## Drive Launched For Appointment DA-Elect Brown as District Judge

A grass-roots campaign has been launched over Eastland County to secure the appointment of Perry T. Brown, veteran attorney of Rising Star, as judge of the 91st District Court to fill the unexpired term of the late Judge Turner M. Colhe, this newspaper learned Wednesday.

Brown is the new Eastland county-district attorney-elect, due to be sworn in Friday during formal ceremonies at the courthouse in Eastland.

Previously mentioned as top aspirants for the post, to be filled by Gov. John Connally, are Frank Sparks, Eastland attorney, and District Attorney Earl Conner, Jr., also of Eastland, who was defeated by Brown in an upset victory in the Democratic Primary election last May 2.

A total of 5,905 voters casting ballots in the county's 13 precincts gave Brown 3,650 votes to 2,093 for Conner. Citizens of the Cisco precinct gave Brown an overwhelming 1203-267 triumph over incumbent Conner. He also carried Ranger by a vote of 618 to 492. Brown carried 11 of the county's 13 precincts in the May 2 balloting.

A number of Eastland County citizens were reported to have contacted the office of Governor Connally in Austin Monday and Tuesday urging the appointment of County-District Attorney-elect Brown to the judgeship.

The movement is being led by Democrats in Ranger and Cisco and, a spokesman said, "It also is being widely supported by citizens over Eastland County."

The spokesman also stated that Brown had been contacted and that "he said that he would gladly accept an appointment as district judge."

In the event that Brown were appointed to the judgeship by Gov. Connally, his supporters say that the Eastland County commissioners' court could appoint a county-district attorney to serve Brown's four-year term in that office.

Some 50 Olden residents met Tuesday evening to hear a preliminary report on the town's proposed FHA water system and to talk with Eastland representatives about buying water for the system.

Approximately 50 Olden residents are presently Eastland water customers, paying the same rate as Eastlanders, plus an additional 50 cent meter reading fee. The water committee believes there are some 130 potential customers in the town, located four miles east of Eastland.

Mr. Decker explained costs of the water systems and told residents that under the "Design A" (distribution system only), cost per customer per month if 100 customers sign up, will be \$4.50 for a 3,000 gallon minimum; and for the more elaborate System B, with a 100 customers, cost per customer would be \$5.88 per month for the same 3,000 gallons.

Estimates are that the city might choose to adopt the Design A system initially with the view of converting to the better, more expensive system later, it was reported.

No definite arrangement was reached on the purchase of water from Eastland.

Darrell Cooper, FHA representative discussed the securing of the loan, explaining that the only source of revenue will be from the sale of water and will be used to repay the government loan, and to pay for other operating expenses. The association will be a non-profit organization.

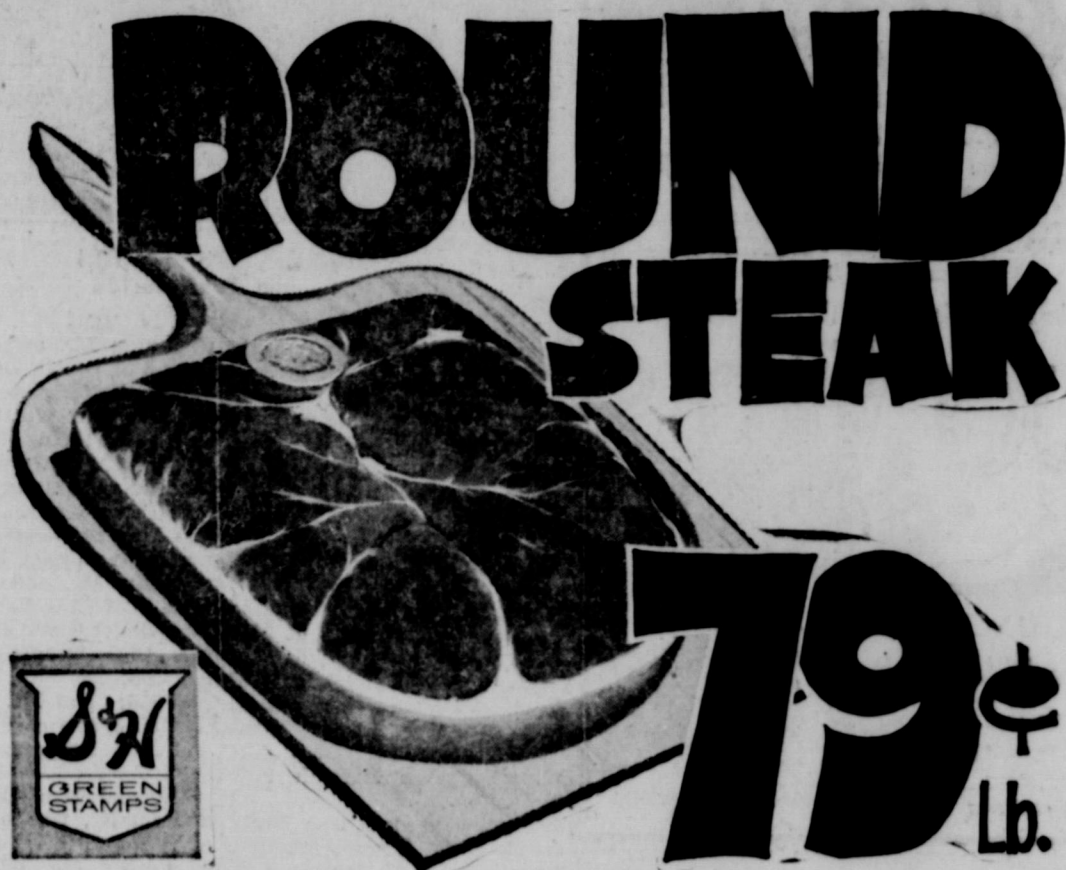
