WORCHESTER, Mass., Nov. 6.

Nearly 60 were injured, 10 seriously enough to require hospital treatment here last night when a Republican election ever parade ended in rioting.

Several thousand spectators, some armed with sticks and bricks, charged into the ranks of the 10,000 marchers and a free-ior-all battle ensued.

Elderly eggs, decayed fruit and bottles were hurled, signs were torn from business establishments for use as weapons and oil was

torn from business establishments for use as weapons and oil was thrown from the top of a nearby ciff on to the battlers below.

Trouble had been anticipated and 400 polcemen were on duty, but it was nearly three hours before order was restored.

Mrs. Frank B. Hall, wife of a member of the Republican state committee, was pulled from her pace in the parade and manhandled by hecklers.

Several girls were dragged from a float and their clothing torn. Another marcher, Mrs. Josephine Byrd, was blowing a horn when a heckler showed it down her throat. In her excitement, she swallowed the horn's wooden mouthpiece.


