NORTH OF Eastland lies one of the world's prettiest little lakes. Its name is Ringling, and it certainly has a history - and if things work just right, it could have an even brighter future. Eastland Jaycees have done an outstanding job of cleaning and sprucing it up - it needs more of the same from many sources.

How to find Ringling Lake? Go out the Breckenridge Highway and turn left (west) at the last east-west street (Ringling Road) and keep going. It's worth the look.

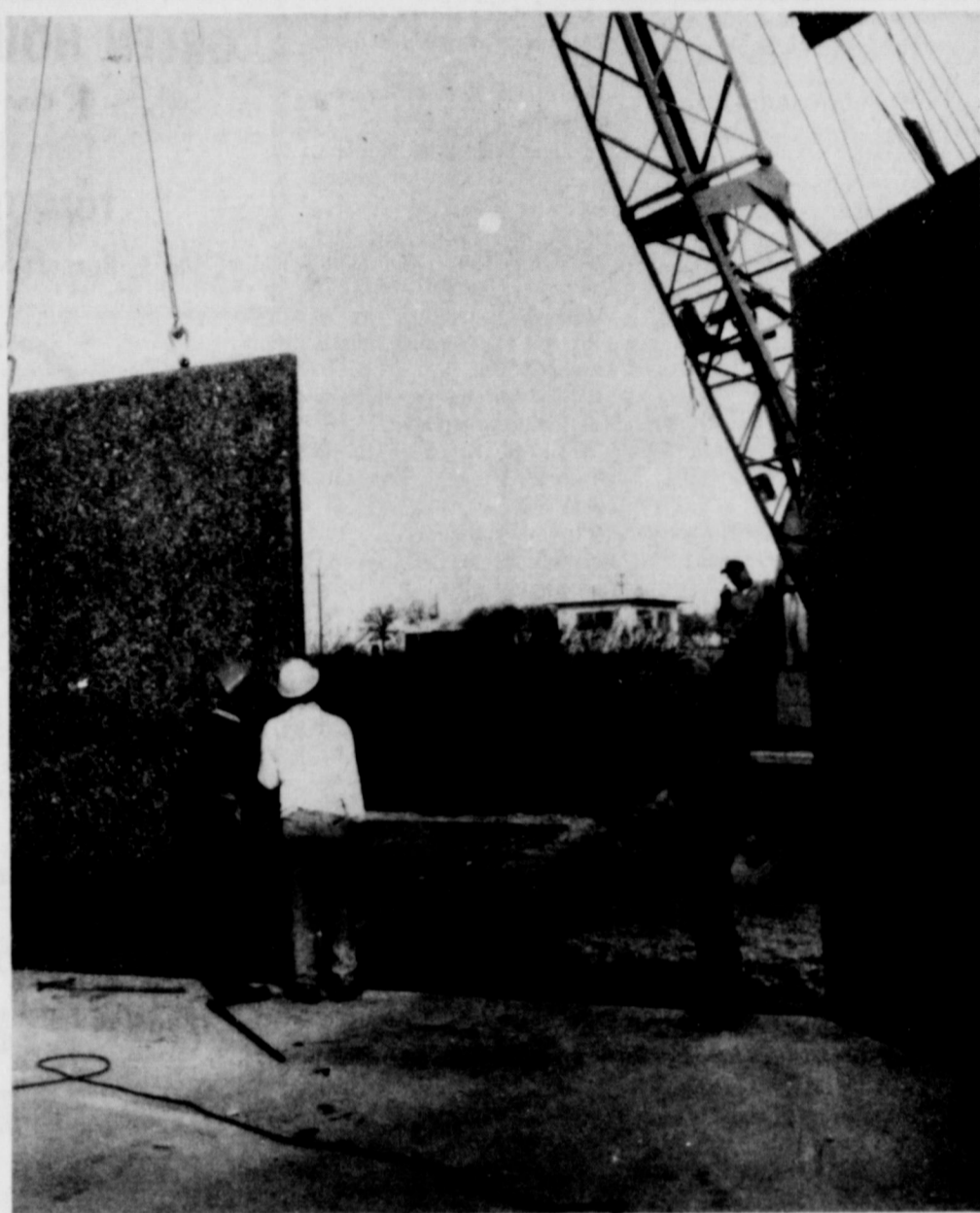
Ah, that history. Most know that the lake was named in connection with a railroad, both of which derived their names from the famous Ringlings of circus fame.

