**Country Echoes**

No rain, weather, wind, and water which we carry to the field to drink, is still hotter than dish-water — can't see any use to carry on. And we have a mockingbird on hand. Thereby hangs a tale. Thursday, a young mocker fell in our yard, probably exhausted from the heat. We carried it into the house and gave it water to drink, and now we are stuck with it. No mother bird has shown up, and we just wouldn't turn it loose at the mercy of the weather and our cat, so we put it in a cage. Now, it requires three or four grasshoppers, or various bugs to eat at one sitting, and they are scarce. We ranged up and down the fence-row with the fly-swatter searching for bugs — any kind — early in the morning, and barely got enough together to feed this feathered friend.

While cutting weeds in the cottonfield, we watched and caught grasshoppers and bugs to carry to the house. And last night our problem was solved for us.

We left the porch light on for a short time, and a collection of grasshoppers, bugs, lacewings, and flies, and so forth gathered to the light, and we went to work with the swatter, netting a nice supply of food for that bird. We've heard that mockingbirds make good pets — anybody want one? **JUST COME AND GET HIM!**

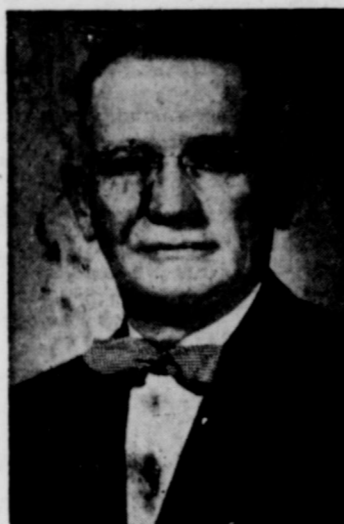
Open Letter To All The Women In The 17th Congressional District

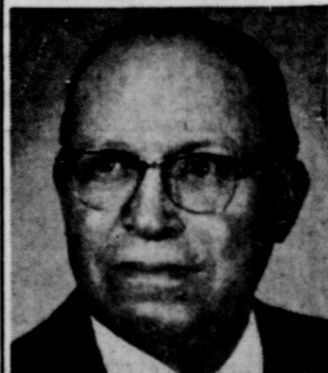

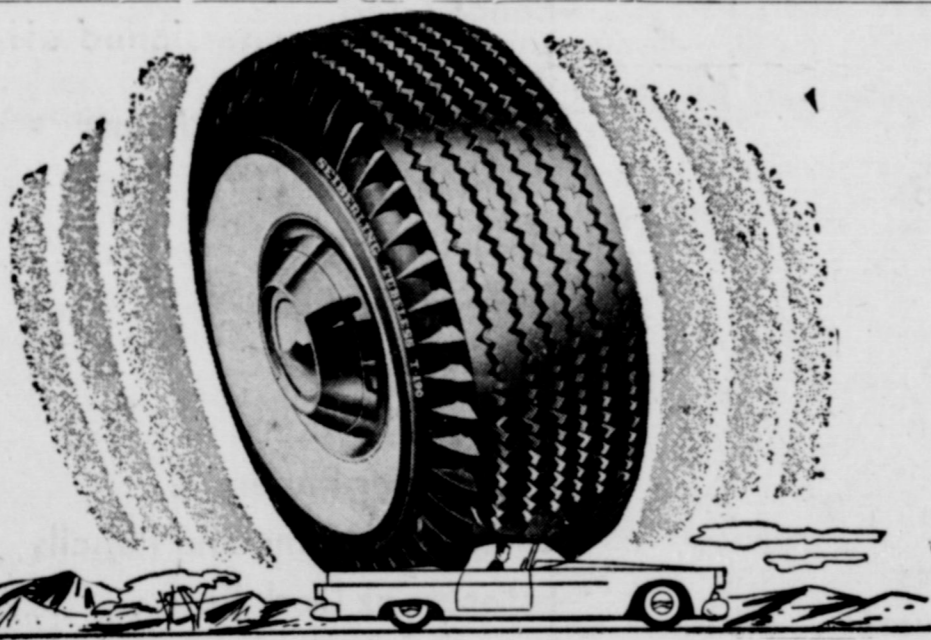
