Social Security Numbers Needed By New Workers

Spring is summer job hunting season for many high school and college students. Students who will be taking a job for the first time and will need a social security number were urged by R. R. Tuley, Jr., social security district manager, to apply now and avoid the May and June rush.

He stated that, by applying now, the student will avoid unnecessary delay. In late May and early June the number of applications for social security cards is four to five times greater than in the other months of the year and some delays occur. Since employers need to see a new employee's social security card before he goes on duty, getting the card late could cause a delay in starting work, an ordeal in missing a good job opportunity.

Tuley concluded by advising students not to wait until school is out to apply for their social security numbers. Applications may be obtained from local post offices or from the Abilene social security district office located in the Federal Building.

... obtain the court since they are planning to start construction in the near future for a new county courthouse and would like to include the Appeals Court in their plans.

"I am sure that not all the people of the Abilene area know that to duplicate the existing Eastland facilities would increase their tax burden by a third of a million dollars, and if they know this expenditure is being considered just to satisfy a few attorneys, they would probably be against it. In fact, many from Abilene have been in Austin expressing this very dissatisfaction with the attempt."

"In my estimation, there is now way that his bill could ever make it through the complete legislative process this session."

"I have personally consulted with the Speaker and the Lt. Governor and both are sympathetic to our position, as are many, many members of House."

The bill came out of the House Judicial District Committee Monday in what was called a "Jim Hogg meeting" called during the House session.

Two members dissented, but the committee gave the bill a favorable report, making it eligible for action by the House when the Rules Committee puts it on the calendar.

One minor amendment was adopted, on recommendation of the subcommittee headed by Rep. Raul Longoria of Pharr, rather than the City of Abilene, responsible for furnishing the quarters for the court if it is moved.

Rep. Tati Santiesteban of El Paso and C. L. Ray Jr. of Marshall joined Longoria in recommending the favorable report.

Members voting against the favorable report were Rep. James E. Nugent of Kerrville and Bob Salter of Gatesville.

Other members at the meeting favored the move.

The bill had been in the sub-committee since the public hearing Feb. 28. A month later the five members of the sub-committee went to Eastland to inspect facilities there as a part of the drive by Eastland people to prevent approval of the bill.

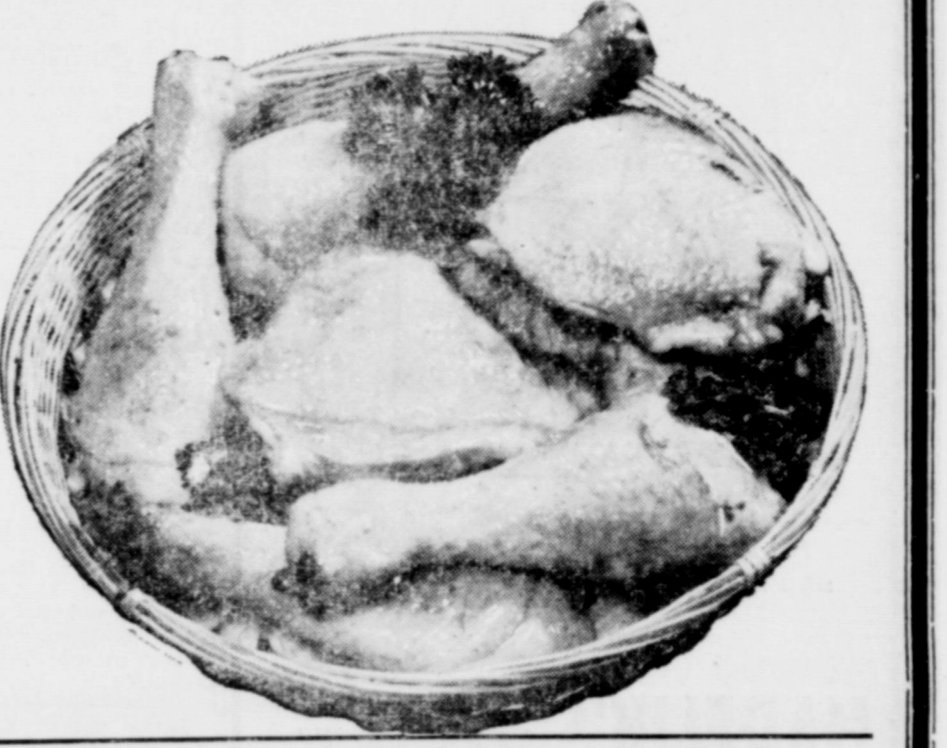
But Monday's happenings indicated that Rep. Tempie Jackson of Sweetwater, author of the bill, was able to convince the "vital three" that the bill should be approved.