Best source on that famous family is a book "Those Amazing Ringlings and their Circus" by Gene Plowden, \$6.50, published by Caxton Printers, Ltd., Caldwell, Idaho, 83605.

It takes the Ringling family (originally Rungeling) from Ohio farmcountry to the top of the entertainment world. Papa and Mrs. August had seven sons and a daughter. Five of the boys started their own troupe and through hard work, smart operating and tight control built and built, until they finally had the biggest circus in the world. John Ringling was the last surviving son after the fortunes had been made and his speculations in many fields led him to Texas oil, railroads and other interests (Texas had always been good to the circus business).

John Ringling had run into Jake Hamon in Oklahoma and they became partners in various ventures. One of the reasons Ringling was interested in railroads was because as a rail official he had free right to run his exclusive railcar home on other lines. "John helped build and became an official in several other railroads, among them the St. Louis & Hannibal, White Sulphur Springs and Yellowstone Park, St. Louis & Troy, and Eastland, Wichita Falls and Gulf.

Of course the Eastland connection is great, but ever without it, it would be a great book if you like circuses, and who doesn't? From a humble beginning, the Ringlings brought their operation into world-wide prominence, and the assortment of mergers and consolidations that ultimately resulted in the final form is very interesting.

## Fire Destroys Baird Home

A fire destroyed the three bedroom home of Mrs. Vernon Baird of Olden about 9:30 a.m. Thursday.

Bill Griffin, Olden Fire Chief, said the house was completely engulfed in flames when he arrived. Griffin immediately called the Eastland Fire Dept. and Chief Guy Peel sent four firemen and two trucks. A few minutes later a third alarm was turned in to the Ranger Fire Dept. which sent two trucks and several firemen.

Griffin said all utilities had been cut off at the house. A Baird family spokesman said the loss has been estimated at \$7,500 and that the dwelling and contents were not covered by insurance.

Cause of the fire, which is believed to have started in the kitchen, is being investigated by Eastland Constable Bill Hunter.

No one was home at the time of the fire. There were no injuries.

## Eastlanders Make Christmas Possible For Stranded Florida Students

A telephone call made by two ministerial students to J. E. Pennington at 8:30 p.m. December 21, related how two Florida students and their families were stranded in Eastland due to automobile trouble on Interstate 20. Bruck Hopkins and Charles Williams, students at Sunset School of Preaching in Lubbock, had hitch-hiked into Eastland from East of Ranger where their auto had broken down, leaving their wives and two small children waiting in the car. A friendly and helpful truck driver brought them to Taylor Center in Eastland.

Both the Hopkins and Williams families were enroute to Jacksonville, Florida for the Holidays with their parents. The breakdown in Eastland called for some vital auto parts not available in town before their crippled auto would be ready for the 1,200 mile trip to Florida. A quick trip out to the stalled auto found the women chilled but in good spirits. The families were settled for the night in a warm motel room. Mrs. Ira Hanna volunteered the use of a pickup to tow the crippled auto into Eastland that night!

Early Friday morning, December 22, J. L. McDaniels, shop foreman at Hood King Motor Company, and the shop

crew diagnosed the mechanical problems but parts were not available in Eastland. A special trip to Ranger yielded one of the three vital parts, but others could not be located. As Friday afternoon wore on tension mounted in the face of the crisis - parts must be secured and installed by Saturday afternoon or these families would be stranded in Eastland until after Christmas!

About 4 p.m., Friday afternoon the remaining parts were located in DeLeon and another Eastland resident, Clyde Barbee, volunteered to drive there to pick them up. The garage crew cooperated and the auto was ready before 6

p.m., Friday night. With gratitude to all and a generous amount of goodwill for the unusual aid given by residents of Eastland, the Hopkins and Williams families rejoined thousands of others enroute home for Christmas.

