



Highlights HEATLY CUT OFF—The Constitutional Convention Compensation Committee

Sidelights served notice it didn't intend to allow Rep. W.S. (Bill) AUSTIN, Tex. - Constitu-

tional Convention delegates approved a new approach to state revenue raising and sent delegates' hopes rising for a painless tax source. The Convention authorized

legislature to levy a petroleum products manufac-turing tax that will not (like three-fourths of gasoline taxes) go into highway build-

Sen. D. Roy Harrington of Port Arthur already is preparing for introduction next year a bill to impose a two cents per gallon gasoline tax at the refinery level.

At the same time, Harrington will propose reduction of the gasoline tax at the pump from five to three cents a gallon if the new constitution is approved.

ince 75 per cent of Texasrefined gasoline is sold out of state, proponents of the tax claim the two cent levy would raise \$686 million in additional revenue without increasing the burden on Texans.

Although such a tax probably could be levied now, most of the money would go to highways instead of general revenue.

The convention went into its windup stages this week. Delegates began voting on the entire revision package, including proposed separate submissions of five alterna-

tive propositions. When and if a two-thirds majority is mustered, the document and the "side issues" will go to the voters in the November general elec-
