

WASHINGTON. — Almost a quarter of a billion dollars still is owed the United States by Germany for expenses of the American army of occupation after the war, General Roderick L. Carmichael, chief of finance, said in his annual report to Secretary of War Davis made public recently. The balance due this country June 30, 1928, was \$233,141,247.42 and this aum has been reduced by subsequent payments to \$310,582,775.85.

The army bank maintained for the receipt of soldiers' deposits contained \$2,021,900.43 on June 30, 1928, and the average deposit amounted to \$253.
