Pioneer Resident Publishes

PASSING DREAMS of H.A. McCanlies.

That's the title of an attractive hard-bound book that was issued last week in a limited edition. It is a collection of poems written by Mr. McCanlies, pioneer resident of Cisco and Eastland County.

The foreword gives the reader an idea about the book. It says: "I have no excuse for writing this book... as it's nothing but doggerel. You will find when you look... You'll find nothing of importance... When you look through... But I just wrote it... 'cause I wanted to... H.A. McCanlies."

The book contains a dozen or more poems from Mr. McCanlies' pen, mostly written in the past year or two. Many of them has the author looking in retrospect at something or someone that made a lasting impression on him in the years gone by.

The titles of some of the poems include these: Passing Dreams, Along Life's Way, Some Are Sad, Some Are Gay, In Search of Goals, Near and Apart, Great Worthy Roles, Dear to Our Heart, Reaching for Harmony, Each Day to Day, Along Life's Journey, May We Always Display Sportsmanship Along the way.

You will note that the first letters of each title spell out "Passing Dreams", the book's name, when you look at them

one under the other.

Now in his 89th year, Mr. McCanlies grew up on the old Latch farm just west of Cisco. A member of a big family, his formal education was limited to a few years in grade school. His experience in business as a very young man impressed on him the value of education, so he enrolled in a business college. He was an avid reader and student many of the years of his life, most of the time pursuing studies at home in the evenings.

After working for retail stores and in banks, Mr. McCanlies went into railroading and spent the bulk of his business life with American Railway Express. Since his life span reaches back into the last century, Mr. McCanlies can be regarded as a real pioneer. He remembers Indian activities, early railroad building, the famous 1893 cyclone that wrecked Cisco, and the oil boom days. He was present that day when Old Rip was freed from the old Eastland Courthouse Cornerstone, and he saw numerous events important in the county's history.

Writing has long interested Mr. McCanlies. One friend says that he comes by writing honestly for he has two daughters -- Mrs. Argie M. Briggs and Mrs. Joe Cook -- who are well known writers. He recently wrote a personal

The Eastland County Pecan Show and Pecan Bake Show opens tomorrow for the Twentieth consecutive year. Pecan exhibits and baked goods will be on display in the Eastland County Courthouse, first floor lobby.

All exhibits will be on display after 12 noon Friday. The pecan baked goods will include pies, cakes, candy, nut bread and cookies. They must be entered by 11:00 a.m. Friday. The

centerpiece arrangements are also due to be entered by 11:00 a.m. Judging of the baked goods and centerpiece arrangements will begin at 11:00 a.m.

Growers are encouraged to enter pecans exhibits Thursday or early Friday, but may enter anytime before 12:00 noon Friday. Pecans will be judged at 3:00 p.m. Friday.

Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent, says the best

time to see the food exhibits will be Friday afternoon. All baked goods on exhibit will be sold. Anyone wishing to make a purchase may buy the items Friday afternoon and pick up their purchase at 5:00 p.m. Friday.

County Agent De Gordon says visitors may see the pecan exhibits anytime Friday afternoon or Saturday morning. Ribbons will be placed on the exhibits after the judging or about 5:00 p.m. Friday.

Saturday morning would be a good time to see the pecan exhibits and the results of the show Gordon said.

Pecans will be sold anytime during the pecan show. After the show is completed at noon Saturday the pecans on exhibit, both in-shell and shelled, will be sold.

