## County Is Asked to Join Regional Planning Group

Reasoning that "there's strength in numbers," officials from some 20 counties, including and adjoining Eastland County, are in the process of forming the West Central Council of Governments for mutual benefits.

County Judge Scott Bailey, Ranger Mayor Morris Newnam and Cisco Chamber of Commerce manager Jim Smothers attended an organizational meeting in Abilene Wednesday, at which a constitution and set of by-laws were adopted. These had been drafted by a steering committee on which Mayor Newnam served.

The need for "regional planning" is the spark that ignited the organization pro-

cess, according to reports. Initially, the Federal Bureau of Roads has announced that no further authorization for road construction (including farm-to-markets) will be given unless cities and areas have broad, long-range regional planning. Other federal agencies, including the Farm Home Administration, are expected to adopt such a policy. (In Eastland County, where there are presently four FHA projects on the drawing board, such a policy could block water development projects and others receiving federal assistance, it was said.)

The West Central Council of Governments (COG) organizers hope to set up a central

office for research and assistance on such federal projects. A plan for the financing of the COG plan is to assess each participating county three cent per person (about \$600 for Eastland County's some 20,000 people). This would amount to \$18,000, which the federal government would match two-for-one amounting to \$36,000, and a total budget of \$54,000, to be used for organizational purposes, and to initiate research. A 49-member board and a ten-member executive commission would be elected to supervise the work and planning, Judge Bailey said.

The plan is seen as a specific coordinating effort through which member cities, towns and counties can benefit, he said.

The Eastland Commissioners Court will be presented the program Monday, and have until Oct. 15 to decide whether or not to participate, he said. The judge will ask the commissioners to explain the program to key people, including the mayors, in their respective towns and find out what the wishes of the people are.

The organization is not binding in any way, he said, and explained that there will be no taxing, and any county can withdraw simply by not paying its dues.

There are presently four such organizations in the state, and Palo Pinto, on Eastland County's east boundary is a member of a Dallas project.

Judge Bailey said that he will recommend to the commissioners court that we go into the program.

As presently mapped, the organization geographically follows Cong. Omar Burleson's 17th District, plus some additional counties on the north, and is made up of five divisions:

Division One include Taylor, Shackelford and Callahan.

Division Two, Nolan, Mitchell, Scurry and Fisher.

Division Three, Kent, Sonewall, Haskell and Throckmorton.

Division Four, Stephens, Eastland, Erath and Comanche.

Division Five, Brown, Coleman and Runnels.

## Sheep, Goat Raisers Hear 'Experts' Speak

Approximately 40 sheep and goat raisers attended the 5th Annual Eastland County Sheep and Goat Field Day Friday at the Ranger Junior College cafeteria.

Jack Groff, a sheep and goat specialist with the agriculture Extension Service, of Texas A&M, speaking on the internal parasites of sheep and goats, pointed out that at this time we cannot eliminate the number one parasite, the stomach worm, so we will just have to learn to live with it. However, he added, we can control it with proper range programs and medicine. Groff recommended pasture rotation — leaving the pasture without sheep or goats for a period of at least 30 days and preferable 60 to 90 days. With proper pasture rotation and drenching as often as necessary the stomach worm can be controlled, he said.

How do you determine if your animals have parasites? According to Groff, you observe. If your range is good and the animals are not looking well, you suspect parasites. If the veins of the eyeball are white instead of red you suspect parasites. In the advanced stages the animal's jaw and stomach will swell up.

Speaking on improving kid production of Angora goats, Dr. Maurice Shelton, a geneticist with the Livestock and

Forage Research Center, McGregor, observed that the larger the size of the doe, the more kids raised. He urged "raisers to concentrate on getting heavier goats — up to at least 80 pounds.

Dr. Shelton pointed out 3 ways to improve the size of your herd. First, improve the management practices, which includes stocking, parasite control and supplement feeding; second, feeding practice — high feed level per goat — don't overload your pasture and third, selection for size. The goat should reach maximum size at about 5 years of age.

"Lamb and sheep prices will remain at a favorable level rest of 1966," said John G. McHaney, Extension Service economist, College Station. And while he wouldn't commit a prediction about 1967 prices, he did point out several things which would lead one to believe they will be good — the number of sheep is decreasing from 56 million head in 1942 to 26.4 million head in 1966. We are at war, this usually causes prices to rise; present supply in other countries is small and the general economy situation continues at a high level.
