"During the first seven months of 1956, we have had 14 fires caused from bufning trash and rubbish. The City is picking up trash twice weekly during June, July, August and September, so there is little reason for burning.

"The garbage collectors' job is bad enough at best, but when they empty a trash can that has ashes left from burning, the ashes cover them from head to foot. 