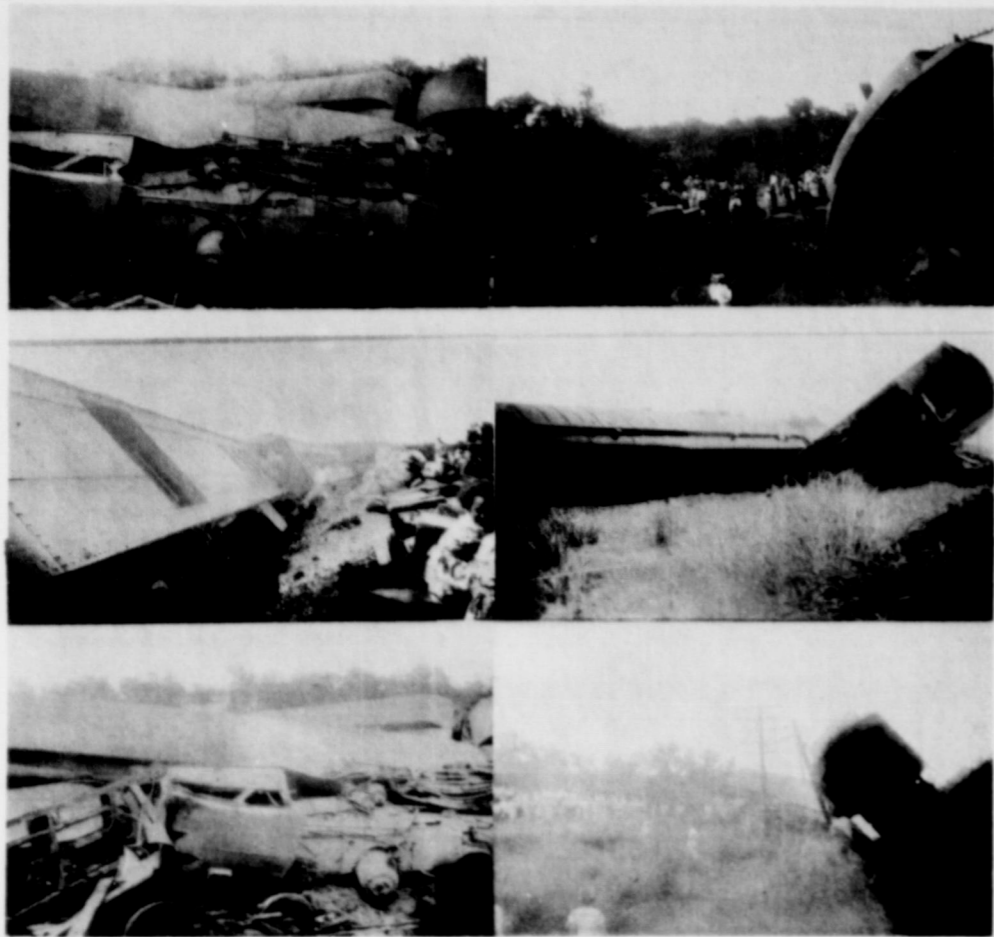

Community Shelter Plan Complete For Countians

Eastland County Judge Scott Bailey announced today that work has been completed on a Community Shelter Plan for residents of Eastland County. The results of the planning effort, designed to provide all county residents with information necessary for survival in the event of a nuclear attack upon the United States, is being distributed to residents of the county.

The Community Fallout Shelter Plan will be distributed as a supplement to the "Cisco Press", the "Eastland Telegram", the "Ranger

Times", the "Rising Star" and the "Gorman Progress". Subscribers or those persons who purchase one of the papers on that day will receive a copy of the Community Shelter Plan with their paper.

The plan, developed at the request of local officials, is the result of a study conducted by members of the Eastland County civil defense office in cooperation with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the State Office of Defense and Disaster Relief. Funds for this undertaking were provided by the Federal Government.

The primary danger to residents of Eastland County resulting from a nuclear attack on this country would be from radioactive particles descending from the upper atmosphere and settling over the country after having been carried by high altitude wind currents. The radiation emitted by these particles can penetrate the average building and cause serious illness or death to the occupants.

Because this type of radiation decays or weakens with time, it is possible for persons who are protected from the early, in-

tense radiation to survive with little or no ill effects. The goal of the recently completed Community Shelter Plan is to assure that everyone in Eastland County would have this type of protection if an attack occurred.

The county is fortunate in having enough space to shelter everyone in the county, but this shelter is of no value unless people know where it is. "If we received an attack warning," Judge Bailey explained, "we believe we would have about one hour to gather food, clothing and other supplies and get to a shelter before fallout arrived. Most people would never make it unless they knew what to do and where to go. There is enough space to shelter everyone in the county, but this plan will not work if too

many people try to get into the same building."

The Community Shelter Plan for Eastland County contains instructions and maps telling each citizen what to do in case of attack and which building he should go to for shelter. If you do not receive a copy of the plan during the initial distribution you may obtain one by contacting the County Judge's office in the Eastland County Courthouse.

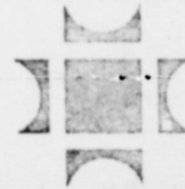

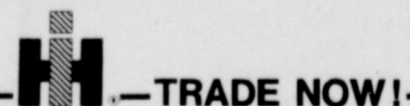
