Justice of the Peace W. L. Lewis, who conducted an inquest, said he did not believe the Scotts ever knew what hit them. The bodies were taken to Rust Funeral Home in Cisco. The Scotts moved into the house, owned by John Conger, last week, and he was employed by Conger in a wood cutting project south of Cisco. Conger owned the house.
