



# **Thanksgiving Text**

"THE WAY OF THE PILGRIM" By Steven M. Church Thanksgiving Sermon

We are a pilgrim people. Our heritage is rooted in a pilgrim style of life. The Judaeo -Christian faith is a pilgrim movement.

Remember God speaking to Abraham at the dawn of recorded history: "Get out of this land, follow me, and I will show you another land that you shall receive as an inheritance and, through you, all the people of thw world shall be blessed." A writer, many centuries later, records the dispatch with which Abraham responded to God's call: "He went out, not knowing where he was to go." In a sense Abraham is the spiritual father of all of us who see to live by faith in God.

The quality of our natiional day of Thanksgiving changes with circumstances, as indeed it should. Our conventional, and composite, image of the first Thanksgiving day is that of a few hardy pilgrims - - thankful that they had survived disease that had taken half their number, that the summer had brought their corn crop in, that game was plentiful, and that their scalps were still intact! They as a result gave praise to their Maker, and topped it all with a huge carry - in Texas barbecue with their more friendly Indian neighbors.

However, times change and similarly so does the quality of our Thanksgivings. This is the era of nostalgia. Some live in the past in dress. Some live in the past in song. And some just live in the past. Our one time "Rest and Be Thankful" motif now shows broken signs of just resting. We sit back to watch the Thanksgiving Day Football games with soda in one hand and some fresh roasted peanuts in the other, and like a bear settling down for its long winter nap, neglect the original with which our spirit forefathers established a Thanks and Giving Day. Though I am not advocating that we forego the conveniences of our 20th century society, I am saying we should re - examine some of the 'life giving styles' of our pilgrim forefathers. For you see they like Abraham, went out, not knowing exactly where they were going, in search of a New

I am grateful, at least, that of the pilgrim. The question that is ours here and now is -Can we? If so, our gratitude needs to be more than mere sentiment or boastful pride; we need to seek out active participation in the meaning of being a pilgrim in our community life and in our personal lives. So if you will allow me to puncture your inflated Turkey minds and challenge you, I'd like to offer three styles of the way of the pilgrim.

The pilgrim style of life, first of all, is a walking by faith and not by sight. It is to move from security to risk. It is to leave the known to explore the unknown. It is to be pioneers in our own right. This style cannot be depicted more accurately than in the writer's description of A Abraham's response: "He went out, not

knowing where he was to go." Perhaps this may seem at first in support of the already overworked expression of 'doing your own thing'. And we are quick to note those who step to the beat of a different drummer. But there are always those of us who ridicule the Christopher Columbuses, the George Washingtons, the Thomas Edisons in every generation.

I can imagine the consternation of some of Abraham's neighbors when they saw the "For Sale" sign on his property. They would have asked the old patriarch where he was moving, and all he could say was: "I don't know. God is calling me and my people to a new land. We trust him to show us the way." I see those neighbors looking at one another, as if tosay "Poor Abraham, in his old age, he's blown his mind!"

You see Abraham and all pilgrims see God as a catalyst agent in their lives. This is the difference between the God of the philosophers and the God we meet in Holy Scripture. You can seek God out, and encounter him, and walk in His light, but you can never sit down and analyze Him as if he were appearing before a Senate hearing committee. Rather God, and Christ, and the Holy Spirit moves about us, and unless we are to become lost on the pathway of life, we best



discontent. They are always taking up their tents, moving on, going to a new place of obedience. The Southern cavalry general, Nathan Bedford Forrest, once was asked the location of his headquarters. He replied that his headquarters were wherever his hindquarters were. This is an appropriate reply for a person who rides "wild horses" and yet is obedient to a living God.

Our predicament is illustrated in the experience of two men who were living on a houseboat. One night, while the men were sleeping, the boat broke loose from its mooring and drifted into the open sea. One of the men got up in the morning before his mate, and, going out on deck, noticed there was no land in sight anywhere. Excitedly, hecalled out to his mate: "Joe, get up quick; we ain't here any more!"

What changes take place, as if overnight, f for all of us pilgrims. It is as if we were the chicken who kept laying eggs she could appreciate her product, it had left her. And times have changed even since last Thanksgiving. Within the last year we have learned that we can no longer take either steak or gasoline for granted. Nor clean water. Nor clean air. nor docile neighbors. Nor honest government. Nor economic growth predicated on unlimited human capacity to consume unlimited natural resources. And our technology looks as much like a part of the problem as a part of the an-

Is there not a sense in which crisis is as much a part of the Biblical pilgrims as a shepherd's staff? As one portion of the Scriptures read: "There lies the crisis: 'the light has come into the world" (John 3:19). "Fear of crisis demonstrates lack of faith and, what is worse, lack of hope. It is the crises that testify to us as pilgrims the need for new departures. The tents have to be folded up again, so the iilgrimage through life continues.

There are those warning that, instead of embracing a tent theology, we are possessed by a cathedral psychology, and edifice complex. The institutions of society have become ends in themselves. Their preservation is more important than the cause that gave them birth. Do you not see the need of a tent theology for all spheres of life?

To embrace the pilgrim way is to be open and flexible to what God is doing in the here and - now f of our everyday. The past needs to be a guidepost rather than a hitching post. The one who gets hurt is the one who gets stalled. As the late John F. Kennedy

once put it: "If we make

processed. It is lawful for a hunter to process a deer in camp as long as he keeps the proper tag from his hunting license, the proper antlerless permit or antlerless tag with the processed meat until such meat is delivered to a

commercial locker plant or the residence of the person killing the deer.

Purpose of these regulations, according to the Parks and Wildlife Department, is to insure that all legally taken deer can be identified by game wardens and still permit a person to properly care for the meat thereby insuring some fine steaks, roasts, chili and sausage during the coming


Chihuahua is a city of 280,000 people, was founded in 1709, is the capital of the state of Chihuahua.





# **Identical** twins. Except one cost 25% more to deliver.

In November, 1971, the first unit of the lignite coal-fired Big Brown generating plant near Fairfield began producing electricity.

It added 575,000 kilowatts of power to the generating capability of Texas Electric and two other electric utility companies who cooperated in building the plant.

The first unit of the new lignite-fired Monticello plant will become operational in 1974. It duplicates the first unit at Big Brown, right down to the last kilowatt.

But there'll be one major difference the cost. Equipment for the Monticello unit was ordered only three years after Big Brown. But during that period the cost of the same equipment had increased 25%.

We need these new lignite plants because supplies of natural gas and oil, our traditional boiler fuels, are becoming increasingly difficult to obtain.

To diversify our fuels even further, we're planning to have our first nuclear power plant, near Glen Rose, operational by the

Unfortunately, lignite plants now cost about twice as much as traditional gas/oilfired plants. Nuclear plants cost more than three times as much.

But, clearly, we have to build them if we are going to meet the increasing needs for electricity. We must spend \$230 million on new construction in the next two years alone.

We're working to supply the electricity you need, but it's costing more to make it all the time.