J. L. McDaniels summed up the feeling of all in Eastland who helped these students by observing that our town is both sensitive to others needs and also aware that all parents want their children at home for the Holidays. When special problems arise, said McDaniels, it takes a variety of people to help - and our town responded wonderfully.

## AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES, OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES, OR AMENDMENTS THERETO, THAT CONFLICT WITH THE TERMS OR CONDITIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE AND ENACTING IN LIEU THEREOF A NEW ORDINANCE, REGULATING PLUMBING WORK IN THE CITY OF EASTLAND, TEXAS; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN EXEMPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE AND THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND ESTABLISHING CERTAIN FEES; PROVIDING FOR SPECIFICATIONS, MATERIALS AND METHODS OF PLUMBING INSTALLATIONS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING A SEWER ABILITY CLAUSE.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Eastland:

### CHAPTER I TITLE CITED

1.1 This ordinance shall be known as the Plumbing Ordinance of the City of Eastland, and may be cited as such.

It shall be unlawful for any person, association of persons, co-partnership or corporation to engage in the business of plumbing, or do or perform any plumbing as defined in this ordinance, without first having procured the necessary licenses and permits as hereinafter provided for, and all plumbing, plumbing work and workmanship and materials shall meet the requirements of this ordinance and shall pass all inspections required in this ordinance in regard to the work done.

### CHAPTER 2 INTENT AND PURPOSE

2.1 PURPOSE: For the protection and preservation of life and of the public health, safety, property and the general welfare of the people, the following provisions are enacted relating to the installation, alteration or repair of pipes, fittings and fixtures for water, sewage and natural gas in all buildings and structures and all property now erected or to be erected, changed, constructed, reconstructed, repaired or altered in the City of Eastland, if same be connected to either the City water, gas or sewerage systems. The intent and purpose of this ordinance is to regulate the construction, erection, enlargement, alteration, maintenance or repair of all piping, fittings, fixtures, etc., about any and all premises in the City of Eastland, and outside the boundaries of the City of Eastland, if same be connected to either the City water, gas or sewerage systems.

26.3 PENALTIES: Any person, either by himself or agent, and any firm, corporation or other entry who violates any of the provisions of this Code shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction of any such violation, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00); and each day during which such violation continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offense. In any case of a violation of any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance by any corporation, the officers and agents actively in charge of the business of such corporation, shall be subject to the penalty herein provided. Any offense defined herein which has been defined by laws of the State of Texas as an offense and for which penalty has been described shall be punished as provided in said State Law, and nothing herein shall be held as fixing

any penalty contrary to a penalty provided by the laws of the State of Texas.

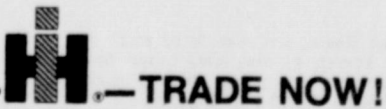

# TIPS FOR OUTDOORSMEN

by Vern Sanford

That day is coming, in the not too distant future, when you will be carrying another license card in your billfold. Or, perhaps we should add—if you qualify.

Already you are licensed to drive a car, or you'd better not drive. Also you must possess a license before you can pilot a plane, or you'll be in violation of both State and Federal laws.

In both cases you must demonstrate certain abilities and prove that you are knowledgeable of safety regulations and procedures before you can obtain these permits.

Today there are millions of boats operating in the fresh waters of these United States. Yet very few of the owners have even taken, much less passed, a safe driving course.

Such a requirement is coming . . . and sooner than you think.

Stringent safety regulations have already been written into the Federal laws. They are still inadequate, but far better than none at all. These rules are for your good. They were drafted for your protection and will be enforced for your benefit. Strict adherence to them may save your life, or the life of your family or closest friends.

But, instruction is not mandatory; nor is a "driver's license" required of boat operators who operate recreational vehicles.

For many years private groups, government organizations and the Coast Guard thought that safety laws relative to boating were unneces-

sary. So, voluntary safety courses were offered by the Coast Guard Auxiliary, the U. S. Power Squadron and others.

However, only one out of five recreational vehicle owners enrolled.

