Nebraska Highland Yields Story Of Early Civilization

By United Press. BAYARD, Neb.—The rugged highlands of western Nebraska have yielded specimens of what scientists believe are the remnants of a civilization older than any other ever traced on the North American continent.

For a month a party of scientists from the Smithsonian Institution and from the Santa Fe, N. M., laboratory of anthropology dug into Signal Butte mountain near here. Dr. W. D. Strong, of the Smithsonian Institution, led the party.

Old Signal Butte, a landmark that once guided the western settlers along the old Oregon Trail, was regarded by the explorers as one of the most valuable scientific finds because it revealed three distinct and successive prehistoric occupations, all separated by long intervals.

The oldest level and the lowest of the three strata dates back 5,000 years, the anthropologists estimated, although the exact date is not known by the preliminary study. Human refuse, flint implements, animal bones and other specimens indicated that the early man was a hunter.

Telephone Service To Egypt Opened

A. T. & T. company has opened telephone service to Egypt. Voices from the Land of the Sphinx were audible in America Monday, Aug. 8, when telephone service was opened between the two countries. Initially this service will be available daily between the hours of 2 a. m. to 6 a. m. and 11 a. m. to 1 p. m., Eastern Standard Time.

The service will embrace Cairo and Alexandria and will be available to all Bell and Bell-connected telephones in North America. A three minute conversation between New York and either of the Egyptian cities will cost \$36 with \$12 for each additional minute.

Stock Selling Plan Opposed By N. Y. Exchange

NEW YORK.—A new method of selling stock in companies whose shares are listed on the New York Stock Exchange is attracting considerable interest and arousing considerable speculation as to what effect it might have on the future industrial structure.

Backed by a flamboyant buy commanding the passery to "buy America!" a "store" has been opened in the heart of uptown New York to sell stock. The store offers various "portfolios," or "packages" of stocks, all in well-known corporations whose shares are listed on the exchange.

Market observers point out that if the ambitious plans of the "package" sale are realized, some peculiar effects on the industrial structure of the country might result.

One objection raised by the exchange to this method of selling was on the grounds that the commissions or profits charged are excessive. Pirnie Simon & Co. revealed that their total commission on a "package" sale are approximately \$42, and pointed out that the same purchase through a stock exchange broker, at the regular commissions charged, would be more than that.

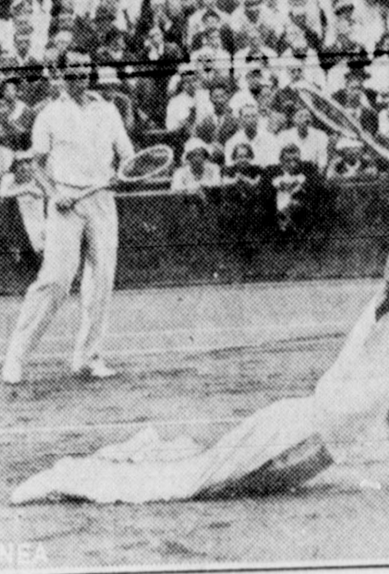
Five Cents On Each \$10 Must Go To Pay Interest On Money United States Has Invested In Private Business

By MORRIS DE HAVEN TRACY, United Press Staff Correspondent. (Copyright 1932 by United Press) WASHINGTON.—It will take one-half of 1 per cent of the entire national income to pay the government 4 per cent interest on the \$7,664,515,201.01 it has invested or has potentially available for investment in American business.

That means five cents of every \$10 received by every man, woman, child, business or corporation in the United States, will go for interest to the new, silent partner in American enterprise. Out of every \$2,500 income, \$12.50 will go for such interest payments.

The citizen probably never will realize this, for the payment will not be made in taxes. The government, through loans to agriculture, to business through the reconstruction finance corporation, and through other channels, has taken its interest in business as a lender of money, not as a stockholder.

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Washington, D.C. (U.P.)—In surveying the government's plunge into the field of business, many projects, involving many hundreds of millions of dollars, have been omitted because of possible question as to their status as purely business operations.

These include the Panama canal, the vast sums spent for rivers and harbors, the Mississippi barge lines, the Alaskan railroad and Alaskan cable, the army transport service, the Panama railroad, and other like projects which may be a business nature but also are classed as national defense.

The carrying out of the 30 great reclamation projects and the Columbia basin projects likewise have not been considered. They represent a tremendous business activity of the government but also can be considered as non-competitive with private business and in a field private business would not or could not fill. Their status as business projects of the government, therefore is subject to question.

