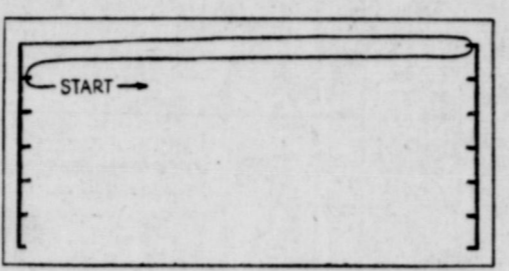

College Freshman Made Big Collection Of Texas Bird Life

Another 39 were prepared as "scientific skins" for use in the biology department of the West Texas State Teachers College. At present the society's museum possesses one of the largest collections of native birds in this section of the country. From this museum, those interested may learn the names and markings of practically all birds seen at all months of the year in Northeast Texas. Young Carlander, now a freshman at the University of Minnesota, has made bird-study his hobby since a small boy. In order to pursue his study in a scientific way he obtained a permit from the federal government to shoot birds. He never kills a bird unnecessarily. Through his study, Carlander believes that birds in the Panhandle and in the state of Texas should be better protected. "Many ignorant and misinformed people kill the small song birds, although all of them are protected by law," he said. "These birds help mankind in many ways." Many of the birds, especially two common Panhandle birds, the horned lark, or "wheat bird," and the western lark sparrow, destroy approximately 12,500,000 pounds of wheat seeds annually, he said. 50 different species of birds for each 80,000 square miles in the Panhandle, and each of these birds stay in the country 200 days out of the year. The horned lark is an all-year-round bird, he said. Young Carlander considered it the most destructive of all birds in this vicinity. The mocking bird, which is the state bird of Texas, dwells in the Panhandle in large numbers. Young Carlander said one mocking bird for each blue bonnet, the state flower, would be a conservative estimate of the number.

Heart Disease Is Number One Public Enemy Doctor Says

STAN, Tex.—Public Enemy Number One is Heart Disease, according to Dr. John W. Brown, Health Officer. This disease kills over 7200 people each year in Texas and the worst part is that the number is increasing each year. It must be admitted that deaths attributed to heart ailments are increasing, the fact that when a person contracts his heart, organic disease frequently exists. Organized disease causes shortness of breath, swelling of hands and feet, and "fough." Usually these symptoms convey to the patient's mind the suggestion that he has a heart disease. Functional heart disease is usually traced to these causes, namely, nervousness, influenza and so on; and effects of excessive use of coffee or tea. 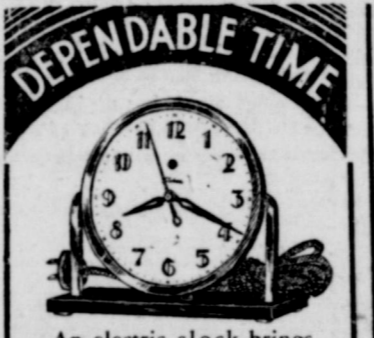
