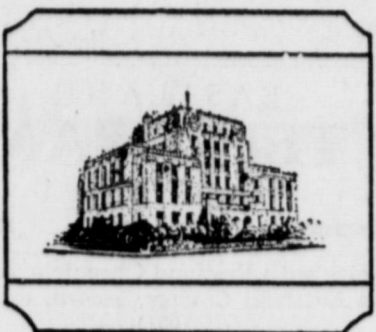

STOCK SHOW PARADE ROLLS FRIDAY AT 2 P.M.

The annual Eastland County Livestock Show parade will be held this year on Friday, March 15, in Eastland, beginning at 2 p. m.

All Eastland schools will be closed for this event. Invitations for participants in the parade have been sent to Eastland, Ranger, Cisco, Gorman and Rising Star High School bands and to the Cisco Junior College and Ranger Junior College bands.

Also receiving invitations have been riding clubs in Cisco, Ranger, Rising Star, Gorman, De Leon and Breckenridge. Trophies will be awarded to the first three place winners in the bands and riding clubs divisions. Judges will be representatives from each bank in the county and the judges stand will be in front of Jeannettes Fabric Shop.

The Sheriff's Posse, sponsors of the parade each year, will ride in their colorful attire. Also, they will provide a watchman at the show grounds both Thursday and Friday nights and will patrol the parked cars at the sales barn on Saturday night, it is reported.

March 18 Is Proclaimed As Medicare Day in Eastland

Tom B. Lovelace, local transfer and storage operator, found his Medicare coverage most helpful when he had a heart attack in March 1967. He states "Things have changed since I came to Eastland in 1922 and used horses and wagons in the transfer and storage business. Medicare is a change people 65 and over should inform themselves of." He gave consent to use of his story toward this end. Even though Mr. Lovelace may be unable to receive monthly benefits, he is still eligible for Medicare.

In order to help inform people 65 and over of their rights under Medicare, Mayor Frank Deaton proclaimed March 18 as "Medicare Day" in Eastland. A representative of the social security office will be in the Courthouse Lobby from 1 to 7 p. m. on March 18 to explain Medicare and to help individuals in enrolling, according to Mrs. Fay Grant, Field Representative of the Abilene Social Security office.

Mrs. Grant cautions that April 1 is the deadline for enrolling in the medical insurance for individuals over 65. She stated that group meetings will be held in the court house lobby at 2:45 p. m. and again at 5:45 p. m. on Medicare day to further explain this coverage. According to Mrs. Grant, persons age 65 before 1-1-68 do not need any social security coverage to enroll in both parts of Medicare (hospitalization and medical insurance). Individuals 65 in 1968 are eligible for the medical insurance without social security credits and need only three-fourths of a year of credit to qualify for the hospitalization. Persons reaching 65 in the future have a seven month period in which to enroll -- the three months preceding the 65th birthday, the month of the birthday, and three months thereafter; however, Mrs. Grant cautions that to get the protection the earliest, individuals should enroll during this period.

The annual Eastland County Livestock Show gets underway Thursday, March 14 at 350 animals are expected to the county show grounds in compete for premiums in the three day show. Only 4-H

Club and FFA members who attend public schools in Eastland County are eligible to exhibit in the junior show. The show is sponsored by the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association. Doug Fry of Cisco is president of the association. About \$1,500.00 will be given in premiums to the junior exhibitors according to Fry. Assistant DA Expected Here Monday, April 1

Recently - appointed Eastland County Assistant District Attorney Emory Walton of Abilene is expected to report for duty here on Monday, April 1, according to reports in Eastland Tuesday.

County Attorney Perry T. Brown has received a letter from Mr. Walton stating that he would be here April 1 to begin work. Certain legal work which he is directing for the City of Abilene at this time prevents him from coming sooner, the letter from Mr. Walton indicated.

Contacted at his office in Abilene Tuesday, Mr. Walton was reluctant to name a specific date, but stated that the matter of his coming to Eastland County "is still being discussed."

The County Commissioners Court hired Mr. Walton back in February after he was appointed by DA Brown, and set his salary at \$500 per month. There was some discussion among some county officials and others at that time regarding the salary, but apparently this has been resolved. A recent grand jury met with the commissioners court and recommended an assistant to help with the work load in the district attorney's office.