Other, perhaps less striking government activities come in the same category. 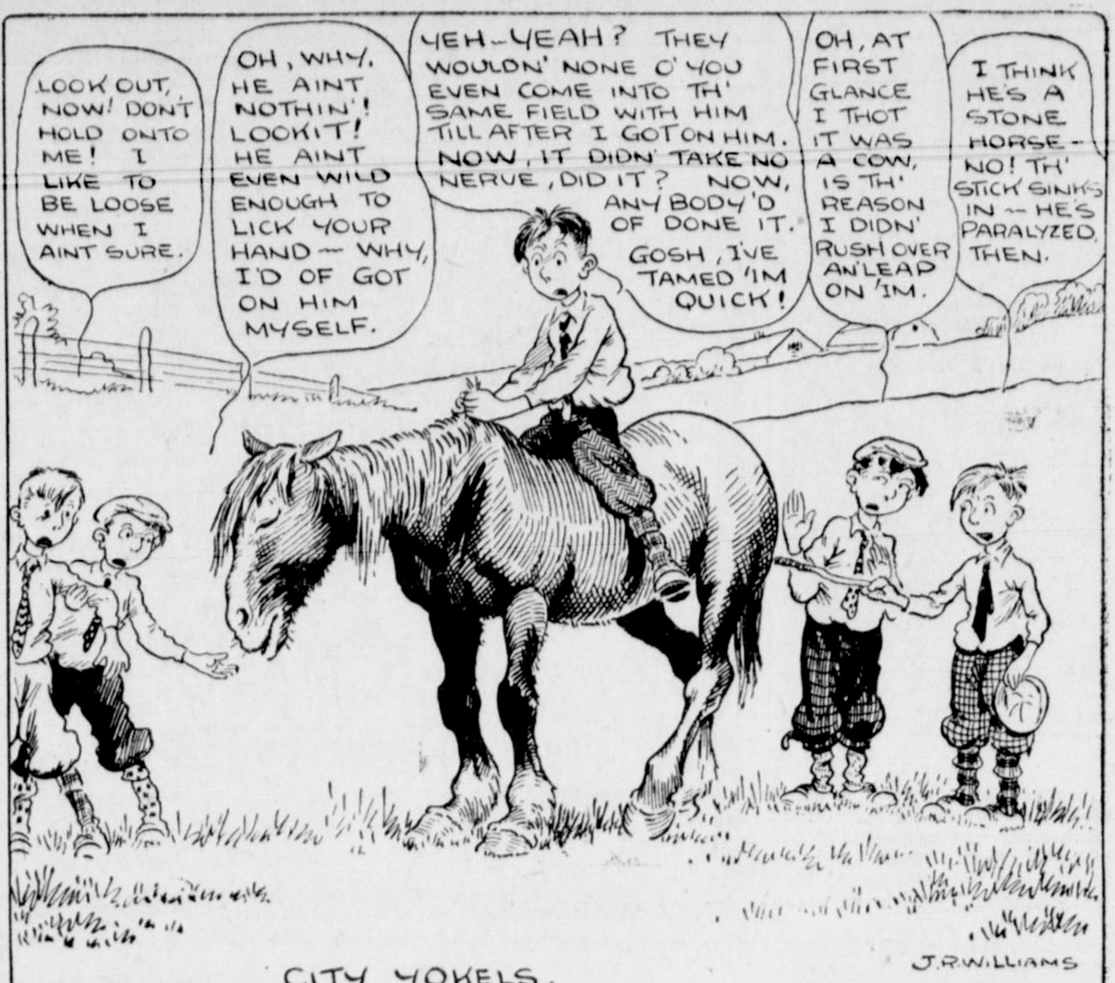

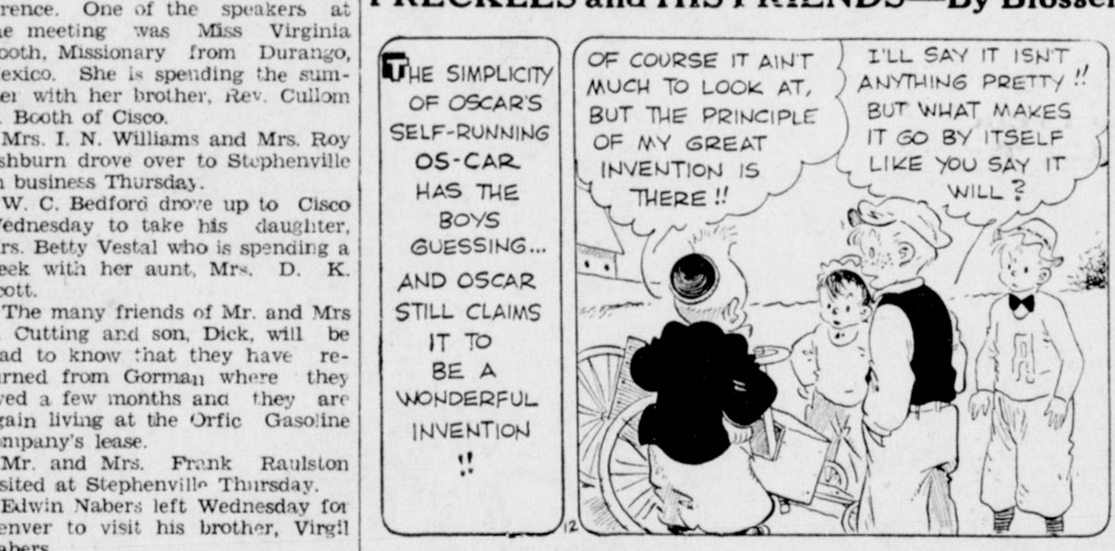
