## Coach Shirley Frazier Talks Of 'Perfect One'

ED. NOTE: EHS Head Coach Shirley Frazier writes of his Undeclared 1969 Mavericks, the season, the Fans and the thrill of Coaching such a Team.

The greatest dream in the life of every coach is winning a state championship. This dream is realized by very few. At the end of the season there are only 32 District champions. In four short weeks that number is reduced to two.

Second most often denied dream, after that for state championship, is an undefeated season, with absolutely no losses.

Many coaches go a lifetime without realizing either. The irony of accomplishing one without the other is difficult to imagine.

At Eastland High School this year, we had eight of the most dedicated Senior football players I have ever seen. These Seniors had something to prove to themselves and to the people of Eastland. As 7th, 8th and B team players their record stood at no wins and only one tie in the victory margin.

They constantly reminded each other and the squad of their desire to prove themselves during the off-season and early workouts.

The pride and determination of other graduating Seniors played a tremendous role in this desire and in our successes.

Such as the ability to play even when hurt. The slogan "Live With Pain" became a part of their daily vocabulary.

The ability to come from behind was great, as evidenced in the Ranger, Albany and Granbury games. Eastland football fans left the Haskell game holding their heads a little higher and feeling a tug in their throat at the flat refusal of the Maverick defense to allow Haskell to score again.

Yes, we lost the right to go on to regional competition by virtue of fewer penetrations, but we tied the game 14-14, and in doing, some 50 of the finest young men I have ever been associated with earned the respect of every football fan in the State of Texas.

To every parent, student and citizen of this community, I offer my personal congratulations for the part each of

you have played in the development of these outstanding young men.

They are our victory.

Randall Treadwell was high with 17 and Daryl Thomas was next with 11. Not a single Maverick fouled out and only two got as many as four fouls.

Head coach Shirley Frazier calls this team outstanding, having lost two starters, Eddie Kincaid and Bill Hoffmann, and Lettermen David Cagle, Steve Wilson and George Simms.

Returning starters are Treadwell, Thomas and Craig Lund, rounded out by returning lettermen Phillip Smith and Danny Elrod.
