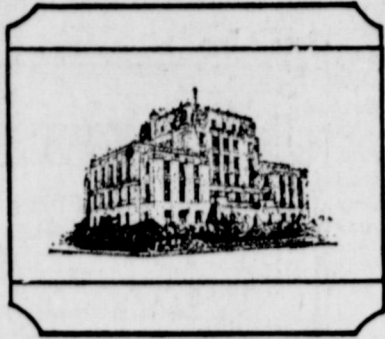

Excise Tax On Telephone Bills Down 7 Per Cent

Telephone bills here will be lower in January.

Southwestern Bell Telephone Company customers will benefit from the reduced telephone excise tax beginning on January 1.

All bills mailed after the first of the year will reflect the seven per cent excise tax reduction.

A three per cent levy will remain on telephone service. Current bills carry a 10 per cent tax.

The excise tax will be reduced by an additional one per cent a year until it is eliminated in 1969...

Customers' bills will reflect the full benefit of the reductions and ultimate elimination as they become effective.

The excise tax is levied directly on users of telephone service and is included as a separate item on monthly telephone bills.

Other 1965 reports are as follows: Oct. 13 — Loans, \$2,530,428.09; deposits, \$5,318,775.63; and total resources, \$5,789,469.82.

June 30 — Loans, \$2,533,214.91; deposits, \$5,129,402.59; and total resources, \$5,583,192.76.

April 26 — Loans, \$2,409,254.65; deposits, \$5,019,713.27; and total resources, \$5,470,439.13.

Stanley Webb Dies Tuesday At Cisco Home

Stanley W. Webb, 53, tax assessor and collector for the Cisco Independent School District for the past 10 years, died at 9:30 a. m. Tuesday at his residence, 1102 West 7th Street, Cisco.

He was a life-long resident of Cisco and Eastland County, and had been in ill health for some time.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. Wednesday. The services were held at the First Baptist Church, Cisco, with the pastor, the Rev. Jesse Cassie, officiating, assisted by the Rev. Mart Agnew.

Burial was in the Oakwood Cemetery with Rust Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Webb's body was discovered by associates who went to his home after several attempts to reach him by telephone. Justice of the Peace W. L. Lewis returned a verdict of death by self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Born Feb. 21, 1912, in Cisco, Mr. Webb was a graduate of the public schools. He grew up in the Romney Community, south of Cisco. He was a veteran of World War II and was a member of the American Legion Post. He was a member of the First Baptist Church and of the Masonic Lodge.

Mr. Webb was married to the former Ruby Jo Pounds on Nov. 27, 1937, in Clovis, N. M. A talented baritone, Mr. Webb had for many years been called on to lead song services and to serve as soloist for funerals and gatherings, accompanied always at the piano by his wife.

Mr. Webb was elected as Eastland County Tax Assessor and Collector in 1950 and took office Jan. 1, 1951. He served until Jan. 31, 1956, at which time he resigned to accept the position as tax assessor and collector of the Cisco Independent School District and the Cisco Junior College district.

Besides his wife, Mr. Webb is survived by one son, James Stanley, of Dallas; one daughter, Mrs. Ronnie Holliday, Houston; one brother, Edwood B. Webb, Abilene; and three sisters, Mrs. A. M. Stroebel of Big Lake, Mrs. James Dean of Amarillo and Mrs. Burkett Huestis of Odessa.

ECSWD Board Cuts 1966 Tax Levy Rate 25 Percent

The levy on taxes of the Eastland County Water Supply District has been chopped 25 percent effective Jan. 1, 1966.

The cut was voted by ECWSD directors during the board's year-end meeting in December, according to Tom Wilson of Eastland, president.

The latest reduction, second to be made since the district was formed, lowers the rate from 20 cents to 15 cents per \$100 tax valuation.

The tax levy originally was set at 25 cents.

It was reduced to 20 cents effective Jan. 1, 1963 and continued at that rate through 1965.

"The Eastland County Water Supply District is in excellent shape," a spokesman said. "All reserve accounts are in excellent condition and funds have been provided to meet commitments on bonds and interest due in February, 1966."

Under the regulations of the bonding indenture which governs approval of the Eastland County Water Supply District, a tax roll must be

compiled for Ranger and Eastland every year as long as the bonds remain outstanding.

Combined ECWSD tax valuation for the two cities is \$10 million.

Current members of the board of directors of the Eastland County Water Supply District include Wilson, president of Eastland; Glyn Gilliam, vice president, C. B. Pruet, James A. Smith and Floyd L. Bruce of Ranger, and Charles Freyschlag, M. H. Perry and T. M. Fullen of Eastland.

Report Shows County Area Has 30 Junkyards

The junkyards in Eastland County have been counted as a surprise to most to learn part of the Federal Highway Beautification Act.

That's the word from Harvey L. Lewis, maintenance foreman for the State Highway Department in Eastland. His crews did the counting. The recently enacted Federal Highway Beautification Act prompted the inventory of billboards and junkyards along Texas highways by the Texas Highway Department. The act, as approved by Congress and signed into law by the President, envisions the control of billboards and junkyards and scenic enhance-

ment along the nation's federal-aid highway systems. In Texas, this will cover more than 3,000 miles of Interstate highway system and more than 14,500 miles of the primary system. The Texas inventories were ordered last month by State Highway Engineer D. C. Greer. At that time Greer said information obtained in the inventories will be used in studies that will be made relative to possible state legisla-

tion to implement the provision of the act, including the zoning of industrial and commercial areas along the State highway system. A Highway Department spokesman said May 15, 1966, has been set as a target date for completion of the inventories. The Highway Department field parties will travel over highways in Texas gathering information for the inventories. The number of junkyards in

the state is considerably smaller than that of billboards. On billboards, Highway Department personnel will record such information as size, ownership, subject displayed and location. The signs will be classified as in rural, industrial or commercial areas. Signs directly related to the property on which they are located, such as "for sale" signs will not be surveyed. The first project in Texas'

plan of action under the Federal act was launched earlier this month when the Texas Highway Commission approved plans for the first landscape planting project to be financed in Texas under the act. This project is to be on a section of Interstate Highway 45 adjacent to the downtown business district of Houston. The Federal Act calls for an expanded program of landscaping and scenic enhance-

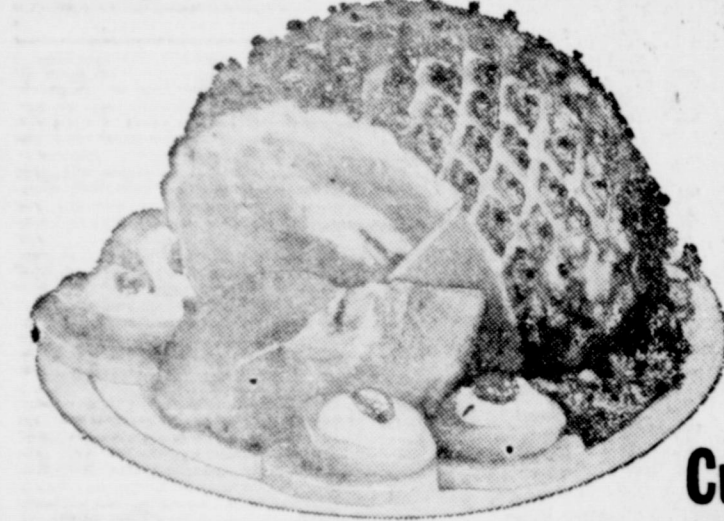
