### Preparing And Filing Income Tax Returns

**How to File**  
 In each district is a collector of internal revenue, and under him are various deputy collectors. These deputy collectors are stationed at convenient points through every state, and it is their duty to help the taxpayer make out his return and compute the amount of tax he should pay. If you do not happen to know the location of a deputy collector in your district I feel sure that your nearest bank or newspaper can furnish you with that information.

file last year, of course a return was not sent to you. However, failure to receive a return does not excuse you from your responsibility of filing a return reflecting income earned in 1933. In the event you did not receive a return you should request one from the collector of internal revenue for your district or one of his deputies.

 EDMONTON, Alta.—Another big mineral strike may be expected east of Great Slave Lake, where prospectors have been working quietly for some time, according to Bishop Breynat, O.M.I., for 33 years in charge of the Roman Catholic diocese of Mackenzie.
