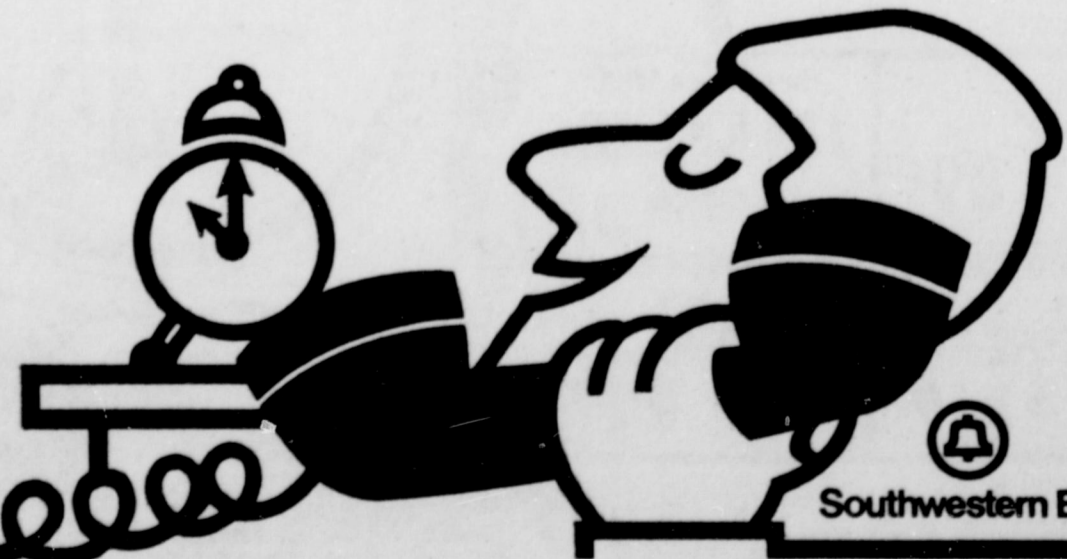

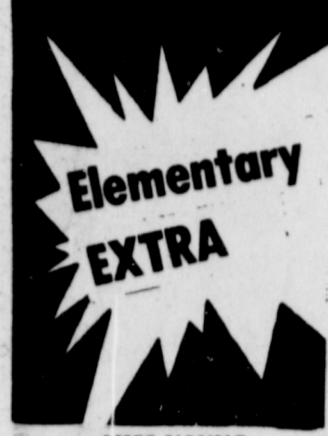

## First Race Of Season

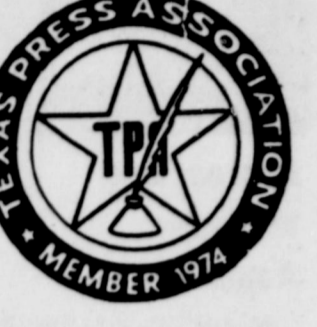