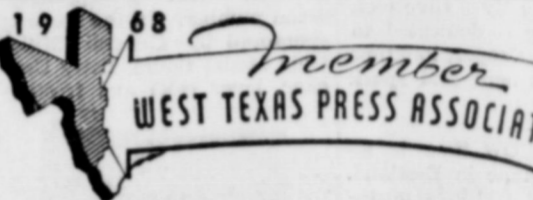

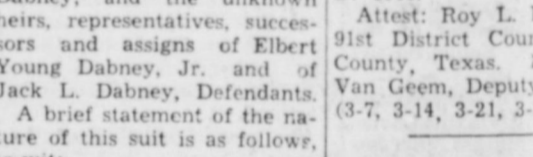

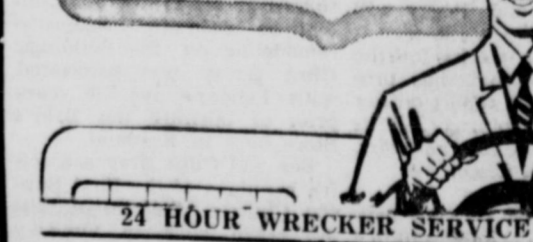

ORDER FOR CITY OFFICER'S ELECTION

I, W. F. Deaton, in my capacity as Mayor of the City of Eastland, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held in said City on the 2nd day of April, 1968, for the purpose of electing the following officials for said City:

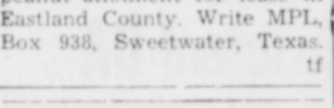

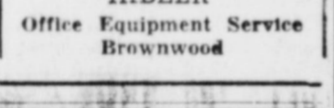

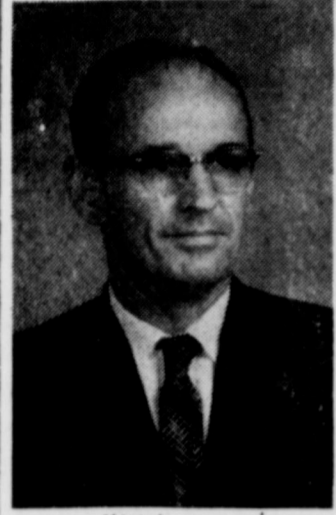

Warnings Given On Vandalism

Wanton vandalism appears to be on the increase in Eastland County and those persons responsible apparently aren't aware of the seriousness, local law enforcement authorities report.

There has been a great deal of vandalism, including the breakage of plate glass windows, slashing of automobile tires, breaking of auto antennas, house pilferages, and so forth, Highway Patrol Sgt. Roger Sosebee reports.

"What these people don't realize is that destruction of as much as \$50 worth of property constitutes a felony, punishable, upon conviction, of from two to 20 years in the state penitentiary," Sgt. Sosebee says.

This is serious, he says, adding that it doesn't take a very big broken window, or many hub caps to amount to \$50.

It doesn't matter, he said, whether the act is against an individual property owner or an institution, the law is the same, and the penalty is stiff.

Sgt. Sosebee also cautioned against the tampering with another person's automobile, stating that laws are particularly strong, even toward the opening of a door on someone else's auto.

Several youth have been apprehended recently in vandalism cases, he said.

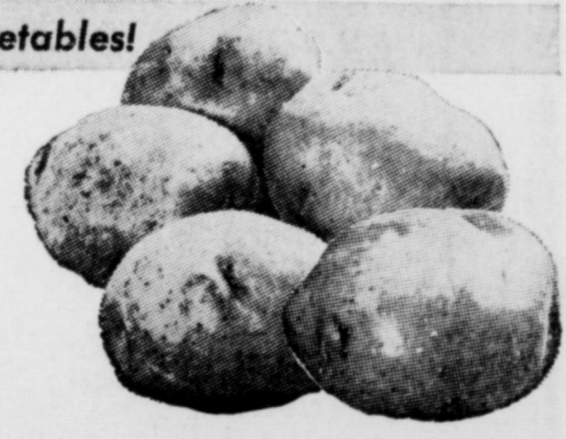