So, another boating self-study program soon may be available, with participation as a possible basis for issuance of a license by individual states under Federal guidelines.

Proposed licenses would include everyone who operates a boat of any size—from canoe to cruiser.

Today a ten-year-old is not allowed to drive a car on Texas highways for two very sensible reasons—he is not physically able to handle the machine, and he does not have the experience and judgment to react properly in an emergency.

Yet this same ten-year-old youngster can commandeer a 220 H.P. inboard loaded with kids of all ages and drive on a crowded lake at full throttle and be within the law. Such wild and dangerous acts must be prohibited, as should many other unsafe practices by young and old alike.

Check your area for members of the Coast Guard or the Auxiliary—or any group offering instructions in boating (be they Civic Clubs, Chambers of Commerce, Boy or Girl Scouts, FFA, etc.) and sign up for their training program. Enroll your entire family—and be ready for the mandatory exam that's bound to come.

# Farmcast

Compiled From Sources Of The Texas Department of Agriculture  
John C. White, Commissioner

**A Good Year For Agriculture Production . . . Cotton, Cattle, Citrus Show Good Gains . . . Pecans Increase . . . Commercial Vegetable Acres Expand . . . Grain Sorghum, Peanut, Soybean Production Up From 1971.**

All in all, 1972 was a very good production year for Texas. Cotton production probably showed the most dramatic increase. Estimated production now at 3,900,000 bales is 1,321,000 bales more than 1971. Yield per acre for 1972 was almost 100 pounds per acre above 1971.

Texas continued its dominance in the cattle feeding industry during 1972. For most of the year, it was and still is the number one cattle feeding state in the nation. It apparently will retain that honor for some time to come.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter in Texas feedlots number 2,225,000 head, up 29 percent from a year ago. Iowa is the second-ranking state in the nation, with 1,689,000 head, far under the total for Texas.

**BASED** on Dec. 1 conditions, the 1972-73 crop of Texas citrus is forecast at 17,200,000 boxes. This is 15 percent above the production of last season.

Grapefruit production is expected to total 10,400,000 boxes, 13 percent above last year. Early and mid-season oranges are forecast at 4,500,000 boxes, up 18 percent from last season. Valencia oranges are estimated at 2,300,000 boxes, which is 15 percent above last season.

**PECAN** production for Texas in 1972 was first set at 71 million pounds, which would have been a new all-time high. Latest production figure, however, is 65,000,000 pounds. This still makes it the second largest on record.

It is also almost three times the production of 1971 which was only 24,000,000 pounds.

Texas will produce about one-third of the nation's total supply of pecans for 1972.

**EXPANSION** of the 1972-73 six major winter vegetables is forecast. An estimated 57,000 acres will be planted to the six major winter vegetables in Texas. The crops are cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, lettuce, spinach, and broccoli.

This acreage will be an increase of nine percent over last season.

In the Lower Rio Grande Valley, acreage of the six winter vegetables is estimated at 39,200 acres, or 16 percent above the 33,900 acres harvested last season. Acreage of carrots, cabbage, lettuce and cauliflower all showed significant increases. Acreage of spinach remained the same as last season while broccoli acreage decreased.

In other areas, acreage is expected to total 17,800 acres for harvest, which is three percent below last year.

**GRAIN SORGHUM** production in Texas at 456,000,000 bushels was more than 50,000 bushels ahead of 1971. Texas produces about 45 percent of all the grain sorghum in the nation.

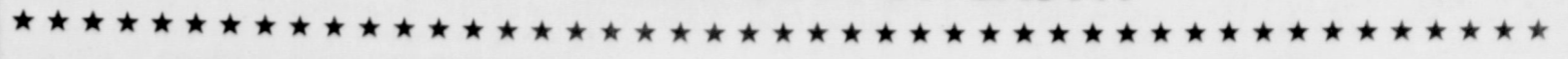
**PEANUT** production was up in Texas this year over 1971 by almost a million pounds. The 1972 production estimate is 456,000,000 pounds.

**SOYBEAN** production in the state in 1972 is almost double the production in 1971. Texas production for 1972 is set at 5,670,000 bushels.