Rep. Burke Musgrove, Breckenridge, whose district includes Eastland, said after the decision that there is "no justifiable reason to move the court to Abilene—certainly not enough to account for Eastland's loss of its investment."

"Out of courtesy to the speaker, I plan to talk to him about it before I give any statements," Musgrove said.

Financial Help Available For College In Four Gov't. Plans

DALLAS—High school juniors and seniors were reminded today that they may be able to obtain financial help to go to college under one of four Federally supported programs.

Dr. C. V. Galbreath, director of Higher Education for Region VII of the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, urged that seniors who are planning to attend college this

fall and who need financial assistance to meet educational costs get in touch immediately with the financial aid officer at the college of their choice and apply for a job, loan, grant or other assistance for which they may be eligible.

The four major Federal programs of financial aid to students, available to eligible students in any field of study, are: The National Defense Student Loan Program, the College Work-Study Program, the Educational Opportunity Grants Program, and the Guaranteed Loan Program.

During the 1967-68 academic year it is expected that these four programs will assist about 1,175,000 undergraduate students throughout the Nation to attend institutions of higher education, at a total cost of over \$1.1 billion.

Student Loan Program
"Most colleges and universities in the United States take part in the National Defense Student Loan Program, the oldest major program of Federally supported student assistance," Dr. Galbreath said.

Under this program students borrow directly from their colleges. Repayment and interest do not begin until after the student has ended his studies, and may be extended over a 10-year period. An undergraduate student may borrow up to \$1,000 each academic year to a total of \$5,000. Graduate students may borrow as much as \$2,500 per year to a maximum of \$10,000. There is a special cancellation provision for student borrowers who become teachers.

For the academic year be-

ginning this fall, an estimated 16,550 students in Texas, in attendance at 84 institutions of higher education, will borrow an estimated \$11,600,000.

Work-Study Program
The College Work-Study Program provides jobs on campus or off campus for students who need employment to help pay for college expenses. During the present school year it is estimated that more than 184,000 undergraduate students are employed in this program, earning an average total salary of about \$700 a year. During the present school year an estimated 9,980 students attending 77 colleges in Texas were employed in College Work-Study programs, at an approximate Federal cost of \$6,550,000.

Opportunity Grants
"Educational Opportunity Grants," Dr. Galbreath said, "is a new program that began operation in the fall of 1966. It is intended for undergraduate students in such extreme financial need that without the grants they could not attend college."

In its first year of operation, \$58 million in Federal grants enabled 134,000 students to attend college. These students, so long as they remain in good standing, are eligible to apply for grants for each year of undergraduate study. The grants range from \$200 to \$800 a year.

During this school year 5,037 students in Texas with the help of Educational Opportunity Grants.

Loan Program
The Guaranteed Loan Program, which began operation in the summer of 1966, provides a means for students to borrow directly from their bank, credit union, savings and loan association or other eligible lender. While any student may borrow, the program is intended primarily to ease the heavy burden of educational costs for middle-income families. For students whose adjusted family income is less than \$15,000 a year the Federal government pays the entire interest (6 percent) during the school years, and half the interest (3 percent) during the repayment period, which begins when studies are terminated. The loans are "guaranteed" by a State agency, or a private nonprofit agency designated by the State.

"In spite of the 'tight money market' which existed as the program got underway, and still exists," Dr. Galbreath said, "between July 1, 1966 and February 28, 1967, throughout the Nation more than 260,000 students borrowed a total of more than \$206 million in loans. During this time, 7,725 students in Texas borrowed \$5,167,290 for their

college expenses."
"A few years ago a college education was a luxury reserved for the child of affluent parents or youngsters with outstanding scholastic ability or athletic skills," Dr. Galbreath said, "but fortunately for our young people and for our country's future this situation has changed."

Dr. Galbreath urged citizens throughout Texas to look for talented young people who might not know of these opportunities for higher education and to encourage them to finish high school and go on to college.

Are the bugs eating up your garden?

Most insects can be knocked out with sprays, powders and other poisons, but the unwary gardener sometimes can suffer from the effects of bug sprays too.

Some tips on use of insecticides are offered in Today's Health, the magazine of

the American Medical Association.

Read the directions on the container carefully and follow them. The manufacturer spells out the proper usage and safety precautions.

