12,000 Homeless, Two Killed As Mt. Etna Continues To Erupt.

CATANCIA, Sicily, Nov. 9.—The devastating eruption of Mount Etra continued unabated at the source today and millions of lirae had been done in the peaceful valleys that lie at the slopes of the mountain side.

Full realization of the wrath of the great crater became known when Professor Gaetano Ponte, diector of the observatory for the lcano, flew over the crater.


