





History of Eastland and Eastland County; general information about the city; city government; city services and facilities; transportation and distribution; labor market; employment and wages; taxes and bonded indebtedness; utilities; communications; plant sites and buildings; agricultural resources; mineral resources; government offices; established industries; business statistics; utility connections; and key maps.

According to Division Manager F. N. Sayre, copies of the survey are provided the Texas Industrial Commission for distribution to industrial prospects, bankers and communi cation media and others.

Most charted data in the revised edition is brought up to the end of 1966.

Two indices: postal receipts and bank deposits, both showed healthy gains from 1965 to 1966. At the post office, receipts were up to \$107,829 compared with \$104,800 in 1965. Bank deposits were \$6,244,622 at the end of 1966 and \$5,713,-983 at Dec. 31, 1965.

Public school membership (at May, 1967 report) was back in the 700s, at 740, after two years in the 800s (821 in 1965, and 819 in 1966).

The county's employed labor force took a swing up at the end of 1966, after a succession of downward plunges.

The April report on labor by year looks like this: 1960 6,840; 1961, 6555; 1962, 6.365; 1963, 6,200; 1964, 6,085; 1965. 6,000; 1966, 6,150. (No figure for April, 1967).

Electric connections were up to 1,463 at end of 1966, from 1,457, same time 1965; telephone connections, down to 2,372 from 2.465 at 1965; water connections, down to 1,424 from 1,444; and gas connections down to 1,470 from 1,-

Estimated Eastland population continued downward according to the report which showed 3,390 at Dec. 31, 1966, which is still up from the 3,292 actual 1960 count, bir. down from an estimated gain