If the directions call for rubber gloves, protective clothing or goggles, leave this alone, unless you are an expert.

Store the insecticide in its original container, with original label, in a safe, locked compartment, away from children and pets.

Destroy empty containers immediately.

inhaling sprays and Stay out of freshly sprayed areas.

Do not smoke while ing or dusting. Some chemicals are flammable.

If chemicals are spilled, wash immediately thoroughly.

Cover bird baths, doges and fish pools spraying. Pour left spray down a drain into the soil. Don't leave round in pans or pails.

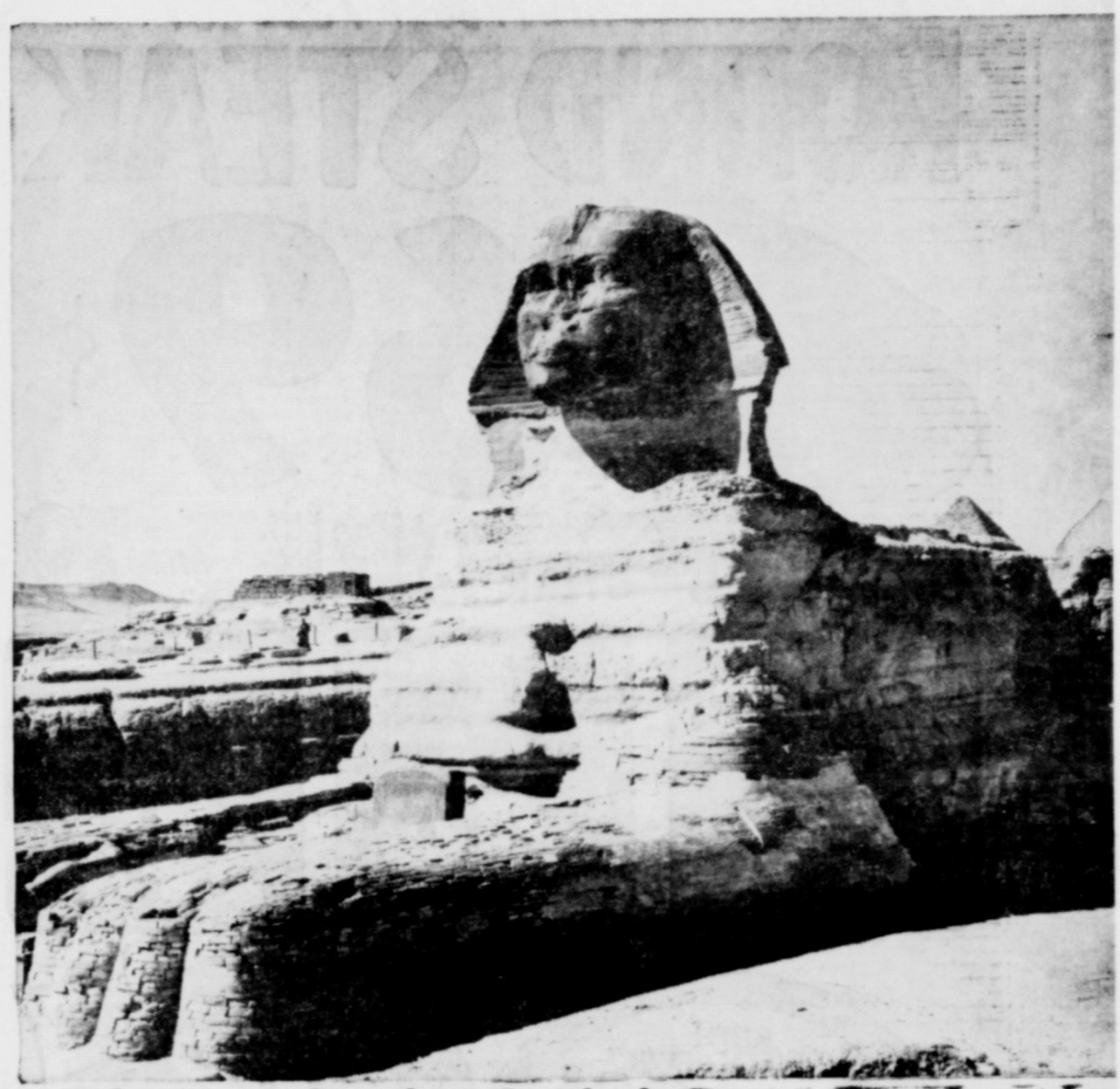
