however, and as he had been paid for only three days, at \$125 a day, in the two months he had served the federals, he accepted a rebel offer to fly for them.

On April 5, 1929, while flying with a Mexican officer, he ran across a plane piloted by "Buzz" Morrisson, his buddy, who still was with the federal troops.

He refused to open fire, as did "Buzz" They circled each other and returned to their own camps.
