





Make small meat bails of ground bleef, eggs, parsley flakes, bread crumbs, onion, 2 teaspoons salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Roll in flour. Fay in deep hot fat (360° F.) until browned. Heat rice in shortening until very hot. Remove beef chuck from Hiquid after it is cooked, and cook rice in this broth, adding water if needed.
